The Esel-Initiative (German for "Donkey Initiative") was founded in 1995 with the aim of relieving single mothers in Eritrea of the hardship of carrying water and helping them take care of themselves and their families. The project is carried out in cooperation with the National Union of Eritrean Women (NUEW, also known as "Hamade") a semigovernmental organization composed mainly of former women fighters. The NUEW has representatives even in the smallest villages of Eritrea. The women receive female donkeys so they can raise further generations. Every woman gets an 80-liter water container made of Indian rubber together with her donkey. Before the war, a donkey plus container cost 600 Nakfa in average - some 75 Euro. Prices have risen since the war, however, and the NUEW now pays 750 Nakfa in average, the equivalent of some 90 Euros. Women that in the past would not dream of owning even a hen now have their own donkey. Inspired by the perspective of earning a steady income with the donkey, many recipients free themselves from traditional roles - they become entrepreneurs, engage in economic activities previously reserved to men, and demonstrate that single mothers are not doomed to be poor, but can instead reach prosperity for their family, when given a little help to start with. Their definition of prosperity being: enough water, burning wood for cooking, three meals a day, school for their children, and freedom from the fear of not finding work the following day. In many cases, the first major wish that women fulfill with the money earned on their own is to improve or rebuild the roof of their home. With a donkey, family roles are redefined. Carrying water is the exclusive domain of women and girls, but when there's a donkey, the boys go as well. For the girls this means having more time to go to school, and maybe even some time to play.
