Individuals with incomes greater than 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines may be eligible for care at discounted rates depending on their income level and/or the amount due to the hospital. Charity/Medical Indigence Parameters. Charity/Medical Indigence parameters are based on Federal Income Poverty (FPL) Guidelines which are updated annually. Generally, no patient's financial responsibility shall be greater than 20% of the household adjusted gross income, subject to an asset test. This determination shall be made per episode of care where income exceeds 300% of the FPL, and, when warranted, in aggregate for multiple episodes. The parameters will be reviewed annually with the FPL updates. The review will include assessment of the sliding scale ranges, maximum out of pockets, and overall impact to the facilities and system. Revisions will be completed as warranted.

The text of the footnote that is included in the Sisters of Mercy Health System, Inc. and Subsidiaries audited financial statements that describes bad debt expense follows "Patient accounts that are uncollected, including those placed with collection agencies, are initially charged against the allowance for uncollectible accounts in accordance with collections policies of the Health System and, in certain cases, are reclassified to charity care if deemed to otherwise meet the health system's charity care policy. The provision for uncollectible receivables is based on management's assessment of historical and expected net collections considering business and economic conditions, trends in healthcare coverage, and other collection indicators. Periodically throughout the year, management assess the adequacy of the allowance for uncollectible receivables based upon the payor composition and aging of receivables as of the reporting date with consideration of the historical payment and write-off experience by payor category. The results of these reviews are then used to make any modifications to the provision for uncollectible receivables to establish an appropriate allowance for uncollectible receivables. After satisfaction of amounts due from insurance, the health system follows established guidelines for placing past-due balances with collection agencies "To determine the amount of bad debt expense, at cost, bad debt expense attributable to patient accounts was multiplied by a ratio of cost to charges. The ratio of cost to charges used was based on detailed cost accounting, where available. Where cost accounting is not available, cost report cost to charge ratios were utilized. The filing organization determined that the estimated amount of bad debt expense (at cost) attributable to patients eligible under the organization's charity care policy is \$0. Although the charity care policy requires the participation of the patient requesting assistance, we have a process under presumptive charity (refer to disclosure for Part III. #9b) to address accounts for patients who do not provide the information. We believe that our charity policy is comprehensive enough to capture almost all patients who qualify for charity care

Accounts active in accounts receivable and active with collections agencies are adjusted to charity when patients or guarantors met the guidelines outlined in our policy. Accounts previously written off to bad debt as uncollectible and later returned are not adjusted to charity, unless additional information has been collected by the collection agency. Subsequent events and additional information that would lead to consideration of charity vs. bad debt include bankruptcy filing or death notice with no surviving spouse or estate. Credit reporting agencies will be notified for any changes to account balances that have been previously listed on the patient guarantor credit reports. The Medicare shortfall was computed using the annual prepared Medicare Cost Report, CMS Form 2552-96. It is the position of St. Joseph's that 100% of the short fall should be treated as community benefit. This amount represents cost of providing services that remain uncompensated to the provider.

Mercy will utilize the Search America tool to enhance our ability to determine charity qualification. Presumptive charity will be granted in situations where we have been unable to obtain information from our patients or the information provided is not complete enough to make a charity determination. Mercy will utilize presumptive charity prior to bad debt placement for charity adjustments in excess of \$10,000. In these cases, Mercy will utilize the Search American report status of "probable charity" as the basis for the assigning the charity level. Mercy will pursue appropriate means in the collection of delinquent accounts from patients with an established ability to pay or an unwillingness to cooperate in validating eligibility for financial assistance, including legal action consistent with Mercy mission and values, which may include liens upon real property and reasonable wage garnishments. Legal actions will generally not include bank garnishment, repossession of assets or foreclosures to enforce satisfaction of lien. Mercy has policies and procedures established to address the initiation of legal action. Mercy annually reviews collection agency compliance with all policies.

St Joseph's Mercy Health System's objectives of community needs assessment are to identify health needs in Hot Springs and surrounding communities, and involve the community in the health planning efforts. The information gathered is used to plan strategically, and better meet the health and human service needs of these communities. St Joseph's looks at community needs assessment as an opportunity to build relationships educate the community and identify resources that are available to meet identified needs. Basic discussion forums have been utilized to foster conversation with key stakeholders. Examples of forums include an advisory board, specific focus groups, opinion surveys, and community round table discussions. Stakeholder participates include board members, community/civic leaders, local employers, other health care providers, former patients, and co-workers.

We offer payment assistance for those who do not have insurance or who are in financial need. Uninsured Patient Discounts A discount from the hospital's regular billed charges will be provided to patients who do not have insurance. This includes patients whose financial situation normally would not otherwise qualify them for charity care discounts. Patients without insurance whose financial situation qualifies them for charity care discounts (see Eligibility Guidelines below) must first find out if they are eligible for Medicaid before applying for financial assistance. Patients denied Medicaid eligibility then must provide certain information to show financial need. Applications for charity care discounts will be reviewed for eligibility based on the applicant's income, family size, amount of payment due and availability of other assets or resources. St Joseph's Mercy Health Center defines its primary service area as Garland County, with a secondary service area incorporating Montgomery, Pike, Clark and Hot Spring Counties in Arkansas. The majority of St. Joseph's care is delivered to resident of Garland County, the sixth largest county in the state. The total population of Garland County in 2005 was 91,690 with the largest urban area being the city of Hot Springs, population 35,750. Garland County is a popular retirement area and as a result it has a large Medicare population, 18,652 or 20.7% of the population is over age 65. Like many counties in Arkansas, Garland County has a large population of persons who are poor From 2005 estimates on the census, Garland County had 16.8% of the population at less than 100% of federal poverty levels. There is also a large percentage of "working poor" persons who are employed but do not have health insurance. According to an Arkansas. Department of Health Survey, 19.3% of the non-Medicare population, i.e. persons under age 65, do not have health insurance.

The filing organization is part of the Sisters of Mercy Health System ("Mercy") Mercy is a Missouri non-profit corporation with its headquarters ("ministry office") in St. Louis, Missouri. Mercy provides health care services in four states - Arkansas, Kansas, Missouri, and Oklahoma - and has outreach ministries located in Louisiana, Mississippi, and Texas. Mercy's mission is "As the Sisters of Mercy before us, we bring life to the healing ministry of Jesus through our compassionate care and exceptional service." As of June 30, 2010, Mercy facilities included 28 hospitals with 3,718 acute licensed beds (3,300 acute available beds). Mercy facilities offer a wide range of health care services across the system, including inpatient and outpatient care, rehabilitation services, cancer care, trauma care, burn care, skilled nursing, home health and hospice, sports medicine, and neonatal and pediatric intensive care. For the fiscal year ended June 30, 2010, Mercy had more than 6.3 million outpatient visits, more than 1,200 employed physicians, and approximately 28,000 employees, making Mercy the eighth largest Catholic health system in the United States based on net patient service revenue. Mercy is sponsored by Mercy Health Ministry, which is governed by members that include Sisters of Mercy.
