BY-LAWS OF

THE GREATER WASHINGTON FOUNDATION OF INSURANCE AND FINANCIAL ADVISORS

Article I. PURPOSE

The name of the organization shall be the Greater Washington Foundation of Insurance and Financial Advisors. The purpose for which the corporation is organized is to foster and maintain high standards of performance and conduct among members of the Insurance and Financial Advisors profession and to promote understanding of the business of life insurance and financial services and applied products through education, research and dissemination of information directly, and through media or otherwise. GWFIFA will maintain its 501 (C) (3) status with the tax number 52-1935068.

Article II. MEMBERS

Members shall be those individuals and business entities who shall have contributed a minimum amount as set by resolution of the Board of Directors and shall have such other rights and privileges as shall be further provided by the Board of Directors, except that no member shall be entitled to vote.

Article III. OFFICES

The principal office of the corporation shall be located in the District of Columbia. The Corporation may have such other offices, either within or without the District of Columbia, as the Board of Directors may determine or as the affairs of the corporation may require from time to time.

The Corporation shall have and continuously maintain in the District of Columbia a registered office, and a registered agent who office is identical to such registered office, as is required by the District of Columbia Non-Profit Corporation Act. The registered office may be but need not be, identical with the principal office in the District of Columbia, and the address of the registered agent may be changed from time to time by the Board of Directors.

Article IV. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. General Powers. The affairs of the corporation shall be managed by its Board of Directors Directors need not be resident of the District of Columbia.

Section 2. Number and Tenure. The number of Directors shall be 15 and elected to serve a term co-equal with the President and in addition the President may appoint up to 3 directors whose terms shall be co-equal with the term of the office of President.

Section 3. Regular meetings. A regular annual meeting shall be held at the principal office of the Corporation at such a time and location as the Board of Directors shall decide, with notice to the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors may decide by resolution the time and place, either within or without the District of Columbia, for the holding of additional regular meetings of the Board without other notice than such resolution.

Section 4. Special meetings. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by or at the request of the President, or any three Directors. The person or persons authorized to call special meetings of the Board may fix any place, either within or without the District of Columbia, as the place for holding any special meeting of the Board called by them.

Section 5. Notice. Notice of any special meeting of the Board shall be given at least five days previously thereto by written notice delivered personally or sent by mail or email to each Director at the address shown on the records of the corporation If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the Unites States mail in a sealed envelope so addressed, with postage prepaid. If notice is sent by facsimile machine, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when it has been transmitted to the facsimile telephone number supplied by the Board member. If notice is given by email such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when the email is sent and not returned by email postmaster as failed delivery. Any Director may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a Director at any meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a Director attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. Neither the business to be transacted at, nor the purpose of, any regular or special meeting of the Board need be specified in the notice or waiver of notice of such meeting unless specifically required by law or these by-laws. Any member of the Board of Directors missing three consecutive meetings will be contacted by the President to determine if that Board member is able to continue serving on the Board.

Section 6. Quorum. Seven members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board; (delete but if less than a majority of Directors are present at said meeting, a majority of the Directors present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice). Directors may participate in a meeting of the Board of Directors or a committee of the Board by means of conference telephone or by any means of communication by which all persons participating in the meeting are able to hear one another, and such participation shall constitute presence in person at the meeting.

Section 7. Manner of Acting. The act of a majority of the Directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors, unless the act of a greater number is required by law or by these by-laws.

Section 8. Vacancies. Any vacancy occurring in the Board of Directors or any directorship to be filled by reason of an increase in the number of directors may be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the remaining directors, though less than a quorum of the Board of Directors. A Director elected to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of the predecessor in office.

Section 9. Compensation. Directors as such shall not receive any stated salaries for their services, but by resolution of the Board of Directors a fixed sum and expense of attendance if any, may be allowed for attendance at each regular or special meeting of the Board, but nothing herein contained shall be construed to preclude any Director from serving the corporation in any other capacity and receiving compensation therefore. Directors may be reimbursed for actual and reasonable expenses incurred by the Director on behalf of the Corporation.

Section 10. Informal Action by Directors. Any action required by law to be taken at a meeting of the directors, or any action which may be taken at a meeting of directors, may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting for the action so taken, shall be signed by all of the Directors.

Article V. OFFICERS

Section 1. Officers. The officers of the corporation shall be a President, one or more Vice Presidents (the number thereof to be determined by the Board of Directors), a Secretary, a Treasurer and such other officers as may be elected in accordance with the provisions of this Article. The Board of Directors may elect or appoint such other officers as may be elected in accordance with the provisions of this Article. The Board of Directors may elect or appoint such other officers, including one or more Assistant Secretaries and one or more Assistant Treasurers, as it shall deem desirable, such officers to have the authority and perform the duties prescribed, from time to time, by the Board of Directors. Any two or more offices may be held by the same person, except the offices of President and Secretary.

Section 2. Election and Term of Office. The officers of the corporation shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors at the regular annual meeting of the Board of Directors, except for the office of President which is a three year term. If the election of officers shall not be held at such meeting, such election shall be held as soon thereafter as conveniently may be. New offices may be created and filled at any meeting of the Board of Directors. Each officer shall hold office until a successor shall have been duly elected and shall have qualified.

Section 3. Removal. Any officer elected or appointed by the Board of Directors may be removed with or without cause by the Board of Directors whenever in its judgment the best interests of the corporation would be served thereby, but such removal shall be without prejudice to the contract rights, if any, of the officer so removed.

Section 4. Vacancies. A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification or otherwise, may be filled by the Board of Directors for the unexpired portion of the term.

Section 5. President. The President shall be the principal executive officer of the corporation and shall in general supervise and control all of the business and affairs of the corporation for the three year term of office. The President shall preside at all meetings of the members of the Board of Directors. The President may sign, with the Secretary or any other proper officer of the corporation authorized by the Board of Directors, any deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts and other instruments which the Board of Directors has authorized to be executed, except in cases where the signing and execution thereof shall be expressly delegated by the Board of Directors or by these by-laws or by statute to some other office or agent of the corporation; and in general, the President shall perform all duties incident to the office of President and such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors from time to time.

Section 6. Vice President. In the absence of the President or in the event of the President's inability or refusal to act, the Vice President (or in the event there be more than one Vice President, the Vice Presidents in order of their election) shall perform the duties of the President, and when so active shall have all the powers and be subject to all of the restrictions upon the President. Any Vice President shall perform such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to the Vice President by the President or the Board of Directors.

Section 7. Treasurer. If required by the Board of Directors, the Treasurer shall give a bond for the faithful discharge of the Treasurer's duties in such sum and with such surety or sureties as the Board of Directors shall determine. The Treasurer shall have charge and custody of and be responsible for all funds and securities of the corporation; receive and give receipts for moneys due and payable to the corporation from any source whatsoever, and deposit such moneys in the name of the corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as shall be selected in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws and in general perform all the duties incident to the office of Treasurer such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to the Treasurer by the President of the Board of Directors.

Section 8. Secretary. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Board of Directors in one or more books provided for that purpose; see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws or as required by law; be custodian of the corporate records and of the seal of the corporation and see that the seal of the corporation is affixed to all documents, the execution of which on behalf of the corporation under the seal is duly authorized in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws and in general perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary and such other duties as may from time to time be assigned to the Secretary by the President or by the Board of Directors.

Section 9. Assistant Treasurers and Assistant Secretaries. If required by the Board of Directors, the Assistant Treasurers shall give a bond for the faithful discharge of the Treasurer's duties in such sum and with such surety or sureties as the Board of Directors shall determine. The Assistant Treasurers and Assistant Secretaries, in general, shall perform such duties as shall be assigned to them by the Treasurer or the Secretary or by the President or the Board of Directors.

Article VI. COMMITTEES

Section 1. Committees of Directors. The Board of Directors, by resolution adopted by a majority of the Directors in office, may designate and appoint one or more committees, each of which shall consist of one or more Directors, which committees, to the extent provided in such resolution, shall have and exercise the authority of the Board of Directors in the management of the corporation, except that no such committee shall have the authority of the Board of Directors in reference to amending, altering or repealing the by-laws; electing, appointing or removing any member of any such committee or any Director or officer of the corporation; amending the articles of incorporation; restating articles of incorporation; adopting a play of merger or adopting a plan of consolidation with another corporation; authorizing the sale, lease, exchange or mortgage of all or substantially all of the property and assets of the corporation; authorizing the voluntary dissolution of the corporation or revoking proceedings therefore; adopting a plan for distribution of the assets of the corporation; or amending, altering or repealing any resolution of the Board of Directors which by its terms provides that it shall not be amended, altered or repealed by such committee. The designation and appointment of any such committee and the delegation thereto of authority shall not operate to relieve the Board of Directors, or any individual Director, of any responsibility imposed upon the Board or the individual director by law.

Section 2. Other Committees. Other committees not having and exercising the authority of the Board of Directors in the management of the corporation may be appointed in such manner as may be designated by resolution adopted by a majority of the Directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present. Except, as otherwise provided in the resolution, the President shall appoint the members of such committees. Any member of such committees may be removed with or without cause by the person or persons authorized to appoint such member whenever in their judgment the best interest of the corporation shall be serve by such removal.

Section 3. Term of Office. Each member of a committee shall continue as such until the next annual meeting of the Board of Directors and until a successor is appointed, unless the committee is sooner terminated, or unless such member be removed from such committee, or unless such member ceases to qualify as a member thereof.

Section 4. Committee Chair. One member of each committee shall be appointed Chair by the Board of Directors.

Section 5. Vacancies. Vacancies in membership of any committee may be filled by appointments made in the same manner as provided in the case of original appointments.

Section 6. Quorum. Unless otherwise provided in the resolution of the Board of Directors designating a committee, a majority of the whole committee shall constitute a quorum and the act of a majority of the members present at a meeting at which quorum is present shall be the act of the committee.

Section 7. Rules. Each committee may adopt rules for its own governance not inconsistent with these by-laws or with rules adopted by the Board of Directors.

Article VII. CONTRACTS, CHECKS DEPOSITS AND FUNDS.

Section 1. Contracts. The Board of Directors may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents of the corporation, in addition to the officers so authorized by these by-laws, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the corporation, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

Section 2. Checks, Drafts, etc. All checks, drafts or orders for the payment of money, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the corporation, shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents of the corporation and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution with the Board of Directors. In the absence of such determination by the Board of Directors, such instruments shall be signed by the Treasurer or an Assistant Treasurer and countersigned by the President or a Vice President of the corporation.

Section 3. Deposits. All funds of the corporation shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as the Board of Directors may select.

Section 4. Gifts. The Board of Directors may accept on behalf of the corporation any contribution, gift, bequest or devise for the general purposes or for the special purpose of the corporation.

Article VIII. BOOKS AND RECORDS

The corporation shall keep correct and complete books and records of account and shall also keep minutes of the proceedings of its members, Board of Directors and committees having any of the authority of the Board of Directors.

Article IX. FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the corporation shall begin on the first day of July and end on the last day of June in each year.

Article X. SEAL

The Board of Directors shall provide a corporate seal, which shall be in the form of a circle and shall have inscribed thereon the name of the corporation and the words "Corporate Seal, District of Columbia".

Article XI. WAIVER OF NOTICE

Whenever any notice is required to be given under the District of Columbia Non-Profit Corporation Act, the articles of incorporation or these by- laws, a waiver of notice in writing signed by the person or person entitled to such notice, whether before or after such time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

Article XII. AMENDMENTS TO THE BYLAWS

These by-laws may be altered, amended or repealed and new by-laws may be adopted by a majority of the Directors present at any regular meeting or at any special meeting, if at least five days' written notice is given of intention to alter, amend or repeal or to adopt new by-laws at such meeting.

Article XIII. DISSOLUTION

Upon dissolution and final liquidation of the corporation, its assets shall be distributed only to such organization(s) designated by the Board of Directors which are determined by it to be organized and operated exclusively for exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (C) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, revised or replaced.

Article XIV.

The Corporation shall not carry on any activities nor exercise any powers not permitted by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501 (C)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, revised or replaced.
