ACEC California Bylaws

As amended July 1, 2010

Article I. Purpose.

The purpose of the American Council of Engineering Companies of California (ACEC California) is the protection of the public interest and the general advancement of the professions of consulting engineering and land surveying.

Article II. Offices.

The principal office of ACEC California in the State of California shall be located in the greater Sacramento Metropolitan area or such other place as the Board of Directors may determine. ACEC California may have other offices within the State of California as the Board of Directors may determine.

Article III. Definitions.

- **A. Academy.** The term "Academy" shall mean a sub-organization within ACEC California created by the Board of Directors to provide special services to members with special interests in specific disciplines and market areas.
- B. ACEC. The term "ACEC" means the American Council of Engineering Companies.
- **C. Board of Directors.** The term "Board of Directors" or "Board" means the Board of Directors of ACEC California. Reference to "Board of Directors" or "Board" or "Directors" in these Bylaws also includes duly authorized "Alternate Directors."
- **D. ACEC California.** The term "ACEC California" means the American Council of Engineering Companies of California.
- **E.** Chapter. The term "Chapter" is defined in Article IV, Section B below.
- **F.** Chapter Matter. The term "Chapter matter" means issues affecting a Chapter, including but not limited to the adoption of Chapter bylaws, the election of Chapter officers and the election of members of the Board of Directors of ACEC California.
- **G. Corporate Matter.** The term "corporate matter" means actions to amend or repeal the ACEC California Bylaws or Articles of Incorporation, actions to merge or dissolve ACEC California, actions to sell or distribute substantially all of the assets of ACEC California and any other action which the Corporations Code requires be submitted to the members of a non-profit mutual benefit corporation for a vote.
- **H. Corporations Code.** The term "Corporations Code" means the Corporations Code of the State of California.

- **I. Firm.** The term "firm" shall include any business corporation, company, corporation, domestic corporation, estate, foreign corporation, foreign business corporation, sole proprietorship, joint stock company, joint venture, mutual benefit corporation or partnership.
- J. Member. The terms "Chapter," "Member Firm," "Individual Member," "Associate Member," "Affiliate Member Firm," "Life Member," "Non-Resident Member Firm" and "Honorary Member" only include members of ACEC California or ACEC California's Chapters who meet the membership criteria for the respective category as defined in these Bylaws.
- **K. Member Firm.** The term "Member Firm" is defined in Article IV, Section C below.
- **L. Other Member.** The various types of "Other Members" are defined in Article IV, Section D below.

Article IV. Membership.

- **A. Membership Types.** There shall be three types of members within ACEC California:
 - 1. Chapters, which vote on corporate matters, are defined in Section B below;
 - 2. Member Firms, which vote on Chapter matters, are defined in Section C below; and
 - 3. Other Members, which do not vote on either corporate matters or on Chapter matters, are defined in Section D below.

B. Chapter.

- A Chapter shall consist of five or more Member Firms. The Board of Directors, at its discretion, may reduce the number of firms required to comprise a Chapter for a period not to exceed one year. The Board of Directors may extend this time of reduced membership in a Chapter and may extend each extension, but no single extension may exceed one year in duration.
- 2. If a Chapter does not hold a meeting, elect officers, participate in statewide ACEC California activities and conduct any other Chapter activities for one year or longer, the Board of Directors may dissolve the Chapter, ask a neighboring Chapter or Chapters to incorporate the area of the dissolved Chapter and invite the members of the dissolved Chapter to join the neighboring Chapters.
- 3. A Chapter shall cover a defined geographic area within the state of California. The area covered by a Chapter shall not overlap the boundaries of another Chapter.
- 4. There are three primary ways in which a Chapter can affect the programs, activities and policies of ACEC California:
 - a. By voting directly as a Chapter on corporate matters;
 - b. By electing members of the Board of Directors; and

- c. By encouraging Individual Members of the Chapter to volunteer to participate in ACEC California committees, Academies and other programs.
- 5. Each Chapter shall have one vote on corporate matters.
- 6. A Chapter shall have Member Firms, Individual Members, Associate Members and Life Members.
- 7. The name of each chapter shall follow this format: "American Council of Engineering Companies of California-[local name] Chapter."

C. Member Firm.

- 1. Definition. A Member Firm of a Chapter shall be an individual firm, parent firm, branch office, division or subsidiary, which meets all of the following criteria:
 - a. The firm provides independent consulting engineering or land surveying services for clients on a fee basis, and
 - b. The firm has one or more Individual Members who is a Registered Professional Engineer or Licensed Land Surveyor in the State of California, and
 - c. The firm does not have any commercial affiliations or alliances which would create a conflict of interest with the practice of consulting engineering or land surveying, except that a firm may be a subsidiary of a parent or holding company, providing the firm is independently managed by a Registered Professional Engineer or Licensed Land Surveyor, and
 - d. The firm maintains an established office or offices for the practice of consulting engineering or land surveying within the boundaries of a Chapter. However, if a firm's office is located outside the boundaries of a Chapter, that firm may nevertheless be a Member Firm of that Chapter provided that the firm's membership is approved by both the Chapter in which the office is located and the Chapter, which the firm wishes to join.
- 2. *Voting*. When a vote is held within a Chapter on a Chapter matter or to determine how the Chapter will vote on a corporate matter, only Member Firms shall have the right to vote and each Member Firm shall have only one vote.
 - a. <u>Branch offices</u>. If an engineering or land surveying firm has more than one office, each of which is located in a separate Chapter, and each of which is a Member Firm in a separate Chapter, each such Member Firm shall have one vote in its respective Chapter.
 - b. <u>Designated Voter</u>. Each Member Firm shall designate one Individual Member to cast the Member Firm's vote on Chapter matters and corporate matters.
- **D. Other Members.** Except when serving as a Designated Voter or as a Director, Other Members shall not vote but may serve on committees or as a chair of a committee. There are six types of Other Members:
 - 1. Individual Member. An Individual Member of a Chapter shall be a management designated employee of a Member Firm. Only an Individual Member may serve as a Director or Officer of ACEC California.

- 2. Life Member. A Life Member shall be retired from the active practice of engineering and land surveying and shall have been an Individual Member for a total of at least 10 non-concurrent years in ACEC California or one of its predecessor organizations.
 - a. An Individual Member may apply for Life Membership either through a Chapter or through ACEC California.
 - b. If a Life Member reverts to the active practice of consulting engineering or land surveying, his or her Life Membership is suspended until such time as the person again meets the requirements of Life Membership.
- 3. Honorary Member. The Board of Directors may bestow the title of Honorary Member on any individual who has distinguished himself or herself by special service to or on behalf of ACEC California or who has been outstanding in furthering the ideals of consulting engineering or land surveying.
 - a. Honorary Members shall be exempt from the payment of application fees and dues.
 - b. An Honorary Member shall enjoy all the privileges of an Individual Member except for the right to vote and serve as a Director.
 - c. An Honorary Membership in ACEC California does not in itself entitle the member to any rights or privileges in ACEC or an ACEC California chapter.
- 4. Affiliate Member Firm. An "Affiliate Member Firm" shall be a firm which meets all of the following:
 - a. The firm does not furnish independent consulting engineering or land surveying services for clients on a fee basis,
 - b. The firm's business is related to the work of ACEC California member firms, and
 - c. The firm supports the goals of ACEC California.
- 5. Special Affiliate Membership. Notwithstanding Article IV, Subsection C1 and Article IV, Subsection D5 of these Bylaws, any firm which is eligible to become an ACEC California Member Firm as defined in Article IV, Subsection C1, but which is not and has not been an ACEC California Member Firm for the previous three years, may become an Affiliate Member of ACEC California for one year only, provided that that firm also joins an ACEC California Academy which has been designated by the Board of Directors to focus on the delivery of infrastructure. A one-year Special Affiliate Membership granted to a firm in accordance with this section may not be extended, renewed or repeated.
- 6. Non-Resident Member Firm. A Non-Resident Member Firm of ACEC California shall be a Member Firm of ACEC in another Member Organization, which is not eligible to be a Member Firm of a Chapter in ACEC California.

E. New Members.

 The Board of Directors may designate a new Chapter if all of the following conditions are met:

- a. The proposed new chapter meets the criteria in Article IV, Section B;
- b. The new Chapter and its Member Firms qualify under and subscribe to the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of ACEC California; and
- c. The Chapters having adjoining boundaries consent to the proposed new Chapter.
- 2. ACEC California may accept new Life Members, new Honorary Members, new Affiliate Member Firms and new Non-Resident Member Firms, which qualify under the definitions of membership stated in Article IV, Section D, and which otherwise qualify under and subscribe to the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of ACEC California.
- 3. Chapters may accept new Member Firms, new Individual Members, new Associate Members, new Affiliate Member Firms and new Life Members, which otherwise qualify under and subscribe to the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of ACEC California. A membership application on which a chapter takes no action to approve or disapprove for 45 days following receipt by the chapter of the application is deemed approved.
 - a. In addition to the membership categories defined in these Bylaws, each Chapter may create one or more other membership categories. Any person or firm accepted as a member in a Chapter created membership category shall not be a member of ACEC California or ACEC, must not otherwise be eligible to join ACEC California, may not vote on a Chapter matter or a corporate matter and may not hold office in a chapter.
- 4. When a firm, which has more than one office located in separate Chapters, is accepted as a Member Firm in one Chapter, all of the branch offices of that firm automatically become Member Firms of ACEC California. However, in order to become a Member Firm of a Chapter in which a branch office is located, each branch office shall apply for and be accepted as a Member Firm of a Chapter.
- 5. Individual Members, Associate Members and Life Members who are accepted into Chapter membership automatically become members of the same type in ACEC California. Member Firms, Individual Members, Associate Members and Life Members who are accepted into Chapter membership automatically become members of the same type in ACEC.

F. Miscellaneous.

- 1. Assignment. No membership of any type shall be assigned either voluntarily or by operation of law.
- 2. *Membership Certificates*. ACEC California may issue membership certificates for any type of membership the Board of Directors deems appropriate.
- 3. Termination. Any Chapter, Life Member, Honorary Member, Affiliate Member Firm or Non-Resident Member Firm may withdraw or resign from ACEC California and upon such resignation all future liability of such member to ACEC California shall cease. Any Member Firm, Individual Member, Affiliate Member Firm or Life Member may withdraw or resign from a Chapter and upon such resignation all future liability of such member to ACEC California and the Chapter shall cease. Liabilities to ACEC California, which exist at the time of a resignation or expulsion of any type of member from either ACEC California or a Chapter, shall continue in full force and effect. Upon resignation or expulsion from ACEC California or a Chapter, a Member

Firm, Individual Member, Life Member, Honorary Member, Affiliate Member Firm or Non-Resident Member Firm shall forfeit all rights and interests, if any, in ACEC California or in the Chapter. Upon resignation or expulsion from ACEC California or a Chapter, a Member Firm, its Individual Members and its employees may no longer participate in any group insurance plan sponsored by ACEC California or any trust affiliated with ACEC California. Upon resignation or expulsion of a Chapter from ACEC California, the Chapter shall lose all rights and interests, if any, in ACEC California.

Article V. Fees and Dues

A. Application Fees. A Chapter at its option may require that new Member Firms and New Life Members pay a one time application fee, the amount of which shall be set by the Chapter to which the new Member Firm or New Life Member applies for membership. Application fees for new Chapters, new Non-Resident Member Firms, Affiliate Member Firms and Life Members (who apply to ACEC California and not to a Chapter) shall be set by the Board of Directors.

B. Dues.

1. Member Firms. The ACEC California dues of a Member Firm for the following fiscal year shall be a Dollar Factor times an Index Number. For 2010-11 fiscal year the Dollar Factor shall be \$478. For each following year, unless the Board by a 2/3 vote of those present and voting adopts a resolution specifying otherwise for a particular fiscal year, the Dollar Factor shall automatically be adjusted to reflect the California Consumer Price Index and round off to the nearest dollar. For Member Firm's reporting 15 or more full time equivalent (FTE) employees, the Index Number shall be the Member Firm's total FTE employees as reported raised to the 1/1.75 power. For Member Firms reporting one to fourteen total FTE employees, the Index Number shall be as follows:

- a. <u>Reporting Employees</u>. Each Member Firm shall report to the ACEC California office for a four-week period in April of each year the firm's total number of FTE employees. The term "FTE employees" includes all hours of service provided by employees, contract employees, owners, principals and managers, without exceptions in all offices and locations of the firm in California, regardless of whether or not all of the offices of the firm are Member Firms of a Chapter, divided by 160.
 - (1) Hardship. Quarterly adjustments to dues payments to reflect changes in a member firm's Index Number shall only be permitted upon a presentation of sufficient evidence of a firm's "hardship" to the Executive Committee.
- b. <u>ACEC Dues</u>. Each Member Firm shall also pay dues to the American Council of Engineering Companies (ACEC). If a Member Firm of ACEC California also operates in a state other than California, that firm shall pay its multi-office ACEC dues obligation directly to ACEC. All other Member Firms shall pay their ACEC dues obligations to ACEC California. ACEC California shall forward ACEC dues received to ACEC.
- c. <u>Payments</u>. Dues shall be paid annually in advance by July 1, except that a Member Firm at its option may pay its annual dues in four equal installments at the start of each quarter. Unpaid dues shall be considered delinquent 60 days after they are due. The Board of Directors may adopt a policy which does either or both of the following: imposes a penalty for late payment, or allows a discount for dues payments promptly made.
- d. <u>New Member Firm</u>. The dues obligation of a new Member Firm shall be prorated for the remaining portion of the year.
- e. <u>PAC</u>. Except as otherwise provided in this Subsection, in addition to the dues obligation of Member Firms determined by the Board of Directors under Article V, Subsection B1 above, each Member Firm shall pay dues to the political action committee (PAC) established by ACEC California which is equal to 40% of the Member Firm's dues required under Article V, Subsection B1 above. A Member Firm may elect not to be a member of the PAC, and if a Member Firm so elects, that Member Firm's dues which would otherwise go to the PAC will go to the general revenues of ACEC California.
- 2. Other Types of Members. The Board of Directors shall determine the dues of all other types of members, except that Honorary Members shall not be required to pay dues.

- 3. Rounding. All dues shall be rounded to the nearest dollar. Each report of the number of full time equivalent employees by a Member Firm shall be rounded to the nearest whole number.
- 4. Mailing Dues. Except as provided in Article V, Subsection B1b above, each Member Firm shall send to the ACEC California office: its ACEC dues, its ACEC California dues including PAC dues, and (if its Chapter so requests) its Chapter dues. If a Chapter requests that the ACEC California office receive Chapter dues, ACEC California will receive the Chapter dues and forward such dues to the Chapter.
- **C. Assessments and Contributions.** The Board of Directors by a 2/3 vote of all Directors present and voting may levy assessments upon the Member Firms which the Board of Directors deems necessary to carry on the business and purposes of ACEC California. The Board of Directors may accept contributions on behalf of ACEC California.

Article VI. Expulsion and Suspension

- **A. Conduct.** The Board of Directors by a 2/3 vote of those Directors present and voting may expel or suspend any member of any type from ACEC California for conduct inimical to the best interests of ACEC California as determined by the Board of Directors, including, without limitation, violation of any provision of these Bylaws or failure to satisfy membership qualifications.
- **B. Non-payments.** The Board of Directors shall by majority vote adopt a policy providing for the expulsion or suspension of any member of any type from ACEC California for nonpayment of fees, dues or assessments, which policy shall specify when the procedure stated in Subsection C below shall commence.
- **C. Procedure.** The procedure specified in this subsection applies to expulsions and suspensions which are made pursuant to either Section A or B above.
 - 1. At least 15 days prior to an expulsion or suspension taking effect, ACEC California shall give the member of any type who is the subject of the proposed action written notice of the proposed expulsion or suspension, by first class mail, postage prepaid, addressed to the last address shown on the ACEC California membership records.
 - 2. The notice shall state the reasons for the proposed action and shall also state the member has an opportunity to submit a written statement in opposition to the proposed action.
 - 3. Such written statement must be received by ACEC California not less than five days prior to the effective date of the proposed expulsion or suspension.
 - 4. Prior to the effective date of the proposed action, the Executive Committee, acting on behalf of the Board of Directors, shall review any such statement submitted and shall determine the mitigating effect, if any, of the information contained therein on the proposed expulsion or suspension. Based on the new information contained in the written statement, the Executive Committee may delay the suspension or expulsion until the written statement can be reviewed by the full Board of Directors.
- **D. Chapters.** Each Chapter shall adopt a policy providing for the expulsion or suspension of Member Firms, Individual Members, Affiliate Member Firms and Life Members for failure to pay dues, fees or assessments or for conduct inimical to the best interests of

the Chapter or ACEC California, including, without limitation, violation of any provision of these Bylaws or failure to satisfy membership qualifications.

E. Voting Rights and Dues. A Member Firm whose membership is suspended by ACEC California or a Chapter shall not be entitled to exercise any voting rights set forth in these Bylaws. An expelled member of any type shall be entitled to the return of the expelled member's unused, prorated dues as of the effective date of the expulsion, minus all financial obligations which the member has to ACEC California, ACEC or the Chapter.

F. Concurrent Expulsions and Suspensions.

- If ACEC California suspends or expels a member of any type, that suspension or expulsion shall automatically also apply to any Chapter membership which the expelled or suspended member may have. If a Chapter suspends or expels a member of any type, that suspension or expulsion shall automatically also apply to any ACEC California membership which the expelled or suspended member may have.
- 2. If ACEC California or a Chapter suspends or expels a Member Firm, that suspension or expulsion shall automatically also apply to each Individual Member who is a principal in that Member Firm.

Article VII. Board of Directors

A. Designation, Number and Qualification of Directors.

1. Chapters. The Member Firms of each Chapter shall elect up to the following number of Individual Members of the Chapter to serve on the Board of Directors:

- a. For the purposes of this Subsection the number of Directors to which a Chapter is entitled shall be determined on April 1 of the preceding year and shall not be altered for the remainder of the fiscal year.
- b. At least fifty per cent of a Chapter's Directors shall hold either a Professional Engineer's registration or a Professional Land Surveyor's license or a Geologist's registration in the state of California.

- 2. Academies. Each Academy shall elect one person who is not otherwise a Director to be a member of the Board of Directors.
- 3. Alternate Directors. Each Chapter and Academy may appoint as many Alternate Directors as the Chapter or Academy deems necessary. If a Director who represents a Chapter or an Academy is unable to attend a meeting of the Board of Directors, an Alternate Director appointed by that Chapter or Academy may attend the meeting in lieu of the Director and at the meeting exercise the full voting rights of a Director. Either prior to or at the Board meeting, the Chapter shall notify ACEC California that an Alternate Director will attend the Board meeting in lieu of the Director.
- 4. Officers. The Officers of ACEC California, including the President, President-Elect, Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer, the Immediate Past President and ACEC Director shall also be ex-officio Directors of ACEC California and shall have the right to vote. The Board of Directors may provide that the same person may fill more than one office, provided, however, that a person holding more than one office shall have only one vote.
- 5. *Qualification*. Only Individual Members of ACEC California may serve as a Director on the Board of Directors.
- 6. *Honorary Directors*. At its discretion the Board of Directors may elect a former President to the position of Honorary Director who will have the privilege of the floor but no right to vote.
- **B. Powers.** Subject to the limitations of these Bylaws and of the Corporations Code relating to action required to be approved by the members or by a majority of the members of a nonprofit mutual benefit corporation, the activities and affairs of ACEC California shall be conducted and all corporate powers shall be exercised by or under the direction of the Board of Directors. As provided in Corporations Code §7210, the Board of Directors may delegate the management of the activities of ACEC California to any person or persons, a management company, or committees however composed, provided that the activities and affairs of ACEC California shall be managed and all corporate powers shall be exercised under the ultimate direction of the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors may employ an attorney at law or such other professional or expert assistants as the Board may deem necessary.
 - 1. Voting. Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, the Board of Directors shall take action by majority vote of those Directors who are present and voting.
 - 2. Indemnification. To the extent permitted by law the Board of Directors may provide for indemnification by ACEC California of any and all of its current or former Officers, Directors, staff or committee members against expenses actually and necessarily incurred by them in connection with the defense of any action, suit, or proceeding, in which they or any of them are made parties, or a party, by reason of having been an Officer, Director, staff or committee member, except in relation to matters as to which such individuals shall be adjudged in such action, suit, or proceeding to be liable for negligence or misconduct in the performance of duty and to matters as shall be settled by agreement predicated on the existence of such liability for negligence or misconduct.

C. Terms of Office.

1. The term of office of each Director shall be three years except that:

- a. To the extent practical each chapter shall stagger the terms of office of its Directors.
- b. Directors who serve as Directors by virtue of being an officer of ACEC California shall serve for terms to coincide with the office held.
- c. Each Academy shall set the term of office of the Director elected by the Academy.
- 2. At least four weeks prior to the Annual Board Meeting, each Chapter and each Academy shall notify the Secretary of ACEC California of the names of its designated Director(s) for the ensuing year.
- 3. Each Director shall serve for the term specified in this Article, unless that Director resigns, or unless that Director ceases to be an Individual Member of a Chapter for any reason, or unless that Director is removed from office in accordance with the provisions of §7221, §7222 and §7223 of the Corporations Code.
- **D. Vacancies.** Whenever a vacancy in the Board of Directors occurs, the vacancy shall be filled by the Chapter or Academy from which the vacancy occurred at its next regular meeting. If an officer's office becomes vacant, the Board of Directors shall fill the vacancy at its next regular meeting.
- E. Transactions with ACEC California. A contract or other transaction between ACEC California and (1) one or more of its Directors, or (2) another corporation, firm or association in which one or more of the Directors has a material financial interest, or (3) another corporation where the Director serves on the Board of Directors of both corporations, is not void or voidable if (a) the material facts as to the transaction and as to such Director's interest or other directorship are fully disclosed to the Board of Directors, and (b) the Board of Directors authorizes, approves or ratifies the contract or transaction in good faith by a vote sufficient without counting the vote of the Director. In the case of an interested Director, the contract or transaction which is authorized, approved or ratified, must be just and reasonable as to ACEC California. ACEC California shall not make any loan of money or property to or guarantee the obligation of any person, unless the loan or guarantee is adequately secured, and approved by a majority of all the Chapters. However, ACEC California may lend money to, or quarantee any obligation of, or otherwise assist any Officer or employee pursuant to an employee benefit plan, when the Board of Directors determines that ACEC California will benefit from such assistance. If such plan includes Officers or Directors, then it must be approved by the Chapters. In addition, ACEC California may advance money to Officers and Directors for reasonably anticipated expenses for which they are entitled to reimbursement from ACEC California.

F. Meetings of Directors.

- 1. Annual Board Meeting. There shall be an annual meeting of the Board of Directors. At this meeting the Board of Directors shall convene, transact all necessary business, install incoming Directors, and organize the Board for the ensuing year. The Board of Directors shall thereafter take such actions as the Board shall determine.
- 2. Other Meetings. The Board of Directors shall meet three other times per year and shall also meet at the call of the President or at the request of 25% of the Directors. Notice of each meeting shall be mailed, faxed, emailed or telephoned to each Director at least four days before the time of said meeting.
- 3. *Quorum*. A quorum shall consist of 60% of the total Directors, excluding Honorary Directors.
- 4. *Voting*. At the direction of the President, voting may be by simple voice vote or by a show of hands. Election of officers may be by secret ballot. Each Director shall have one vote. Matters shall be passed by a majority of those present and voting, except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws.
- 5. Rules of Order. Except as may be otherwise stated in these Bylaws, Roberts Rules of Order, revised, shall govern the conduct of meetings and business of ACEC California.
- G. Executive Director. The Board of Directors shall have the power to retain on behalf of and at the expense of ACEC California an Executive Director to represent and serve the members of ACEC California. The Executive Director shall be the chief staff executive of ACEC California and an ex-officio member of each ACEC California committee. The Executive Director shall have administrative responsibility for the management of the business of ACEC California in all its dealings, shall be an ex-officio member of the Board of Directors without the right to vote and shall be at all times subject to the control of the Board of Directors of ACEC California or the Executive Committee acting on behalf of the Board of Directors. He or she shall receive such salary or compensation as approved by the Executive Committee. The Executive Director shall assume such duties of the Officers as the Board of Directors may assign.
- H. Fees and Compensation of Directors. Directors shall serve ACEC California without compensation for their services. Chapters may wholly or partially reimburse Directors for their reasonable travel and related expenses incurred while serving as Directors. ACEC California may reimburse an Officer for service as a Director for reasonable travel and related expenses incurred while acting in ACEC California's interest.

Article VIII. Officers

- A. Election of Officers. The President-Elect, Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer and ACEC Director of ACEC California shall be elected by the Board of Directors. The President and Immediate Past President shall take office without a vote of the Board of Directors at the end of their terms of office as respectively President-Elect and President.
 - 1. Qualifications. Each Officer shall be an Individual Member who has served as a Director or as chair of a committee of ACEC California.

- 2. Nominating Committee. At a Board meeting preceding the Board's Annual meeting, a Nominating Committee shall recommend persons to the Board to serve as President-Elect, Vice President and Secretary-Treasurer. When needed, the Nominating Committee shall also recommend a person to serve as ACEC Director. The Nominating Committee shall consist of the President-Elect, the President, the Immediate Past President and the two preceding Past Presidents and may also include one or two additional Past Presidents appointed by the President.
- 3. Nominations from the Floor. Any member of the Board may nominate persons to serve as President-Elect, Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer and ACEC Director who qualify under the provisions of Article VIII, Subsection A1.
- 4. *Installation*. The officers may be installed at the Annual Board Meeting or at a preceding Board meeting.
- 5. *Terms of Office*. The terms of office for Officers shall be one year except that the term of office for the ACEC Director shall be two years.
- **B. President.** The President shall be the chief executive officer of ACEC California and has, subject to the control of the Board of Directors, general supervision, direction and control of the business and Officers of ACEC California. The President shall preside at all Board meetings and shall, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors, appoint all ACEC California committees and assign ACEC California business to them.
- C. President-Elect and Vice President. In the absence of the President or in the event of his or her disability, inability or refusal to act, the President-Elect or the Vice President (in that order) shall perform all the duties of the President and, when so acting shall have all of the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the President. The President-Elect and Vice President shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to them by the President or by the Board of Directors.
- D. Secretary-Treasurer. The Secretary-Treasurer shall or shall cause: that due notice of Board of Directors meetings be given, that minutes be taken, including the names of those present, that records and account books as the Board of Directors may require be kept, that appropriate custody of the funds and securities of ACEC California be kept, that accurate accounts and vouchers of receipts and disbursements be kept, that all ACEC California monies and other valuables be deposited in the name and to the credit of ACEC California, that the funds of ACEC California only be disbursed in accordance with the directions of the Board of Directors, that an account of all transactions be rendered to the President and the Directors, whenever they may request it, and that regular reports on the financial condition of ACEC California be rendered to the Board of Directors. The Secretary-Treasurer shall also have such other powers and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors.
- **E. ACEC Director.** The Board of Directors shall elect an ACEC Director who shall be a Past President of ACEC California and may elect an Officer or a Past President to serve as an Alternate ACEC Director.
- **F. Executive Committee.** The President, President-Elect, Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer, Immediate Past President and ACEC Director shall constitute the Executive Committee of ACEC California and shall undertake the duties assigned to it by the Board of Directors. The Executive Committee shall present its actions to the Board of Directors for review by the Board.

G. Compensation of Officers. Officers shall serve ACEC California without compensation for their services. However, as determined by the Board of Directors, ACEC California may reimburse any Officer for reasonable travel and related expenses incurred while acting in ACEC California's interest.

Article IX. Academies and Committees

- **A. Academies.** The mission of the Academies shall be to promote collaboration, communication and cooperation within the disciplines and market areas of consulting engineering and land surveying. The Board of Directors may create such Academies as the Board deems necessary. Member Firms which have an interest in and a commitment to participate in the programs and activities of an Academy are eligible to join that Academy.
 - Each Academy shall prepare a "Statement of Purpose and Organization." The Statement must be approved by a majority of the Member Firms who have joined the Academy and by the Board of Directors. Any imposition of special dues or assessments on the members of an Academy requires the approval of 2/3 of the members of that Academy and the approval of the Executive Committee. At a minimum each such Statement shall:
 - a. Describe the business and professional interests and level of commitment of Academy members,
 - b. State the requirements for membership in the Academy,
 - State the method of election and the terms of office of the Chair, the Director representing the Academy and such other offices as the Academy wishes to create,
 - d. State any special dues or assessments which the Academy wishes to impose on its members, and
 - e. Describe the primary programs and activities of the Academy.
 - 2. To the extent the following activities are authorized by an Academy's Statement of Purpose and Organization and are consistent with these Bylaws, each Academy may:
 - a. Sponsor educational programs and activities,
 - b. Hold meetings, seminars and workshops,
 - c. Prepare pamphlets, manuals and other publications,
 - d. Create forums for the exchange of information,
 - e. Sponsor programs at ACEC California's Annual Conference.
 - f. Submit articles for publication in the ACEC California newsletter,
 - g. Form subcommittees,

- h. Form parallel organizations either at the Chapter level or in a region encompassing the area of two or more Chapters,
- i. Elect a chair, other officers and a Director to serve on the Board of Directors,
- j. Impose special dues and assessments on their members,
- k. Accept voluntary contributions,
- I. Accept Affiliate Members as that term is defined in Article IV, Subsection D5, and
- m. Develop and carry out other programs and activities which further the mission and purposes of the Academy.
- 3. Each Academy shall cooperate with other Academies and with ACEC California Committees to share information, pursue mutual goals, avoid unnecessary duplication, avoid timing conflicts and provide the maximum benefits to the widest number of ACEC California members.
- 4. As provided in Corporations Code §7210, the Board of Directors may delegate the management of programs and activities to an Academy, provided that the programs and activities shall be managed and all corporate powers shall be exercised under the ultimate direction of the Board of Directors.
- 5. Electrical and mechanical engineering firms which otherwise qualify for ACEC California membership may join ACEC California by joining the Academy of Mechanical and Electrical Engineers. Such firms may also belong to an existing Chapter. In addition to the regular ACEC California and ACEC dues the Academy shall charge its members dues for the purpose of reimbursing the ACEC California general fund for services rendered.
- **B. Committees.** In addition to the Nominating and Executive Committees which are provided for in these Bylaws, the Board of Directors may create such standing or special committees as the Board deems necessary.

Article X. Annual Membership Meeting

- **A. Board's Duty.** The Board of Directors shall arrange for an annual meeting of the Chapters and their respective Individual Members unless there is compliance with Corporations Code §7513, relating to taking action without a meeting. At the annual meeting the Board of Directors may make a report to the Chapters.
- **B. Notice.** Whenever Chapters are required or permitted to take an action at a meeting, notice of the meeting shall be delivered to or mailed not less than 10 or more than 90 days before the date of the meeting, provided, however, that if the notice is not mailed by first class, registered or certified mail, the notice shall be given not less than 20 days before the meeting. The notice shall specify the place, date and time of the meeting, and those matters the Board of Directors intends to present for action by the Chapters.

Article XI. Financial Matters

- **A. Annual Budget.** The Executive Committee shall recommend and the Board of Directors shall adopt an annual budget.
- **B.** Annual Financial Report. ACEC California shall contract with an independent certified public accountant to conduct an annual audit of ACEC California's financial transactions. Each year a copy of the annual audit report shall be sent promptly to each Director and upon written request shall be sent to any other member. ACEC California shall also make available to any member who requests in writing a copy of: (1) a statement of the place where the name and addresses of the current members of ACEC California may be found, and (2) if applicable, a statement required by Corporations Code §8322(a) relating to insider transactions. Each year ACEC California shall notify each member of ACEC California of his or her right to receive a copy of the audit report.
- **C. Quarterly Financial Report.** A quarterly financial report shall be prepared. Copies of this report shall be sent to each Director and to each member who submits a written request.
- **D. Bonded Officers and Employees.** Any officer or employee handling money on account of ACEC California shall, at the option of the Board of Directors, be bonded in such amount as may be determined by the Board, at the expense of ACEC California.
- **E. Fiscal Year.** ACEC California's fiscal year shall be from July 1 to the following June 30.
- **F. Dissolution.** In the event of a dissolution of ACEC California, all assets, gains or profits thereof, shall be distributed pro rata to each Chapter on the basis of the ACEC California dues paid into ACEC California by the Member Firms of each respective Chapter for one year preceding the date of dissolution.

Article XII. Name and Logo

A. Name and Logo. Members of ACEC California in good standing may use the corporation name and logo on their stationery, cards, advertising matter, office doors, firm signs and equipment for the purpose of displaying their membership in ACEC California. The name, abbreviation or logo of ACEC California or of any group or organization affiliated with ACEC California (including but not limited to ACEC California's Chapters, Academies, committees, trusts and foundations) may not be imprinted upon drawings, reports, specifications, calculations, or other instruments of service prepared or used by a member. Any use of the name, abbreviation or logo of ACEC California or of any group or organization affiliated with ACEC California may only be used to signify membership in ACEC California or in a group or organization affiliated with ACEC California and may not be used in any manner that could reasonably suggest that the member of any type in any way represents or is ACEC California.

Article XIII. Bylaws Amendments

- **A. Vote Requirements.** These Bylaws shall be adopted, amended or repealed by a majority vote of the Directors at any regular or special meeting and ratified by approval of 60% of the Chapters.
- **B. Board Member's Duty.** Following the approval of a Bylaws change by the Board, each Board member shall promptly present the proposed change to that member's Chapter and shall urge that Chapter to act promptly on the proposed amendment.
- **C. Chapter Duty.** Following the approval of a Bylaws change by the Board of Directors, each Chapter shall promptly do each of the following:
 - 1. Circulate the proposed Bylaws change among its members,
 - 2. Discuss the proposed Bylaws change,
 - 3. Call for a vote on the proposed Bylaws change by the Member Firms in the Chapter at the earliest practical time, and
 - 4. Promptly inform the ACEC California office in writing of the results of the vote.
- **D. Time Limit.** If 60% of the chapters ratify the action of the Board of Directors within six months of the Board of Directors' action, the change shall be deemed ratified.
