FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE. ALL REQUESTS FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE MUST BE

ACCOMPANIED BY A COMPLETED FINANCIAL ASSESSMENT FORM AND SUPPORTING

DOCUMENTATION.

PART VI, LINE 8: DCH SUBMITS COMMUNITY BENEFIT INFORMATION TO THE VIRGINIA HEALTH AND HOSPITAL ASSOCIATION (VHHA). VHHA COMBINES DATA FROM ALL SOURCES TO DEMONSTRATE THE BENEFITS PROVIDED BY BOTH FOR-PROFIT AND NOT-FOR-PROFIT HOSPITALS TO THE STATE OF VIRGINIA. RELATED HOSPITALS LOCATED IN VIRGINIA ALSO FILE WITH VHHA, WHILE RELATED HOSPITALS LOCATED IN TENNESSEE FILE WITH THE HOSPITAL ALLIANCE OF TENNESSEE. BOTH REPORTS INCLUDE INFORMATION RELATIVE TO LOSSES FROM CARING FOR MEDICAID AND TENNCARE PATIENTS, SUBSIDIZED HEALTH SERVICES, BENEFITS PROVIDED TO OTHER TAX-EXEMPT ORGANIZATIONS, AND MUCH MORE.

PART VI, LINE 2: DCH IS A MEMBER OF MOUNTAIN STATES HEALTH ALLIANCE

(MSHA). DURING FY08 AND FY09, MSHA CONDUCTED THE LARGEST COMMUNITY HEALTH

NEEDS ASSESSMENT IN ITS HISTORY IN AN EFFORT TO PROFILE THE HEALTH OF THE

RESIDENTS WITHIN THE LOCAL REGION. THE ASSESSMENT FOCUSED ON STATE,

REGIONAL, AND COUNTY SPECIFIC DATA COLLECTION. THIS ASSESSMENT ALSO

INCLUDED PRIMARY DATA COLLECTED THROUGH APPROXIMATELY 50 ONE-ON-ONE

INTERVIEWS. THOSE INTERVIEWED WERE INDIVIDUALS FROM AROUND THE REGION

WHICH INCLUDED LOCAL AND STATE GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS, HEALTH DEPARTMENT REPRESENTATIVES, PHYSICIANS, GENERAL PUBLIC, LOCAL INDUSTRY, CIVIC ORGANIZATIONS, EDUCATION OFFICIALS, AND COMMUNITY RESOURCE GROUPS. THIS INFORMATION WAS COLLECTED, THEN ANALYZED, AND A SUMMARY OF THE FINDINGS WAS LISTED IN AN EFFORT TO OBTAIN A MORE DETAILED SNAPSHOT SPECIFIC TO EACH COUNTY LOCATED THROUGHOUT THE MSHA SERVICE AREA. THIS INFORMATION WAS REVIEWED BY MSHA'S STRATEGIC PLANNING TEAM, GOVERNMENT RELATIONS, AND QUALITY DEPARTMENTS. THE MSHA STEERING COMMITTEE IDENTIFIED OBESITY AS THE HEALTH DISPARITY TARGETED FOR IMPROVEMENT, INCLUDING THE COMMUNITY SERVED BY DCH.

DURING FY09, MSHA BEGAN COLLABORATIVE EFFORTS WITH EAST TENNESSEE STATE UNIVERSITY'S COLLEGE OF PUBLIC HEALTH TO DEVELOP THE MSHA-ETSU OBESITY COLLABORATIVE COMMITTEE. THE FOCUS OF THIS COMMITTEE IS TO PULL TOGETHER MANY PARTNERS AND ORGANIZATIONS IN COLLABORATION TO REDUCE THE LEVEL OF CHILDHOOD OBESITY THROUGHOUT NORTHEAST TENNESSEE AND SOUTHWEST VIRGINIA. DURING FY10, THE COMMITTEE OFFERED 25 SEED GRANTS OF \$2,000 EACH TO LOCAL COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS SUCH AS CHURCHES, COMMUNITY GROUPS, SCHOOLS, AND EMPLOYERS THAT WANT TO EXPLORE OBESITY REDUCTION EFFORTS. ONE OF THOSE GRANTS WAS AWARDED TO AN ORGANIZATION IN CLINTWOOD TO EXPAND THEIR PHYSICAL ACTIVITY AND NUTRITION EDUCATION PROGRAM TARGETING CHILDREN.

IN ADDITION TO THE GRANTS PROGRAM, AN ANNUAL SYMPOSIUM IS PROVIDED FREE TO THE REGION, INCLUDING DICKENSON COUNTY RESIDENTS AND COMMUNITY GROUPS. NATIONAL, REGIONAL, AND LOCAL EXPERTS SHARE INFORMATION ON TRENDS REGARDING CHILDHOOD OBESITY AND PROVEN COMMUNITY-BASED STRATEGIES TO REDUCE THE PREVALENCE. THIS ARRANGEMENT CALLS FOR MSHA TO PROVIDE THE INITIAL FUNDING, WHILE ETSU WORKS ON RESEARCH EFFORTS.

PART VI, LINE 3: DCH PROVIDES COMMUNICATION OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE ON ITS WEBSITE AND ON POSTERS LOCATED IN PROMINENT AREAS OF THE HOSPITAL SUCH AS ADMITTING AREAS AND THE EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT. PRINTED EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS INCLUDING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE CONTACT INFORMATION ARE ALSO PROVIDED IN EACH PATIENT'S PAPERWORK. ADMITTING STAFF ARE TRAINED TO EDUCATE PATIENTS ON MSHA'S FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE POLICY. MSHA ALSO HAS FINANCIAL COUNSELORS TO PROVIDE FURTHER INFORMATION AND ASSISTANCE TO DCH PATIENTS REGARDING MSHA'S FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE POLICY. THESE COUNSELORS ALSO HELP UNINSURED PATIENTS DETERMINE SOURCES OF PAYMENT FOR MEDICAL BILLS AND HELP PATIENTS DETERMINE ELIGIBILITY FOR PROGRAMS SUCH AS MEDICAID.

PART VI, LINE 4: DCH IS LOCATED IN CLINTWOOD, DICKENSON COUNTY, WHICH IS IN RURAL SOUTHWEST VIRGINIA. DICKENSON COUNTY IS A FEDERALLY DESIGNATED MEDICALLY UNDERSERVED AREA AND HAS A HIGH RATE OF INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE UNINSURED. THE POPULATION OF DICKENSON COUNTY IS JUST OVER 16,000 AND ACCORDING TO THE U.S. CENSUS BUREAU, THE TOWN OF CLINTWOOD HAS A POPULATION OF 1,707. THE MEDIAN AGE OF RESIDENTS OF DICKENSON COUNTY IS 41.8, WHICH IS OLDER THAN THE AVERAGE AGE OF 36.5 IN THE UNITED STATES. DICKENSON COUNTY HAS A MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME OF \$27,680, WHICH IS 55% BELOW VIRGINIA'S MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME. 29% OF DICKENSON COUNTY'S CHILDREN LIVE IN POVERTY COMPARED TO 14% STATEWIDE.
