


THIS ESTIMATE IS BASED ON HISTORICAL INFORMATION. THE REMAINING 5% OF BAD DEBT IS RECORDED IN THE EXPENSE SECTION APPROPRIATELY CALLED "BAD DEBT".

THE FOOTNOTES TO THE AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENT REPORT THE AMOUNT OF ESTIMATED UNCOLLECTIBLE SELF-PAY AND EXPLAINS THAT UNCOLLECTIBLE PATIENT ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE ESTIMATED RESERVES ARE BASED UPON PRIOR COLLECTION HISTORY FOR GROUPS OF RECEIVABLES, KNOWN COLLECTION RISKS AND OTHER ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS, INCLUDING THE AGE OF THE RECEIVABLES.

REGARDING LINE 3, IT IS IMPLAUSIBLE TO DETERMINE THE AMOUNT OF DCH'S BAD DEBT ASSOCIATED WITH THOSE PATIENTS WHO MAY HAVE MET THE CRITERIA SET FORTH IN OUR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE POLICY WITHOUT HAVING A COMPLETED FINANCIAL ASSESSMENT FOR EACH PATIENT. WE ARE UNABLE TO DETERMINE OUR PATIENTS' FINANCIAL CIRCUMSTANCES UNLESS A COMPLETED FINANCIAL ASSESSMENT FORM IS VOLUNTARILY PROVIDED TO US. WE CAN ASSERT THAT MORE THAN 90% OF OUR PATIENTS WHO HAVE PROVIDED COMPLETED FINANCIAL ASSESSMENT FORMS HAVE BEEN APPROVED FOR AT LEAST PARTIAL FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE. 16% OF THOSE PATIENTS APPROVED FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE WERE BAD DEBT TRANSFERS. WE

FIND IT UNREASONABLE TO APPLY EITHER OF THESE PERCENTAGES TO OUR BAD DEBT POPULATION AS THERE ARE MANY ADDITIONAL VARIABLES THAT MUST BE CONSIDERED.

OUR VICE PRESIDENT OF PATIENT FINANCIAL SERVICES CONSERVATIVELY ESTIMATES THAT 60% OF TOTAL BAD DEBT EXPENSE WAS ASSUMED ATTRIBUTABLE TO PATIENTS POTENTIALLY ELIGIBLE FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE.

PART III, LINE 8: MEDICARE ALLOWABLE COSTS WERE REPORTED USING DCH'S FILED MEDICARE COST REPORT (C/R). THE C/R USES A COST TO CHARGE RATIO BASED ON A STEP-DOWN ALLOCATION METHODOLOGY. MEDICARE LOSSES, INCLUDING SOME NON-ALLOWABLE COSTS, SHOULD BE COUNTED AS A COMMUNITY BENEFIT AS THIS IS THE COST OF CARE FOR SERVING THE AGING POPULATION. WHILE DCH DID NOT SUFFER LOSSES DURING FY10 FROM SERVING MEDICARE PATIENTS, WE REALIZE WE ARE AN EXCEPTION. AS A SMALL FACILITY THAT FOCUSES ON OUTPATIENT CARE AND AS A CRITICAL ACCESS HOSPITAL, OUR REIMBURSEMENT LEVELS ARE GENERALLY BETTER THAN TYPICAL ACUTE CARE FACILITIES THAT PROVIDE SIGNIFICANT INPATIENT CARE TO A SICKER POPULATION OF PATIENTS AND PROVIDE A MUCH BROADER, AND MORE EXPENSIVE, LEVEL OF CARE.

THIS INFORMATION WAS COLLECTED, THEN ANALYZED, AND A SUMMARY OF THE FINDINGS WAS LISTED IN AN EFFORT TO OBTAIN A MORE DETAILED SNAPSHOT SPECIFIC TO EACH COUNTY LOCATED THROUGHOUT THE MSHA SERVICE AREA. THE MSHA STEERING COMMITTEE IDENTIFIED OBESITY AS THE HEALTH DISPARITY TARGETED FOR IMPROVEMENT, INCLUDING THE COMMUNITY SERVED BY DCH.

DURING FY09, MSHA BEGAN COLLABORATIVE EFFORTS WITH EAST TENNESSEE STATE UNIVERSITY'S COLLEGE OF PUBLIC HEALTH TO DEVELOP THE MSHA-ETSU OBESITY COLLABORATIVE COMMITTEE. THE FOCUS OF THIS COMMITTEE IS TO PULL TOGETHER MANY PARTNERS AND ORGANIZATIONS IN COLLABORATION TO REDUCE THE LEVEL OF CHILDHOOD OBESITY THROUGHOUT NORTHEAST TENNESSEE AND SOUTHWEST VIRGINIA. DURING FY10, THE COMMITTEE OFFERED 25 SEED GRANTS OF \$2,000 EACH TO LOCAL COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS SUCH AS CHURCHES, COMMUNITY GROUPS, SCHOOLS, AND EMPLOYERS THAT WANT TO EXPLORE OBESITY REDUCTION EFFORTS. ONE OF THOSE GRANTS WAS AWARDED TO AN ORGANIZATION IN CLINTWOOD TO EXPAND THEIR PHYSICAL ACTIVITY AND NUTRITION EDUCATION PROGRAM TARGETING CHILDREN.

IN ADDITION TO THE GRANTS PROGRAM, AN ANNUAL SYMPOSIUM IS PROVIDED FREE TO THE REGION, INCLUDING DICKENSON COUNTY RESIDENTS AND COMMUNITY GROUPS. NATIONAL, REGIONAL, AND LOCAL EXPERTS SHARE INFORMATION ON TRENDS REGARDING CHILDHOOD OBESITY AND PROVEN COMMUNITY-BASED STRATEGIES TO REDUCE THE PREVALENCE. THIS ARRANGEMENT CALLS FOR MSHA TO PROVIDE THE INITIAL FUNDING, WHILE ETSU WORKS ON RESEARCH EFFORTS.
