### Note 1 - Nature of Activities and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### **Nature of Activities**

Mid-Valley Rehabilitation, Inc. is organized to provide ongoing programs of activities to assist in the rehabilitation of people with disabilities in Yamhill, Polk, Marion, and Washington Counties, Oregon. These activities include the production and sale of pallets and other wood products and soap products, as well as packaging services. The Organization also offers day activity programs, employment counseling and a residential program for people with severe disabilities. Its major sources of revenue are the sale of wood products, soap, and industrial services, as well as service fee contracts from state agencies and fees to clients' families. Mid-Valley Rehabilitation, Inc. opened the Serendipity Ice Cream Shop in October 2000. The ice cream shop, along with other employment enclaves at Yamhill County businesses, provides vocational opportunities for clients of the Mid-Valley Rehabilitation, Inc. MV, LLC owns and operates an apartment building which has been redesigned to house disabled individuals. In October 2004 it acquired an additional complex that is also filled with Mid-Valley clients and houses the supported living staff offices. Mid-Valley Charitable Fund, Inc. was established to raise funds to support the programs of Mid-Valley Rehabilitation, Inc. and other organizations that serve people with disabilities.

#### **Financial Statement Presentation**

The Organization presents its financial statements in accordance with Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, "Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations" as codified in FASB ASC Topic 958. Therefore, the Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets (unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets) based upon the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions. The Organization has also adopted SFAS No. 116, "Accounting for Contributions Received and Contributions Made" as codified in FASB ASC Topic 958. Contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support, depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions.

#### **Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The significant accounting policies followed by the Organization are described below to enhance the usefulness of the consolidated financial statements to the reader.

<u>Principles of Consolidation</u> – The accompanying consolidated financial statements include the accounts of Mid-Valley Rehabilitation, Inc. and the following subsidiaries:

- MV, LLC, of which Mid-Valley Rehabilitation, Inc. is the only member
- Mid-Valley Charitable Fund, Inc., in which Mid-Valley Rehabilitation, Inc. has an economic interest and a controlling interest

All significant intercompany accounts and transactions have been eliminated.

### Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements June 30, 2010

### Note 1 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies - Continued

<u>Basis of Presentation</u> – Net assets and all balances and transactions are presented based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions. Accordingly, the net assets of the organization and changes therein are classified and reported as follows:

Unrestricted net assets – Net assets not subject to donor-imposed stipulations.

Temporarily restricted net assets – Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that will be met either by actions of the Organization and/or the passage of time.

Expenses are reported as decreases in unrestricted net assets. Gains and losses on investments and other assets or liabilities are reported as increases or decreases in unrestricted net assets unless their use is restricted by explicit donor stipulation or by law. Expirations of temporary restrictions on net assets. (i.e., the donor-stipulated purpose has been fulfilled and/or the stipulated time period has elapsed) are reported as net assets released from restrictions.

<u>Use of Estimates</u> - The preparation of consolidated financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of consolidated financial statements. Estimates also affect the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from these estimates. The significant estimates in the Organization's financial statements are the allowance for doubtful accounts and the methods and useful lives for depreciation of property and equipment.

<u>Cash Equivalents</u> - The Organization considers all highly liquid debt instruments with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

<u>Investments</u> – Investments are carried at fair value and consist of equity mutual funds and fixed income mutual funds. Fair values of investments are provided by independent investment brokers using mutual fund pricing services. Interests in split-interest agreements are invested similarly. Details in Note 3 include assumptions used in the actuarial calculations.

Accounts Receivable and Allowance for Doubtful Accounts – The Organization's accounts receivable relate to product sales and services. Receivables are considered delinquent after 90 days unless contractual terms extend the collection period beyond that date. The Organization had four accounts that were considered delinquent at June 30, 2010 and none at June 30, 2009. The delinquent customers are making payments on amount overdue. Bad Debt expense of \$8,140 was incurred at June 30, 2010. Before this year, no bad debts had been incurred since 2002, so an allowance for doubtful accounts of approximately 1% of accounts receivable is deemed adequate.

<u>Inventories</u> – Raw materials inventories are stated at lower of cost or market, determined on a first-in, first-out basis. Finished goods inventories are stated at retail less profit margin rate which has been computed based on historical operating results. Inventories of Serendipity Ice Cream and i catching signs are immaterial, so they are charged to cost of sales at the time of purchase.

<u>Deferred Revenue</u> – Amounts received in advance on exchange contracts are recorded as deferred revenue until the contract amounts have been earned.

### Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements June 30, 2010

### Note 1 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies - Continued

<u>Property, Equipment, and Leasehold Improvements</u> – Property, equipment, and leasehold improvements are recorded at cost or estimated fair value at date of donation. The Organization typically capitalizes items costing \$1,000 or more. Depreciation and amortization have been computed using the straight-line method over the following estimated useful lives:

Buildings	5-60 years
Furniture and equipment	3-10 years
Vehicles	3-10 years
Leasehold improvements	5 years

Contribution Recognition — Contributions, which include unconditional promises to give, are recognized as revenues in the period received. Conditional promises to give are not recognized until they become unconditional, that is, when conditions on which they depend are substantially met. The Organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. The Organization reports gifts of property and equipment as unrestricted support unless explicit donor stipulations specify how the donated assets must be used. Gifts of long-lived assets with explicit restrictions that specify how the assets are to be used and gifts of cash or other assets that must be used to acquire long-lived assets are reported as restricted support. Absent explicit donor stipulations about how long those long-lived assets must be maintained, the Organization reports expirations of donor restrictions when the donated or acquired long-lived assets are placed in service.

<u>Donated Services</u> – The Organization recognizes donated services that create or enhance nonfinancial assets or that require specialized skills, are provided by individuals possessing those skills, and would typically need to be purchased if not provided by donation. Donated Services have not been reflected in the accompanying consolidated financial statements since the appropriate criteria for recording these services have not been met. Nevertheless, a substantial number of volunteers have donated significant amounts of their time to the Organization's program services.

<u>Income Taxes</u> – There is no provision for income taxes in the consolidated financial statements since the Organization is exempt from federal and state income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and similar state provisions. The Organization is not classified as a private foundation. It has not engaged in any unrelated business or political activities that would subject it to income taxes nor any prohibited transactions that would jeopardize its tax exempt status.

<u>Tax Sheltered Annuity Plan</u> – The Organization has a 403(b) Tax Sheltered Annuity (TSA) plan for all eligible employees. The Organization did not make any contributions to the Plan for the year ended June 30, 2010.

<u>Retirement Plan</u> – The Organization has a retirement plan under IRC Sec. 401(a). For the year ended June 30, 2010, the Organization contributed \$52,128 to this plan on behalf of all eligible employees.

<u>Functional Allocation of Expenses</u> – Costs of providing various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the consolidated statement of functional expenses. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefits.

### Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements June 30, 2010

### Note 1 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies - Continued

Advertising – Advertising costs are charged to expense as incurred in accordance with FASB ASC 720-35-05-01. The Organization does not utilize direct-response advertising, which would be capitalized as an asset.

<u>Financial Instruments and Concentrations</u> – Financial instruments which potentially subject the Organization to concentration of credit risk consist primarily of cash, bank certificates of deposit, receivables, marketable securities, equity and pooled income funds, split-interest agreements, trade payables, and notes payable. Concentration with respect to cash is limited due to the Organization maintaining cash balances that are generally fully insured by the FDIC. Concentrations of credit risk related to receivables are caused by the limited customer base in a small geographical area. No financial instruments are available for sale or held for trading purposes.

<u>Subsequent Events</u> through August 27, 2010 have been evaluated by management for disclosure in the financial statements. This is the date when the financial statements were available for issuance.

FASB Codification - On July 1, 2009, the Financial Accounting Standards Board's Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) became the single source of authoritative nongovernmental U.S. accounting principles. Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 168 (codified in ASC 105-10-05) is a major restructuring of accounting and reporting standards. The primary goal is to simplify user access to all authoritative U.S. accounting principles by providing all the authoritative literature related to a given topic in one place. New standards will not bear sequential numbers as in the past. Instead, they will update the ASC and provide the historical basis for conclusions of a new standard. The ASC is organized into four general topics, each containing subtopics and sections. The four general topics are:

\* Presentation

- \* Financial statement accounts
- \* Broad transactions
- \* Special industries

A new referencing approach reflecting this nature is used in the Organization's Notes to Financial Statements.

Fair Value Disclosures – Since June 30, 2009 the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) has released three Accounting Standards Updates (ASU) related to fair values found in the FASB Accounting Standards Codification (FASB ASC) Topic 820. These clarify and enhance the disclosures in Note 11 that the Organization adopted in the year ended June 30, 2009. ASU No. 2009-05 addresses the fair value measurement of liabilities. When measuring the fair value of a liability, and a quoted price in an active market for an identical liability is not available, the reporting entity must use one or more of the following methods to determine the fair value:

- 1. A valuation technique that uses:
  - a. The quoted price of the identical liability when traded as an asset
  - b. Quoted prices for similar liabilities or "similar liabilities when traded as assets"
- 2. Another valuation technique that is consistent with the principles of Topic 820

The Organization's fair value measurements use the first technique.

ASU No. 2009-12 covers fair value measurements of investments in entities with pooled assets that do not have readily determinable fair values such as real estate funds. The Organization does not typically invest in this type of asset. In January 2010, the FASB released ASU 2010-06, *Improving Disclosures about Fair Value Measurements*, which further enhances the disclosures that need to be made in financial statements beginning with the Organization's 2010-11 fiscal year.

#### Note 1 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies – Continued

Mergers and Acquisitions - ASU No. 2010-07 was issued to add Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 164 Not-For-Profit Entities: Mergers and Acquisitions to Topic 958 of the Accounting Standards Codification. It specifies two methods of accounting for combinations of not-for-profit Organizations. It applies only if the Organization joins forces with any other not-for-profit agency in the future.

#### Note 2 - Cash and Cash Equivalents

At June 30, 2010, cash and cash equivalents include interest-bearing bank deposits of \$180,561 in excess of federally insured limits of \$250,000 per customer relationship pursuant to the Economic Stabilization Act of 2008. This temporary limit was made permanent on July 21, 2010 by the Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act. All non-interest bearing transaction accounts are insured by the FDIC without limit. \$12,625 of cash equivalents are designated for capital projects.

Under the trust agreement, the Charitable Fund makes annual payments to various beneficiaries in accordance with terms specified in the trust. The payment streams have been discounted to present value using an interest rate of 8% and result in a liability from the Charitable Fund of \$7,400 at June 30, 2010. Once the payments to the beneficiaries are satisfied in December 2010, any remaining assets will be distributed to the Charitable Fund.

#### Note 5 - Receivable Under Split-Interest Agreement

The Charitable Fund has a remainder interest in two unitrusts established by Paul A. Barber; however, the Charitable Fund does not hold the assets or act as trustee. Upon the death of the income beneficiary, the Charitable Fund will receive a portion of each trust's remaining assets. The assets of the trust are included in investment pools held by the trustees. The Charitable Fund's interest in the trusts has been discounted to present value over the life expectancy of the income beneficiary using a 8.2% discount rate applied to the market values of the pooled investments as supplied by the trustees' investment advisors. All of the investments are held in publicly traded equity and fixed income mutual funds with market values that are published daily. Total property & equipment at June 30, 2010 and 2009 includes \$2,494,323 and \$2,483,189 of items that were funded by grants or donations, rather than operations. Land was acquired in the year ended June 30, 2007 for the purpose of constructing two group homes in McMinnville. The land acquisition was funded by a loan from First Federal Savings & Loan Association of McMinnville (see Note 6) and contributions from donors. Construction in 2008 and 2009 was partially funded by grants from the state of Oregon and private foundations. The state grants are contingent upon a restriction on the use of the facilities for group homes for a minimum of ten years. A change in use or disposition of the facilities would require repayment of the grants or cause foreclosure of the property. Capitalized costs including loan fees, construction period interest and insurance totaled \$704,914. Residents moved into these homes in January 2009. An additional group home was constructed in the Cherry Heights subdivision of Dallas and placed in service in June 2009 at a total cost of \$307,257 including the land. This purchase was funded by a no-payment loan from the Oregon State Dept of Human Services and a commercial real estate loan from First Federal Savings & Loan Association of McMinnville (Note 6).

On August 13, 2009, the Evans Street group home was sold for \$163,000. A related note in the amount of \$145,436 at June 30, 2009 was paid off at closing. The Evans Street home included \$21,350 of land and \$78,648 of building cost in the above totals.

The Organization uses transportation equipment that is substantially owned by the Yamhill County Area Transit District and purchased with Oregon Department of Transportation grants. The Organization's cost in such equipment is 10.27% of the purchase price.

Mid-Valley Rehabilitation, Inc. has debt payable to its subsidiary, Mid-Valley Charitable Fund, Inc. in the following amounts and terms. Such debt was used to finance the purchase of property and equipment for operations. The debt and related interest payments are eliminated in the consolidating process. Note payable in monthly installments of \$1,949 including interest at 6 percent per annum, due November, 2029, collateralized by property. The balance at June 30, 2010 is \$267,796.

#### Note 9 - Contingencies and Subsequent Events

Amounts received from various contracting agencies are subject to audit and potential adjustment by the contracting agencies. Any disallowed claims, including amounts already collected, would become a liability of the Organization if so determined in the future. It is management's belief that no material amounts received will be required to be returned in the future for which a provision has not already been made.

Subsequent to June 30, 2010 the Organization received an offer from a board member for a line of credit to assist with short-term cash flow. Management has not yet acted on the offer that would be subject to the applicable federal interest rate specified by the Internal Revenue Service.

Management was notified of the likelihood of additional cuts in funding from state funded mental health programs. As a result, management is analyzing the Organization's various cost centers in anticipation of necessary cuts in services and/or a reduction in force.

The Organization is a defendant in an employment practices claim brought by a former employee. The outcome of the litigation is not known at this time. However, the claim is within the limits of the Organization's liability insurance coverage.

#### Note 12 - Fair Values of Financial Instruments

Using the provisions of FASB ASC Topic 820, the Organization has characterized its investments in securities, based on the priority of the inputs used to value the investments, into a three-level fair value hierarchy. The fair value hierarchy gives the highest priority to quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1), and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). If the inputs used to measure the investments fall within different levels of the hierarchy, the categorization is based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement of the investment.

Investments recorded in the Statement of Financial Position are categorized based on the inputs to valuation techniques as follows:

- Level 1. These are investments where values are based on unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets in an active market the Organization has the ability to access. These investments are exchange-traded investments in equity securities.
- Level 2. These are investments where values are based on quoted prices in markets that are not active or model inputs that are observable either directly or indirectly for substantially the full term of the investments. These investments are comprised of corporate and municipal bonds that trade infrequently.
- Level 3. These are investments where values are based on prices or valuation techniques that require inputs that are both unobservable and significant to the overall fair value measurement. These inputs reflect assumptions of management about assumptions market participants would use in pricing the investments. These investments are certain private equity investments.
