The charity provided ranges from 100% of the patient's bill for individuals whose household income is at 100% or less of the Federal poverty level, to a 60% deduction for individuals whose income is at 400% of the Federal poverty level. The charity in situations such as a catastrophic illness where the patient does not have liquid assets.

This allowance is not included in the calculation of the cost of bad debts in instances where a patient does not pay his or her bill. CHI Colorado provides information to patients at the time of registration with respect to its financial assistance policies. However, in some instances patients do not complete the necessary forms to apply for financial assistance. As a result, CHI Colorado uses an outside vendor to assist in determining a patient's eligibility for financial assistance. This includes a review of the patient's financial situation based on the vendor's database of external information. In instances where the review indicates that the patient qualifies for financial assistance, CHI Colorado adjusts the patient's bill to match its charity policy and does not pursue collection from the patient for the portion of the patient's obligation that qualifies for charity CHI Colorado is consolidated with it's parent company, Catholic Health Initiatives and the Bad debt footnote reads as follows "The provision for bad debts is based upon management's assessment of historical and expected net collections considering historical business and economic conditions, trends in health care coverage, and other collection indicators. Management periodically assesses the adequacy of the allowances for uncollectible accounts based upon historical write-off experience by payor category. The results of these reviews are used to modify, as necessary, the provision for bad debts and to establish appropriate allowances for uncollectible net patient accounts receivable. After satisfaction of amounts due from insurance, CHI follows established quidelines for placing certain patient balances with collection agencies, subject to the terms of certain restrictions on collection efforts as determined by each facility "
