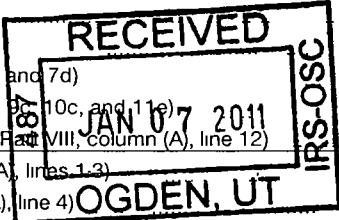

Experience Corps Baltimore City:

The Experience Corps program finished a highly successful year. The program continues to provide a triple win for Baltimore City - for our children, our older adults, and our schools. Experience Corps Baltimore City operated in 20 schools across the city. In each school, teams of 12-20 members worked under the direction of the classroom teacher in K-3 classrooms. Experience Corps members continue to help teachers focus students, reinforce instruction, practice skills with students, and motivate learning. A total of nearly 300 Experience Corps Baltimore City members were enrolled this year, and those members logged 144,115 hours of tutoring and mentoring services to some 7,000 students in 285 classrooms.

Adult Literacy and English for Speakers of Other Languages:

The Adult Literacy and English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) Program provides quality learner-centered instruction to promote literacy and help foreign-born residents improve English language skills. In FY2010, the Program enrolled 631 adult learners in classes and one-to-one tutoring. Seventy-five percent of learners post-testing increased their scores. Sixteen teachers worked with learners in the neighborhoods of Charles Village, Better Waverly, Govans, and Hampden. 26,586 hours were logged by learners in classes, and another 2,791 hours were offered by volunteers. One hundred twenty-eight learners were in tutoring and computer classes, and eighteen new tutors were trained during the year. Cost per learner was approximately \$769, with

Neighborhood Programs:

In Fiscal year 2010, Neighborhood Programs (NE) focused on increasing neighborhood quality and civic capacity. We provided technical assistance, education and leadership training to residents and school parents through community workshops and our annual Neighborhood Institute, a day-long training event that offered 16 workshops to 160 attendees. Workshops were aimed at giving residents tools to improve their neighborhood or school, including a block captain training, training on public safety, neighborhood greening and education advocacy. AmeriCorps*VISTA members also worked closely with neighborhood residents to assist them in neighborhood improvement projects, including grant seeking and block projects that focus on

The program receives approximately 25% of the program cost from the
schools served. Other funding comes from AmeriCorps, Baltimore City,
and many additional foundations.

Exciting results developed by our research partners at the Johns
Hopkins Center on Aging and Health through a National Institute of
Aging grant indicate Experience Corps has a pronounced effect on
learning. Students in Experience Corps schools showed greater gains in
reading and math performance on standardized achievement tests (the
Stanford 10 and the Maryland State Assessment (MSA) than students in
the comparison schools. Schools with Experience Corps also reported
significantly fewer (35-50%) office referrals for behavior issues and
fewer suspensions and expulsions. School climate was also perceived to
be more positive in Experience Corps schools, as reported by parents,
teachers and students in a school system survey. New research came out
during the year demonstrating in a pilot program that older adults in
the program receiving MRIs before and after involvement, clearly
demonstrate an increase in higher level brain functioning.

Although Experience Corps requires members to serve at least 15 hours
per week, members have averaged many additional hours each week for the
past three years. 97% of members indicated overall satisfaction with
their experience and 99.5% of principals expressed satisfaction with
the program.

VISTAs helped 13 blocks gain funding and organize resident volunteers

to carry out the improvements.

A critical part of neighborhood quality is the quality of its zoned public school. Neighborhood Programs served nearly 4200 students in eight partnership public schools: three elementary schools, four elementary/middle schools, and one high school. All of these schools serve a majority of low income students. Neighborhood Programs works closely with the principals to prioritize needs and link the schools with community resources to fill those gaps. Community School Directors served in 3 schools under NE guidance to expand wrap-around programming and services. 7 AmeriCorps*VISTA members served as Community Connections Coordinators, creating mutually supportive linkages between schools and their surrounding neighborhoods. VISTA members also built capacity and leadership in parent organizations and neighborhood associations, as well as ensured parent and community representation on School Family Councils. Partnerships with colleges, faith partners, and other nonprofit agencies continued to bring trained tutors and mentors into the schools to support in-school and after-school programs. Volunteers from local colleges, including Johns Hopkins University, Loyola College, Goucher College, and Towson University; local Lions Club members; and many other community members contributed significantly to the schools' volunteer base.

In addition, Neighborhood Programs partnered with two public schools in the Charles Village neighborhood to bring resources for teacher training and curriculum development that will result in a new, creative project-based curriculum for the schools as well as additional training on positive discipline in the schools. A school-community steering committee has formed to guide school improvements and communication with the community about school strengths and progress.

GHCC's Youth Program increases the accessibility and availability of positive activities for youth living in north central Baltimore City by building partnerships between schools, communities, and youth service providers to foster an integrated approach to meeting youth needs.

GHCC's established reputation as an intermediary enables our Youth Program to serve as a networking resource to promote common solutions and to diminish historic barriers to inter-agency cooperation. This past year, our Youth Program operated the following programs:

The College Opportunity and Career Help (COACH) Baltimore program matches high school students with year-long undergraduate mentors who meet with them weekly and help them apply to college and seek financial aid. Last year, GHCC provided mentors to more than 73 students at Mergenthaler Vocational Technical High School (Mervo). Students in the program had a 98% college acceptance rate.

loans approved to rehabilitate homes. \$2.4 million in investment through improvements were made to buildings targeted by our Strategic Code Enforcement program, in which we track derelict properties and encourages their owners to rehabilitate or sell. We successfully administered \$15,000 in neighborhood improvement projects, enabling neighborhoods to undertake recycling awareness programs, clean-ups, greening projects and plethora of beautification activities. Our public safety initiative served 160 parole and probation clients in Pen Lucy and Waverly, providing wrap-around services and assisting clients to reenter their community in a positive and productive manner.

We have successfully led a community planning process for proposed capital improvements along the Greenmount Avenue commercial corridor. After the announcement of the Anderson Automotive site redevelopment at 25th and Howard Street, we supported the impacted community organizations around the planning process and negotiations with the developer.
