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Transitional HousingTransitional housing is offered up to 24 months for qualified victims of domestic violence. The program has twelve apartments and three houses. The focus is on economic empowerment to move clients, whether with children or without, toward sustainability for living independently in permanent housing free of violence. In July 2009 the program expanded its program capacity to include six additional apartments, doubling the capacity from 24 beds to 48 beds. The program serves women and children fleeing a domestic violence situation. They can self refer or be referred by a YWCA case manager or an outside agency. Eligibility for admittance into the transitional housing program is a specific criterion that identifies them as a victim of domestic violence who does not want to return to an abusive relationship and is making steps to become self-sufficient. Through an extensive network of service providers and community partners and volunteers, we help women, children and families reclaim their lives. In FY09-10, we provided housing to 13 women and 22 children. Of those served, 74% were African American, 9% Caucasian, 14% Hispanic, and 3% Other in ages from newborn to 50 plus. 4c. Sexual Assault Program24/ hours a day, 7 days a week, Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners (SANE) provide forensic medical examinations and Hospital Advocates provide crisis intervention for victims of sexual assault in three Cobb Country hospitals. Law enforcement officers from Cherokee, Cobb and Paulding counties contact the YWCA Crisis Line to deploy a Sexual Assault Response Team (SART). Collectively, this team provides immediate care inclusive of transportation to a secure facility for a forensic medical examination, crisis counseling, clothing, tolletnes, medications and other services at no cost to the victim In FY09-10, 88 victims of sexual assault were served from three counties, Cobb, Cherokee and Paulding.
