MedStar Health and its affiliated organizations report Bad Debt Expense in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) and HFMA 15 Amounts that are not expected to be collected, for patients qualifying under MedStar Health's financial assistance policy, are written off to Charity Care and reported as a reduction to revenue Bad Debt Expense results from management's inability to collect revenues that meet the GAAP criteria for revenue recognition. Bad Debt represents an operating expense and is reflected as a separate line item on the organization's Statement of Operations. However, MedStar and its affiliated entities do not make a determination as to whether self pay amounts are collectible in determining revenue recognition. Reserve models, which have been developed based on historical collection results and which are adjusted periodically based on actual collections experience, are used to estimate uncollectible amounts across all payors including self pay. Bad debt determinations are made only after sufficient evidence is obtained to support that an amount is not collectible.

The amount reported on Part III, Line 6 was determined using the cost data from the FY 2009 Medicare Cost Report

If it is determined that a patient may potentially qualify for a charitable/financial program, a hold is placed on the account to prevent it from being reported as bad debt until program approvals have been obtained. If it is approved, the account is documented and the necessary adjustments are made to close the account.

Washington Hospital Center, a 926-bed acute care teaching and research hospital based in Northwest Washington, D C is one of the largest and most experienced hospitals in the mid-Atlantic region. No other medical facility can match the comprehensive medical care that Washington Hospital Center provides to thousands of patients each day. Its legacy as an innovative teaching and acute care medical institution ensures patients have access to the latest imaging and minimally invasive technologies, and to clinical research trials well before other facilities in the region. In addition, the Hospital Center operates one of the busiest cardiac catheterication and electrophysiology programs in the country. As one of the largest kidney transplant programs on the East Coast, patient outcomes consistently exceed the national average. Washington Hospital Center is also home to MedSTAR Trauma Center and Transport Services and is the region's only adult burn facility. The hospital is renowned for handling the region's toughest medical cases and has earned a reputation as the medical center other hospitals send their most complex cases. The needs of the community are assessed through periodic updates of the Hospital's strategic plan that focuses on program and service needs of the community, a community needs assessment conducted by the CO mmunity Relations department that focuses on the health, social and economic needs of the hospital's core service area that consist of the zip code areas immediately adjacent to the Hospital, through our Community HealthLinks Newsletter Reader Survey and by working closely with community partners, Advisory Neighborhood Commissioners, local D.C. Public schools and community residents. Based on the results of these evaluations, we have developed community programs to strengthen the connections within our community by providing relevant information about important health issues and hospital programs/services.

Whenever possible, Washington Hospital Center's Financial CO unselors work with uninsured patients to determine eligibility for financial assistance. This service includes assessment of eligibility for state or federal assistance programs, hospital assistance programs and payment arrangements. Financial assistance is provided to patients based on income, family size, and assets. Our policy and financial assistance contact information is posted in the admissions areas, emergency department, outpatient registration, clinic areas and on our website. The brochure (Your Hospital Bill- Important Information from Patient Financial Clearance) is made available in registration and waiting areas in English and Spanish.

Washington Hospital Center's Core Service area for community relations activities includes zip codes 20001, 20002, 20009, 20010, 20011 and extending throughout the Metropolitan area. This service area is described as an Intercity Urban Environment with a diverse population consisting of African Americans (53.9%), Caucasians (22.8%), Hispanics (16.6%), Asians (3.6%), and Other (3%). Statistics shows that the median household incomes in these service areas are \$59,373 for 2001, \$52,880 for 2002, \$47,584 for 2009, \$44,681 for 2010 and \$39,172 for 2011. The number of individuals who are uninsured or underinsured in the hospital's core service area is estimated to be 17.9% and growing.

As a proud member of MedStar Health, Washington Hospital Center is able to expand its capacity to meet the needs of the community by partnering with other MedStar Hospitals and associated entities. For example, MedStar Health resources assist the hospital in strategic planning to meet the needs of the under/uninsured. Through its community health function, MedStar Health provides the hospital with technical support to enhance community health programming.
