USArtists International ("USAI") is committed to ensuring that the impressive range of expression and creativity of the performing arts in the United States is represented at international festivals abroad. The program also seeks to strengthen the creative and professional development of American artists by providing opportunities for cultural exchange and access to new audiences and the global marketplace.

USAI supports American dance, music, and theatre ensembles and solo artists invited to perform at international festivals anywhere in the world outside of the United States and its territories of American Samoa, Guam, Northern Mariana Islands, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. Under special circumstances, the program also provides funding for performance engagements abroad outside of a festival framework that provide artists with extraordinary career opportunities. Grant funds may support travel and per diem, international communications, shipping, and artists' and agents' fees related to participation in the proposed engagements.

The Foundation conducts three grant rounds per year for USAI in January, May, and September.

The program continues the important tradition in the United States of public and private sectors working collaboratively to support the arts USAI is a program of Mid Atlantic Arts Foundation in partnership with the National Endowment for the Arts and the Andrew W Mellon Foundation.

HOW MAAF SELECTS PANELISTS

Foundation staff conducts extensive research throughout the year to further develop the panelist data base. Panel members are chosen for their broad knowledge and expertise in the arts, and must have a thorough understanding of the artistic disciplines to be reviewed

Panelists are chosen to reflect the profile of the each respective applicant pool Panelists are selected from both within and outside of the mid-Atlantic region and composed to reflect the aesthetic, ethnic, gender and geographic diversity of the United States

Potential panelists are informed of the scope of their work including the amount of preparatory time that will be required in advance of the meeting. The potential panelists are asked to accept their appointment only if they can work within the philosophical and procedural guidelines of the program and can devote sufficient time to carrying out their duties.

PANELIST ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

Introduction

This guide is provided so that panelists gain a clear understanding of their role in the application review process and of the expectations of the Foundation. Each panelist must approach the review process with the same basic assumptions in order to ensure fairness to all applicants. It is important that panelists review this guide and the USArtists International guidelines prior to reviewing the applications and participating in the panel meeting.

Responsibilities

Panelists review applications based on specific program goals and evaluation criteria, and are expected to have a thorough familiarity with those materials before the meeting takes place. The following are sent to panelists prior to the application review meeting.

- copies of applications
- copies of work samples and festival brochures (for lead reader applications only)
- the program's guidelines
- panelist handbook with explanations of the review policies and procedures
- panelist scoring sheets

Panelists are instructed to contact Foundation staff if additional information is needed for a particular application.

Panelists are expected to make recommendations consistent with the program's goals and review criteria

All Foundation grant application review panels are advisory and make recommendations for funding to the Foundation's Board of Directors and/or contract Agency, which has final authority for grant awards. Panelists may also be asked for advice concerning policy issues including program development, guideline revision, program procedures, and application process.

Conflict of Interest

It is essential to the business of the Foundation that it maintains high standards of integrity and impartiality in its decision-making processes. Pursuant to this goal, enclosed in these materials is a copy of the Foundation's "Standards of Conduct and Conflict of Interest" policy. Panelists are required to review this policy and sign it prior to the commencement of the panel meeting, affirming their willingness to abide by the standards

Any relationship that prevents a panelist from evaluating an applicant objectively is considered a conflict of interest. Typically, this includes financial involvement with an applicant, a role in the work being evaluated or a familial relationship. Panelists should take into consideration how other applicants in the pool would perceive their voting on a person or organization that they know or are involved with.

At the beginning of each panel meeting, panelists are asked to discuss any potential conflicts of interest with applications under review. Panelists are also instructed to immediately make known any conflicts of interest that are discovered during the course of the meeting.

If a panelist believes that he or she has a conflict of interest with an applicant, the panelist is asked to abstain from discussing the applicant with fellow panelists, scoring the applicant and otherwise participating in the review process for that applicant. Should a panelist believe a conflict of interest exists with any of his or her assigned applications, the panelist should contact Foundation staff as soon as possible so lead reader responsibilities can be re-assigned prior to the panel meeting

THE REVIEW PROCESS

Criteria for Review

The role of the panel is to provide the Foundation with an expert evaluation of the applications by reviewing each application consistently and objectively against the program criteria. Panelists are urged to subordinate personal preferences for particular styles, formats, issues or subjects to an objective review of the work

The criteria for review for USArtists International applications shall serve as a sole basis for evaluating the applications. The criteria are as follows

ARTISTIC EXCELLENCE

- As demonstrated by the work samples submitted,
- The artists' record of professional activity, including awards, grants and other forms of special recognition provided in the written application materials, and your knowledge of the artists

ARTISTIC MERIT

- Significance of the applicant's presence at the festival as it relates to their professional development, ie:
 - Will this festival provide opportunities to develop new audiences and access markets through exposure to presenters, curators, artist managers/agents who may be attending the engagement, or through media coverage,
 - Will the engagement provide opportunities to exchange ideas and practice with other artists and individuals from other countries?
- Significance of the festival locally and internationally, ie
 - Does the festival attract artists of excellence and importance within their fields,
 - Are the festivals considered important platforms for the promotion of their art forms or areas of interest.
 - Do the engagements attract audiences and media attention within their locales, regions, and beyond?
- Quality of the proposed engagement including evidence of reasonable financial support from the festival given the context of the local economic situation

The following are not criteria and should not be taken into consideration:

- Activities in addition to the performances are not review criteria. Whether these activities, such as residencies, workshops, master classes, lecture demonstrations, etc. take place or not should not factor into your scoring.
- Need is not a criteria

Prior to the Meeting

Panelists receive copies of the applications prior to the panel meeting. Each panelist is expected to review and be familiar with all the applications. In addition, each panelist will be assigned as a "lead reader" for a number of applications. Lead readers receive work samples along with copies of festival brochures for their assigned applications to review before the meeting. Panelists are responsible for reviewing all the applications prior to the meeting and assigning scores to the "Artistic Merit" section of their score sheet. Lead readers may also assign scores to the "Artistic Excellence" section for their respective applications in advance.

The lead reader will be responsible for providing a brief analysis of their respective applications at the panel meeting, focusing on the strengths and weaknesses of the application as it directly relates to the review criteria

Panelists should review the list of applications against the copies of the applications in their panel book and their corresponding score sheets. If any materials are missing, panelists should contact Foundation staff immediately

Scoring

Scoring is on a 1-to-5 scale, with 1 being low and 5 being high. Panelists are asked to utilize this scale to its fullest extent, in order to achieve the greatest distinction between applicants. It is important to refrain from overly relying on the median rating of 3. Panelists should employ a consistent rationale for assigning scores.

The Meeting

After a brief welcome and introductions, Foundation staff will review the program guidelines and confirm the panelists' understanding of the process and their responsibilities. The majority of the meeting will entail review of work samples and applications. Panelists are expected to attend the entire meeting and to participate in all discussions and recommendations.

Application Review

Foundation staff will provide a brief overview of the application, and then present the artists' work samples

The lead reader will then present the merits of the application as it relates to the evaluation criteria. Lead readers should not provide a summary or description of the application, as each panelist will have already read the application. The discussion will then be opened up to all panelists to provide any other additional critique of the application. After discussion is concluded, panelists will be asked to assign scores to the applications. Panelists will be given the opportunity to adjust their final scores, if necessary, prior to making final recommendations, to determine if any are ranked too high or too low.

Once scoring for all applications has been completed, staff will collect and average the scores. The panel will be given the opportunity to review the applications in score order, from highest to lowest (applications with tie scores are presented in alphabetical order).

Panelists will be asked to determine a cut-off point in the scoring, above which applications would be eligible for funding, and below which applications would not be supported. The panel will then review the applications collectively to determine that there is consensus on the applications above and below this line.

The staff will use these recommendations to allocate the available funds. These recommendations will be forwarded to the Foundation's Board of Directors and the National Endowment for the Arts for approval.

Role of Staff/Observers

Foundation staff is responsible for promoting USArtists International and providing applicants with assistance. Once proposals are received, staff review them for eligibility and completeness, and prepare application materials for panel review. Foundation staff also handles all panel meeting logistics and work closely with panelists on travel and lodging arrangements.

Panel Facilitator

A Foundation staff member normally serves as facilitator of the grant review panels. The primary duty of the panel facilitator is to keep the discussion clearly focused on the evaluation criteria, and ensures that evaluation of all applicants is conducted in a fair and consistent manner.

Panel facilitators have a thorough knowledge of the applications being reviewed and are charged with addressing questions about the applications, the program, or the review process. Detailed notes on the discussion of each application are taken for the official record, and to share constructive comments with the applicants after the panel review. The meeting is also recorded in accordance with National Endowment for the Arts requirements.

Panel facilitators do not make recommendations to the panel, rank applications during the review process, or make comments on the quality of the applications. Their primary responsibility is to conduct the meeting, which includes:

- ensuring that the panel members understand, and follow the goals and objectives of the program,
- ensuring that the panel review policies, criteria and procedures are followed,
- explaining the funding policy for the program in question,
- ensuring that the conflict of interest policy is understood by panelists and followed,
- reviewing the applications in a timely manner,
- resolving any issues or disputes that arise during the review process

Once the panel meeting has been completed, staff is responsible for compiling the panel's recommendations for approval by the Foundation Board and the National Endowment for the Arts

The panel meeting is not open to the public, but from time to time, additional Foundation staff, Board members or funding partners' representatives may attend the meeting

Feedback

Staff provides feedback to applicants after awards have been made if requested Comments are not attributed to specific panelists

ADDITIONAL PROCEDURES

Policy Recommendations

After discussion and deliberation of the applicants has come to a close, panelists will be asked to provide feedback regarding the process, the program and on general policy issues. The feedback of the panel is highly valued and each year shapes the future direction of the program, including needs of the field, discipline/field issues, development and revision of guidelines and the development of new directions and initiatives

Confidentiality

Panel meetings for most programs are not open to the public Panelists remain anonymous until grant award decisions are made and announced. At that time, the panelists' names and credentials are made public. It is essential that panelists observe confidentiality and not discuss the panel proceedings with anyone, even after funding is announced. Please refer all inquiries to Foundation staff.

Panelists are requested to refrain from identifying themselves as panelists until the time of Foundation action.

Referrals

If panelists have recommendations of fellow artists or professional colleagues they feel would be appropriate and qualified future panelists, they are encouraged to provide their names and contact information to Foundation staff

MEETING LOGISTICS

MAKING YOUR TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS

General

All travel arrangements must be made with the Foundation's travel agency Panelists should contact Inglewood Travel, at 1-800-873-6446, to arrange for travel Any of their representatives are prepared to assist you, and know to directly bill the Foundation for your travel

Recognizing that the Foundation is a nonprofit agency, you are requested to travel under the most cost-effective means, and to reserve your travel as soon as possible to take advantage of the best rates. Reservations must be made by the date indicated on the panelist confirmation letter. Any additional charges as a result of arrangements made after this date will be the responsibility of the panelist. The Foundation will not authorize first class, business class, Metroliner or Acela Express travel.

The panel meeting will be held on the following days

Thursday February 18, 2010 1 00 p m to 5 00 p.m.

Friday February 19, 2010 9 00 a m to 5 00 p m (breakfast and lunch provided)

Please keep in mind the intended adjournment time of the meeting in scheduling your return travel and allow adequate time to travel to the airport or train station, check in and complete any enhanced security requirements. Please be ready to start promptly.

Additional Travel Expenses

The Foundation will reimburse panelists for any additional travel expenses (i.e. parking, taxis, tolls, mileage, etc.) In order to receive reimbursement for additional travel expenses, panelists must complete a reimbursement request form and submit it within five days of the panel meeting Please retain and attach all original receipts itemized on the form. Payment should be made within 30 days of submitting the reimbursement request.

Travel by Plane

For panelists arriving by plane, the most convenient airport is Baltimore-Washington International Airport ("BWI") BWI is approximately 20-35 minutes away by taxi, and the cost of a taxi is approximately \$30 each way Inglewood Travel will issue an electronic ticket for air travel, and will send a copy of the flight itinerary Please be advised of increased security regulations and recommended arrival times for check-in.

Travel by Train

Panelists traveling from the mid-Atlantic states are expected to utilize train service. The most convenient point of arrival is Baltimore-Penn Station. The Foundation's offices and the hotel are about a five-minute cab ride from this station. Inglewood Travel will mail the train ticket through U.S. mail. Any costs associated with overnight and express mail, due to a late reservation, will be the responsibility of the panelist. Please note Amtrak's new security regulations regarding provision of identification with ticket and carry-on baggage limitations.

Travel by Car

If you instead choose to drive, you will be reimbursed by the Foundation at a rate of \$0.55 per mile. Hotel parking can be added to your room bill and charged directly to the Foundation. Alternatively, there is a parking garage across Charles Street from the Foundation, the rate is approximately \$12 for a day. Please consult the driving directions provided in Appendix I

Personal Travel

If personal travel is combined with official travel to/from the meeting, the panelist is responsible for paying the difference between the official and personal travel costs. It is highly recommended that such travel be planned in conjunction with the booking of the official ticket, because any change fees (typically \$100 and up) associated with the addition of personal travel shall also be the responsibility of the panelist. In addition, the panelist may be required to reimburse the Foundation for any costs, such as transaction fees, that are charged. If the total ticket price for combined official and personal travel is for any reason less than the official travel ticket, the panelist is not entitled to the difference

HOTEL ACCOMODATIONS

Rooms are reserved by the Foundation staff, and are billed directly to the Foundation Panelists are responsible for any additional charges made to the basic room rate, such as telephone calls, room service, etc

Check out is on the morning of your departure day Panelists are asked to complete check out procedures before arriving at the office for the panel meeting Panelists may choose to check their bags with the hotel reservation desk for the remainder of the day, or to bring them to the meeting If a panelist has a tight travel schedule, it is recommended that they choose the latter option

DIETARY RESTRICTIONS

A continental breakfast and catered lunch will be provided on the full day of the panel meeting. If you have any dietary restrictions, please contact Nicole Russ at 410-539-6656 x120 as soon as possible to arrange alternatives. Please be aware that accommodations may not be possible if not notified in advance, so be sure to contact Nicole Russ if you have any questions.

PANELISTS WITH DISABILITIES

If you are in need of any special accommodations, please contact Nicole Russ at 410-539-6656 x120 as soon as possible so that arrangements can be made

PAYMENTS

Panelists receive an honorarium for their service. The honorarium is expected to cover any incidentals and meals outside of the panel meeting. Should any room service or other additional hotel charges (excluding parking fees) be billed to the Foundation, it will be deducted from the panelist's honorarium. Reimbursement requests will be honored for travel costs only.

The cost of lodging and train and air tickets will be billed directly to the Foundation. Any other travel costs are paid on a reimbursement basis. Panelists should submit the travel reimbursement form within five days of the meeting, with appropriate receipts attached. Payment of the honorarium as well as reimbursement of any additional travel costs will be made within 30 days of the Foundation's receipt of the travel reimbursement request.

The Foundation contracts with individuals for service on its panels. Therefore, payments will be issued in the individual panelists' names only, not to organizations, trust accounts, investment accounts, etc.
