Nearly one million citizens received election information through VOTE411.org, the League of Women Voters Education Fund's one-stop election website, during 2009. The LWVEF is making improvements to the website for election 2010.

In 2010, the League launched its High School Voter Registration Project, a groundbreaking initiative to bring more young people – especially young minorities – into the democratic process. Local Leagues in targeted communities have received funding to encourage voter registration in 100 high schools with a high-percentage of minority students. In partnership with Project Vote, the League is building upon research collected during the project to determine the strategies that are most effective to help inform an upcoming manual for use by Leagues and other organizations interested in registering high school students.

The LWVEF assists state and local Leagues with numerous inquiries, including questions on the topics of debates and Voters' Guides. The LWVEF has undertaken numerous efforts to provide informational materials to state and local Leagues, elections officials, other activists, voters and the media.

LWVEF provides dedicated assistance to help Leagues strengthen their advocacy capacity at the state level. Begun in 2006 with six state Leagues, the Public Advocacy for Voter Protection Project now provides dedicated staff support and/or pass-through grants support to 16 state Leagues to focus on five specific areas: (1) requirements for ID and documentary proof of citizenship in order to vote; (2) improvements to administration of statewide voter database systems; (3) undue restrictions on voter registration; (4) improvements to polling place management; and (5) improving poll worker training.

In 2009, the LWVEF became an official partner of the U.S. Census, with the goal of getting everyone counted. LWVEF staff has worked closely with national partners (such as civil rights and Latino groups), and provided information and support to state and local Leagues in their efforts to minimize an undercount. Approximately 300 Leagues engaged in Census activity.

The LWVEF obtained funding to host a unique redistricting conference that brought together experts and stakeholders from across the nation. The focus was on how to work together to influence the results of the state redistricting processes that will follow the 2010 Census. The participants agreed upon several core principles and produced a report that emphasized the importance of transparency in the redistricting process.

The LWVEF engaged in a number of efforts to assist Leagues in promoting government transparency and public participation and became more visible in federal transparency initiatives. In early 2010, the LWVEF began a project to provide an online resource, "Sunshine 2.0" which will provide criteria for assessing the transparency of local government websites and other online technologies.

At the federal level, the League has been active in providing advice to the Obama Administration as it proceeds to implement its Openness in Government Directive. In so doing, we have also helped a number of good government groups work together. The LWVEF was also a co-sponsor of Sunshine Week in 2009 and 2010. In each case, an expert forum was webcast live from Washington, DC, and a number of local Leagues hosted their own "viewing" parties to engage their communities on these issues.

Just over 300 state and local Leagues of Women Voters in 46 states participate in the LWVEF's grant program, which provides funds for civic education activities. This service allows state and local Leagues to raise tax-deductible contributions for charitable activities in their local communities.

During 2009-2010, the Global Democracy program spread to more countries, while still focusing on core competencies of elections, transparency, women leaders and grassroots activism. The LWVEF expanded its Civic Hosting Programs for Russians and Ukrainians to include visitors from Azerbaijan, Tajikistan, Kyrgyzstan and Kazakhstan. To date, 18 local Leagues of Women Voters in 14 states have hosted 100 leaders.

We have begun a two-year program, funded by the U.S. State Department, "Connecting Civil Society and Future Legislators from Colombia and Brazil." This will be an exchange program, with 24 women coming to six Leagues, and 12 League members travelling to those countries.

The LWVEF partnered with Oxfam America on educational programs related to global climate change.

Part III, line 4 d, Other Program Services:

The "Safeguarding U.S. Democracy: Promoting an Independent Judiciary by Defending the U.S. Constitution" project continues a seven-year effort to educate the public about the importance of fair and impartial courts. The LWVEF manages a complicated network of over 275 Leagues and 125 partners to educate the public on this subject. In 2009 and 2010, the project has taken a new approach – focusing on promoting diversity at all levels of the state judiciary.
