Bylaws

Washington State School Retirees' Foundation

ARTICLE I

- (A) The name of the corporation shall be the Washington State School Retirees' Foundation.
- (B) The purpose of the corporation shall be to raise funds and accept donations for the Foundation, and to manage the Foundation's investments for the purpose of providing annual scholarships for high school seniors planning to major in education or school-related fields. The funds shall be invested upon professional recommendations and reviewed regularly by the Board. As revenue increases, the Board may set the scholarship amount to reflect those increases. Scholarships are available to recipients from each of the eight Districts of WSSRA.

The corporation shall accept contributions from the general public, including without limiting the generality thereof, individuals, firms, partnerships, associations, and corporations in the name of any fund or entity heretofore and hereinafter designated by it pursuant to resolution adopted by its Board of Trustees, and to disburse such funds for the purposes set forth in Article III of the Articles of Incorporation.

The corporation shall do everything which is helpful, necessary, proper, advisable or convenient for the accomplishment of the purposes herein above set forth, and do all other things incidental thereto or connected therewith which are not forbidden by the Act, or by the Articles of Incorporation, as amended from time to time, as well as any and all things which will not impair the corporation's status as a tax-exempt organization under the provisions of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code as from time to time amended or superseded.

- (C) This corporation shall be non-profit and shall be operated in such a manner that no part of the income or assets of this corporation shall inure directly or indirectly to the benefit of any member, Trustee or Officer, or any person having a personal or private interest in the management or control thereof, or of any person who makes or has made, directly or indirectly, a substantial contribution to this corporation.
- (D) The seal of the corporation shall be circular in form and shall contain the name of the corporation.

ARTICLE II – MEMBERS

The voting members of the corporation shall be the members of the Washington State School Retirees' Association, who shall have the right to elect Trustees and to amend the Articles of Incorporation of the Washington State School Retirees' Foundation.

There shall be no distinction between membership. All members shall have the same rights, preferences, limitation and restriction, and each member shall have one vote in corporate affairs of this nature. The membership of the Board of Trustees shall not be less than five (5).

ARTICLE III - TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP

Membership in this corporation shall terminate by reason of death, resignation, or ceasing to be a member in good standing with the Washington State School Retirees' Association.

ARTICLE IV - BOARD OF TRUSTEES

- (A) The governing body of this corporation shall be its Board of Trustees, who shall have general charge and control of the affairs, funds and property of the corporation and shall carry out the objectives of the corporation in accordance with these Bylaws.
- (B) The Board of Trustees shall consist of five (5) persons, all of whom shall be members or associate members in good standing of the Washington State School Retirees' Association. The Trustees shall be elected in December, 1985, by the Executive Board of the Washington State School Retirees' Association and at Delegate Assembly of the Washington State School Retirees' Association in June, 1987, by voting members of the Association. At the annual meeting in 1987 and all subsequent annual meetings, one (1) Trustee shall be elected for a term of five (5) years.
- (C) Any vacancy in the position of Trustee, other than one created by expiration of a term, shall be filled by interim appointment by a majority vote of the Executive Board of the Washington State School Retirees' Association at its next regular meeting following the creation of the vacancy. An interim Trustee so appointed shall serve until the end of the next annual meeting of the Washington State School Retirees' Association, at which time he/she shall be succeeded by a Trustee elected by the voting members of the Association to serve for any unexpired term created by such vacancy.
- (D) Any elected member of the Board of Trustees may be removed for any cause by a majority vote of the membership of the Washington State School Retirees' Association at its annual meeting. Absence of any Trustee from two consecutive meetings of the Board shall be deemed a tender of his/her resignation, unless satisfactory reason for such absence is tendered in writing within twenty (20) days from the date of the second meeting. Any vacancy caused by such absence shall be filled as herein above provided to any vacancy in the position of Trustee.
- (E) At any meeting of the Trustees, each Trustee shall have one vote, and the vote of a majority of those present and voting at any meeting shall be sufficient to take any action.
- (F) The officers of the corporation will be designated in the following manner: the newly elected member of the Board of Trustees will be a trustee at large; the second year member will be the secretary; the third year member will be treasurer; the fourth year member will be the vice president; and the fifth year member will be president. The officers shall assume their duties at the first meeting after the WSSRA convention. Vacancies in any office shall be filled by the Board of Trustees.
- (G) In addition to the powers and authority expressly conferred by these Bylaws, the Trustees shall exercise all powers of the corporation and do all such acts and things as deemed proper which are not prohibited by law or by the Articles of Incorporation or the Bylaws of this corporation.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS

- (A) The Officers of this corporation shall be a President, Vice-president, Secretary and Treasurer. All Officers shall be selected as set forth in Article IV, Section F. Additionally, the Executive Board of the Washington State School Retirees' Association shall have the option of appointing, or directing the Officers to appoint, an Executive Director who may be a member of the staff of the Washington State School Retirees' Association named by the Executive Board of the Association with approval of the Trustees of the Foundation, or an independent employee.
- (B) The resignation of a Trustee shall be tendered to the Board of Trustees. Officers may be removed for cause by a vote of a majority of the members of the Board of Trustees.
- (C) If a vacancy shall occur among the Trustees during the fiscal year by reason of death, resignation or otherwise, the Executive Board of the Washington State School Retirees' Association shall elect a member to fill the vacancy until the next annual meeting of the Association.
- (D) The President shall be the Chief Executive Officer. He/she shall preside at all meetings of the corporation, all meetings of the Board of Trustees, and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees. He/she shall appoint, subject to the action of the Board of Trustees, all committees and perform all executive duties ordinarily pertaining to the office of President or delegated to him/her by the Board of Trustees. In the event the President is temporarily unable or unwilling to act, the following shall act in his/her stead in the order named: The Vice-president, a member of the Board, designated by the Board.
- (E) The Vice-president of the corporation shall act in the place of the President when the President is unable to serve and perform any other duties assigned to him/her by either the Board or the President.
- (F) The Secretary of the corporation shall record, or have recorded, approve and sign the minutes of all the meetings of the corporation and shall perform all other duties prescribed in these Bylaws or which may be delegated to him/her by the Board of Trustees.
- (G) The Treasurer of the corporation shall have oversight of all funds and the securities of the corporation. He/she shall be responsible for reports to the Washington Secretary of State and all other required financial reports.
- (H) The Executive Director shall, when directed by the President, act as Secretary of all meetings of the corporation and of the Board of Trustees, be an ex-officio member of all committees, give notice of all meetings requiring notice, cause a record of the proceedings at all meetings to be made and of all matters of which a record shall be ordered, notify the members-elect, conduct such correspondence as shall be required by his/her office; at the direction of the Treasurer, receive all moneys payable to the corporation and deposit all such moneys in a bank or banks designated by the Board of Trustees. It shall be the duty of the Executive Director at each meeting of the corporation to record the names of the members who are present at such meetings. The Executive Director shall perform all other duties prescribed in these Bylaws or which may be delegated to her/him by the Board of Trustees, including the employment of necessary staff as authorized by the Board of Trustees.
- (I) SURETY BONDS. The Board of Trustees may require the furnishings of surety bonds in such amounts and for such officers and staff members as they may determine.

(J) INDEMNIFICATION. The Foundation shall indemnify its Trustees and Officers in each and every instance in which such indemnification is required or permitted by statute. The Trustees shall act promptly and in good faith whenever any action on their part is required by statute to implement any such indemnification.

The Foundation shall indemnify and hold harmless each Trustee, Director, and Officer now or hereafter serving the Corporation from and against any and all claims and liabilities to which the Trustee, Director, or Officer may be or become subject to by reason of his or her now or hereafter being or having heretofore been a Trustee, Director, or Officer of the Foundation, and/or by reason of alleged acts or missions as such Trustee, Director, or Officer, whether or not he or she continues to be such Trustee, Director, or Officer at the time when any such claim or liability is asserted, and shall reimburse each such Trustee, Director or Officer for all legal and other expenses reasonably incurred in connection with defending any or all such claims or liabilities, including amounts paid or agreed to be paid in connection with any reasonable settlements made before final adjudication with the approval of the Board of Trustees, whether or not he or she continues to be such Trustee, Director, or Officer at the time such expenses are incurred; provided, however, that no Trustee, Director, or Officer shall be indemnified against any claim or liability arising out of his/her own negligence or willful misconduct or shall be indemnified against or reimbursed for any expense incurred in defending any or all such claims or liability or in settling the same unless in the judgment of a majority of the Board of Trustees of the corporation it is determined that the Trustee, Director, or Officer against whom such claims or liabilities are asserted has not been guilty of negligence or willful misconduct. The foregoing right of indemnification shall not be exclusive of any other rights to which any Trustee, Director, or Officer may be entitled as a matter of law.

- (K) INSURANCE. The Foundation shall have the power to purchase and maintain insurance for the purposes of indemnification of Trustees and Officers.
- (L) No personal liability shall ever attach to any member of the corporation, his or her heirs or estate, merely by virtue of his or her being a member, Trustee, Director, or Officer of the corporation. Any liability of the corporation shall be a corporate liability, except where the member specifically assumes liability, or where such liability may, under the law, be effected by the conduct or fraud of any given member in connection with duties assumed by such member, Trustee, Director, or Officer.

ARTICLE VI - COMMITTEES

The President, with the approval of the Board of Trustees, shall appoint such committees as necessary, to whom shall be delegated such authority as the Board of Trustees from time to time shall direct.

ARTICLE VII - MEETINGS, DATE, QUORUM

- (A) The President of the Foundation or any three (3) members of the Board of Trustees of the Foundation shall have authority to call a special meeting of the members, and a majority of those in attendance at such special meetings shall have full authority to act.
- (B) The Board of Trustees shall hold its annual meeting in conjunction with the annual meeting of the members of the Washington State School Retirees' Association and such meeting shall be a meeting of the outgoing Board. Immediately upon adjournment of this meeting, a meeting of the incoming Board of Trustees shall convene for the purpose of transacting any business which may come before the Board. The Board may hold such other meetings as are declared necessary

by the President of the Foundation, any three (3) members of the Board of Trustees of the Foundation on ten (10) days notice in writing, or such meeting may be held at any time upon the unanimous waiver of notice of all Trustees. Preferably, regular meetings should be held in conjunction with the regular meetings of the Executive Board of the Washington State School Retirees' Association. In the event notice shall be given in writing, such notice shall state the time and place of the meeting and the purposes of such meeting. Such notice shall be deemed to have been given at the moment when it is personally delivered to the addressee or is deposited in the United States mails bearing the last known address of the addressee together with the correct return address and postage.

(C) Any formality or all formalities as to any meeting may be waived, except as to the state in which meetings may be held. Such waiver may be made implied by any person who is present at such meeting or who fails to object to the lack of such formality, or such waiver may be made expressly in writing and signed by the person making the waiver and incorporated in or attached to the minutes. Unless expressly limited by its terms, a waiver of the formalities of the meeting shall be construed to waive all notice of time and place and purpose of the meeting and also to waive the propriety of time and place of the meeting.

ARTICLE VIII - DUES AND ASSESSMENTS

No dues or assessments of any kind shall ever be presented to or paid by any member, Trustee, or Officer.

ARTICLE IX - FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the corporation shall end on June 30 of each year.

ARTICLE X - BANK ACCOUNTS, DEPOSITORIES, TITLE TO PROPERTY, DISBURSEMENTS AND AUDITS

- (A) The Board of Trustees shall have power from time to time to name depositories of funds of the corporation and for the safekeeping of valuable instruments and to designate in whose name title to any real property or personal property may be taken as to Trustee or otherwise.
- (B) Purchases, sales, exchanges or other financial transactions of the corporation shall be the responsibility of the Board of Trustees. Disbursements of funds shall be only by checks signed in a manner designated by the Trustees and for expenditures approved by the Officers or others having authority granted by the Trustees to make such approvals.
- (C) There shall be an annual audit of the financial records of the corporation.

ARTICLE XI - AMENDMENTS

(A) A proposal to amend the Articles of Incorporation of this corporation shall be initiated by the Board of Trustees or by a member of the Washington State School Retirees' Association or by the Executive Board of the Washington State School Retirees' Association, or by a majority of the delegates at Delegate Assembly at the Annual Convention of the Washington State School Retirees' Association. At least thirty (30) days prior to the annual meeting or any special meeting called for that purpose, the Executive Director shall notify in writing the members of all proposals to amend the Articles of Incorporation submitted by the Board of Trustees and any other proposals to amend the Articles of Incorporation of which he shall have had notice in writing at least sixty (60) days prior to the date of such meeting.

- (B) All proposals to amend the Articles of Incorporation that have been duly noticed shall be presented for a vote of the membership of the Delegate Assembly at the Annual Convention of the Washington State School Retirees' Association and, if approved by vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the delegates present, shall be adopted.
- (C) Proposals to amend these Bylaws may be made by the WSSR-Foundation Board of Trustees or the WSSRA Executive Board. Such proposals shall follow the same procedures as specified in the WSSRA Bylaws, Article XIV, Sections 2-6.

ARTICLE XII - POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

The corporation shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. No substantial part of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislators.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal Income Tax under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170 (c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

ARTICLE XIII – BORROWING MONEY

The corporation shall borrow money and evidence the same by notes, bonds, and other usual forms of security, and secure the payment of any of its obligations by mortgages or deeds of trust of its property, real and personal, and acquire by purchase, lease or other form of contract, and thereafter hold and enjoy any real and personal property that may be necessary, useful or convenient in furthering its purposes as declared in Article III of the Articles of Incorporation (Article I of these Bylaws), and lease, sell, and convey any real or personal property it may own, however it may have been acquired, but not inconsistent with the provisions of Article I hereof authorizing the acceptance and acquisition of real and personal property by gift, devise or bequest, and subject to such conditions or terms as the grantor or testator may direct or prescribe in the making of such gifts, devises or bequests.

The corporation shall make no advancement on account of services to be performed in the future, nor any loan of money or property to any Officer, Trustee, or Director of the corporation.

ARTICLE XIV – SELF-DEALING

The corporation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941 (d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent Federal Tax Law.

ARTICLE XV – EXCESS BUSINESS HOLDINGS

The corporation shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943 © of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent Federal Tax Law.

ARTICLE XVI - INVESTMENT RESTRICTION

The corporation shall not make any investments in such manner as to subject it to tax under Section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent Federal Tax Law.

ARTICLE XVII - TAXABLE EXPENDITURES

The corporation shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945 (d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent Federal Tax Law.

ARTICLE XVIII - RULES OF ORDER

Unless inconsistent with these Bylaws, the latest revision of Robert's Rules of Order shall govern all meetings of members of the corporation.

In the event of a lack of clarity, the Board of Trustees shall interpret these Bylaws.

ARTICLE XIX - DISSOLUTION AND MERGER

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed by the Board of Trustees for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future Federal Tax Law.

The Board of Trustees shall have ultimate control, shall make all decisions regarding dissolution and merger, and the membership is not entitled to vote on these subjects.

The corporation shall have the capacity to act possessed by natural persons, but shall have authority to perform only such acts as are necessary, convenient or expedient to accomplish the purposes set forth in Article III above and such as are not repugnant to law and within the meaning of Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

ARTICLE XX - COMPENSATION

The Trustees serving this corporation shall be reimbursed for reasonable expenses incurred for services rendered in the administration of this corporation.
