THE COLBURN SCHOOL (THE "SCHOOL") IS A CALIFORNIA NOT-FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATION OFFERING INSTRUCTION IN THE PERFORMING ARTS FOR STUDENTS OF ALL AGES AND COMMUNITY SERVICE PROGRAMS WHICH BRING MUSIC TO UNDER-SERVED CHILDREN IN INNER-CITY SCHOOLS. THE SCHOOL OF PERFORMING ARTS WAS ORGANIZED IN 1950 AND OFFERS CLASSES, LESSONS AND WORKSHOPS IN MUSIC, DANCE, AND DRAMA TO APPROXIMATELY 1,700 STUDENTS RANGING IN AGE FROM TODDLER TO ADULT. THE CONSERVATORY OF MUSIC BEGAN IN 2003 WHEN THE SCHOOL WAS APPROVED BY THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA BUREAU FOR PRIVATE POST SECONDARY AND VOCATIONAL EDUCATION TO OPERATE PROFFESIONAL LEVEL MUSIC STUDIES PROGRAMS. CONSERVATORY PROGRAMS ARE AWARDED AT NO CHARGE TO QUALIFIED STUDENTS PURSUING THE HIGHEST LEVELS OF CLASSICAL MUSIC PERFORMANCE TRAINING. CONSERVATORY PROGRAMS RANGE FROM TWO TO FOUR YEARS IN LENGTH AND RESULT IN EITHER A BACHELOR OF MUSIC DEGREE, PERFORMANCE DIPLOMA, ARTIST'S DIPLOMA OR A PROFESSIONAL STUDIES CERTIFICATE. THE CONSERVATORY HAD OVER 110 E

 THE COLBURN SCHOOL HAS TWO DISTINCT DIVISIONS THE SCHOOL OF PERFORMING ARTS AND THE CONSERVATORY OF MUSIC. THEY EMBRACE A SINGLE VISION OF ACCESS AND EXCELLENCE. THEY ALSO SUPPORT A SINGLE MISSION TO PROVIDE THE HIGHEST QUALITY PERFORMING ARTS EDUCATION BY AN OUTSTANDING FACULTY IN AN OPTIMAL ENVIRONMENT. IN BOTH DIVISIONS, THE PRIMARY FOCUS IS ON CLASSICAL MUSIC WITH AN EMPHASIS ON PERFORMANCE. THE SCHOOL OF PERFORMING ARTS ("CSPA") HAS PROGRAMS IN EARLY CHILDHOOD, MUSIC, DANCE AND DRAMA. THE SCHOOL ALSO SPONSORS SEVERAL COMMUNITY SERVICE PROGRAMS WHICH BRING MUSIC TO CHILDREN IN A NUMBER OF LOCAL AND INNER-CITY SCHOOLS. THERE ARE 1,700 STUDENTS OF ALL AGES ENROLLED IN CSPA. THE CONSERVATORY OF MUSIC OFFERS A BACHELOR OF MUSIC DEGREE, ARTIST DIPLOMA, PERFORMANCE DIPLOMA AND PROFESSIONAL STUDIES CERTIFICATE ACCREDITED BY THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF SCHOOLS OF MUSIC. THERE ARE PRESENTLY 116 STUDENTS IN THIS DIVISION.
