As discussed herein, Cobb Hospital, Inc (an affiliate of Wellstar Health System, Inc) operates as a charitable organization consistent with the requirements of Internal Revenue Code Section 501 (c) (3) and the "community benefit standard" of IRS Revenue Ruling 69-545 In this regard, the governing body of the organization and/or its parent is composed of prominent citizens in the community, medical staff privileges in the hospital are available to all qualified physicians in the area consistent with the size and nature of the facility, the hospital operates a full-time emergency room open to all regardless of ability to pay, the hospital provides care to the needy members of the community consistent with its charity care policy regardless of their ability to pay for these services The hospital's excess funds are generally applied to expansion and replacement of existing facilities and equipment, amortization of indebtedness, improvement of patient care, community benefits activity, and charity care Cobb Hospital reinvested a total of approximately \$7 0 million in capital expenditures for equipment upgrades and other capital improvements to better serve the community Cobb Hospital was organized in 1984 The hospital affiliated with the Northwest Georgia Health System in 1993 In 1994, Northwest Georgia Health System helped form the PROMINA Health System and changed its name to Promina Northwest Health System In 1998 Promina Northwest changed its name to Wellstar Health System and is now totally independent of Promina Cobb Hospital is subordinate to, and subject to the authority of Wellstar Health System and its governing boards including the Hospital Authority of Cobb County Cobb Hospital provides a full range of inpatient and outpatient services characteristic of a community hospital The hospital is licensed to operate 382 beds and is presently staffed to operate 366 beds The original hospital was constructed in 1968 and several major structural additions have happened since that time The following stats constitute the overall program services provided during the reporting period ended June 30, 2010 Adult Discharges 22,328 Med/Surg Short Stay Days 4,293 Emergency Room Visits (incl pediatric ER) 92,353 Outpatient Surgical Cases 7,774 Inpatient Surgical Cases 4,047 Outpatient Procedures Non-ED OP Radiology 72,943 GI Laboratory 1,522 Total FTEs (paid) 1,903 Community Benefit Reporting Community Outreach (incl system-wide alloc) \$1,350,341 Unreimbursed Charity Care (at cost) \$14,600,927 Medicaid Shortfalls (at cost) \$10,884,335 Total \$26,835,603 The Georgia Hospital Association has estimated that Cobb Hospital has had an economic impact of approximately \$743 million and is responsible for creating over 4,500 jobs for the local and state economy As an affiliate of Wellstar Health System, Cobb Hospital participates in many community and educational programs for the overall health and benefit of the area that they serve Some examples of those programs are Community Health/Education--screenings and educational opportunities such as defensive driving for teens (offered at a minimal cost or at no cost), smoking cessation, heart smart school, CPR and others System-wide over 200,000 residents from the community participated in these various screenings The Public Relations department notifies the public of these offerings by publishing a quarterly mailer to community residents which costs the system over \$100,000 Community Activities--sponsors blood drives, provides funding to school health programs for medical and dental preventive care Community Events--Wellstar has an annual day for the Latino community geared at screenings and educational activities on a variety of health issues specifically for the Hispanic community Wellstar Cobb Hospital had the most blood donors in a year for a hospital its size (over 1000+ employees) as recognized by the American Red Cross These blood drives help not only patients but provide the system with significant cost savings in blood supplies On an more international scale Wellstar Cobb, Kennestone, and Windy Hill Hospitals played a supportive role in the disaster relief related to the January 2010 earthquake in Haiti Food, water, shelter and medical assistance were needs that Wellstar helped provide to the residents of Haiti Several Wellstar physicians went directly to the devastated area to provide onsite medical assistance Additionally several Haitian victims were airlifted and received medical help at Wellstar Cobb, Kennestone and Windy Hill Hospitals for more critical injuries sustained in the earthquake These efforts were part of the National Disaster Management Service (NDMS) Wellstar supported its own Haitian team members/employees with resources and counseling Sponsorships--Employees of Cobb Hospital participated in "Go Red for Women Day" program designed to raise awareness of heart disease in women (in conjunction with the American Heart Association) A group of employees also participated in the annual "Relay for Life" an event to raise funds and awareness for cancer research and prevention (held in conjunction with the American Cancer Society) Recognition and Accomplishments Cobb Hospital and Kennestone Hospital operate full-service clinics on the respective campuses to provide health related services to uninsured and underinsured who might not otherwise receive care In FY2010 the clinics served a combined 8,000 patient visitors at a cost of almost \$3 1 million The system partnered with the local school systems to provide free health and safety education to nearly 50,000 area elementary students and approximately 8,000 adolescent students In partnership with Cobb County law enforcement and YWCA, Wellstar started a program called Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) for confidential and secure treatment of sexual assault victims Approximately 100 patients were treated in the program Cobb Hospital continued to serve as a Partner in Education site for mentoring South Cobb High School students with interest in pursuing healthcare professions Thirty students participate in the program each year Wellstar and Cobb Hospital received the designation as a "Company that Cares" for its caring about patients, communities and team members It is one of only seven health care systems and the only local system to achieve that distinction Wellstar Health System and affiliates remained strong financially with a 5 9% operating margin The system also initiated an internal program to identify costs savings and revenue enhancements which produced an additional \$75 million in company-wide savings and efficiencies These initiatives made it possible to continue to reinvest funds into improvement and purchase of state of the art facilities and equipment (\$81 million was spent in FY10 for total system-wide capital expenditures) Wellstar made an important investment in the area of clinical excellence by adding the Cardiovascular Medicine physician practice to the system The physician practice is recognized by the Medical Group Management Associates as one of the top performers in the country The result is the Wellstar Cardiac Network which makes Wellstar one of the leading cardiac health systems in Georgia Cobb Hospital and other Wellstar facilities continued to invest in state of the art cancer treatment with its Wellstar Cancer Program More than 3,000 patients were treated in the system representing approximately 8 4% of cancer cases in Georgia Awards American College of Radiology-recognized for the Ultrasound and Nuclear Medicine product lines Quality Respiratory Care by the American Association of Respiratory Care Accredited Chest Pain Clinics at all hospitals by the Society of Chest Pain Centers Accredited Breast Health Center by the National Accreditation Program for Breast Centers JCAHO-Disease Specific Certification and Certified Primary Stroke Center American Diabetes Association recognized Wellstar for meeting national standards for diabetes self-management Wellstar Cobb and Douglas Hospitals received a Partnership for Health Accountability Quality and Patient Safety Awards from Georgia Hospital Association for 2009 Wellstar's Cobb Hospital's NICU received the Georgia VHA Leadership Award for Clinical Excellence Wellstar Cobb, Douglas and Kennestone Hospitals each received the American College of Cardiology Foundation Action Registry Gold Performance Achievement Award for 2009 The hospitals were three of only 121 hospitals nationwide to do so The award recognizes Wellstar's commitment and success in implementing a higher standard of care for heart attack patients

Cobb Hospital, Inc is an affiliate of Wellstar Health System, Inc which on an annual basis issues a community benefit report This report is subsequently distributed in and around the five county service areas of the health system

The Charity and other Community Benefit at Cost calculations on Part I, Line 7 of Schedule H are determined by comparing the cost to charge ratio from the hospital's Medicare cost report and other governmental reports to the expected reimbursement (if any) of those charges. The net community benefit expense or shortfall is then compared to the total hospital functional expense less bad debt (as mentioned previously). The resulting percentage of net community benefit expense to total expense is approximately 7% for the reporting period.

The percentage of net community benefit expense to the total functional expense found on Form 990 Part IX, Line 25, column (A) is calculated by reducing the total expense (\$346,565,657) by the amount of bad debt expense (\$65,475,729) on Line 24b of Form 990, Part IX

The patient accounts generated by the hospital are analyzed for their propensity to pay any amounts not covered by insurance. After a period of attempting to collect outstanding balances, the accounts that are deemed uncollectible are written off to bad debt. Some patient accounts that are classified as bad debts are subsequently determined to qualify for charity and indigent care adjustments. This determination can occur due to inadequate information being available at the time services were provided as well as throughout the collection cycle as the patient's financial status may periodically change. Accounts for undocumented aliens and crime victims are sometimes written off because the patients do not allow follow-up in the collection process and thus never become eligible for charity or governmental funding. Generally speaking however, Wellstar and Cobb Hospital do not treat bad debt as uncompensated care.

Form 990 Schedule H, Part VI - Supplemental Information, Line 1

The Medicare shortfall on line 7 generally represents the uncompensated difference between the expected Medicare reimbursement and the Medicare charges stated at cost. The costing methodology to determine the amount reported on line 6 for Medicare allowable costs is basically a cost to charge ratio determined from data in the annual Medicare cost report.

The policy written for collection practices at all Wellstar Health System entities incorporates guideline for personnel in the admissions and patient access registration areas to be trained in identifying patients that might qualify for charity care or other financial assistance. It is also the policy of all Wellstar hospitals to have at least one employee or contractor available 24 hours a day and seven days a week (especially in hospitals with emergency rooms) on duty to provide assistance for the paperwork necessary to qualify for charity care or governmental assistance programs.

Form 990 Schedule H, Part VI - Supplemental Information, Line 2

Wellstar is a key stakeholder in MAPP, Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships. MAPP, developed by the National Association of County and City Health Officials (NACCHO) in collaboration with the CDC, provides a structured guidance on creating and implementing a community-wide strategic planning process focused on improving the health and safety of our population. Through MAPP, a broad collection of community partners and residents come together to identify and prioritize health and safety issues and to identify resources for addressing them. The process results in an actionable Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) for measureable improvements in the community's health and quality of life as well as a scorecard for implementation and evaluation. The resulting community plan does not focus on one agency or community health challenge, rather, MAPP provides a long-term strategy that addresses the multiple factors that affect health in the community. Community involvement throughout the creation and implementation of a health improvement plan results in creative solutions to community health problems with an improved focus on priorities, reduced duplication of services, increased collaboration on projects and activities, and increased capacity to garner additional resources. Moreover, continuous community involvement leads to community ownership of the process. Community ownership, in turn, increases the credibility and sustainability of the health improvement efforts.

Cobb Hospital provides patients with cashiers and financial counselors who are trained in all of the uncompensation program requirements, payment plans, charity discounts, and other programs that are offered by the hospital. This includes at least one cashier in the emergency room on duty at all times. These financial counselors are well versed in the eligibility requirements for Medicare and Medicaid if applicable for the patient which includes in some instances SSI Disability through the Medicare program. If a patient is pregnant and not covered by insurance or another government program the counselors can assist the patient in obtaining Medicaid eligibility (based on the income level) regardless of the patient's citizenship. If the patient is indigent or charity eligible they will be offered assistance through the hospital's Charity and Indigent Care policy including the state's Indigent Care Trust Fund. If the patient has no other insurance and fails to qualify for indigent care the financial counselor can then offer the patient an opportunity to accept a payment plan with discounted payment options based on their ability to pay immediately or over time. All patients are afforded these opportunities.

Form 990 Schedule H, Part VI - Supplemental Information, Line 4

Cobb Hospital is one of five hospitals that are affiliated with the parent corporation, Wellstar Health System. The primary service area of the system is located in the Northwest Georgia area and receives the majority and is expected to receive the majority of its patients from one of the following five counties--Bartow, Cherokee, Cobb, Douglas and Paulding--generally about 85% to 90%. While these five counties are in the metropolitan Atlanta area (or border on the metro area) they are in some of the fastest growing areas in the entire county. The system has therefore expanded to bring many services to the geographic area that previously were not available except in the "downtown" Atlanta community. Economically the region is strong in per capita income but as in many areas of the country the system has seen an increase in the unemployment numbers and thus an increase in the uninsured and indigent population for the patients it serves.

As stated in the Wellstar Health System and Affiliates Audited Financial Statements for the period ending June 30, 2010, Cobb Hospital (an affiliate of Wellstar Health System, Inc) operates as a charitable organization consistent with the requirements of Internal Revenue Code Section 501 (c) (3) and the "community benefit standard" of IRS Ruling 69-545 In this regard the governing body of the organization and/or its parent is composed of prominent citizens in the community, medical staff privileges in the hospital are available to all qualified physicians in the area consistent with the size and nature of the facility, the hospital operates a full-time emergency room open to all regardless of ability to pay, the hospital provides care to the needy members of the community consistent with its charity care policy regardless of their ability to pay for these services The hospital's excess funds are generally applied to expansion and replacement of existing facilities and equipment, amortization of indebtedness, improvement of patient care, community benefit activities, and charity care Cobb Hospital committed approximately \$7 0 million in capital expenditures for the year to meet technology and program needs of the community it serves
