Grant Policies

The Towbes Foundation was organized in August of 1980 as a California non-operating private foundation. It has received determination letters confirming its tax-exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and under Section 23701d of the California Revenue and Taxation Code.

PRESENT AREAS OF PRIMARY INTEREST TO THE FOUNDATION ARE:

- b. Medical research, especially in the area of neurological disease;
 - c. Promotion of the performing arts; and
- d. Promotion and preservation of the free enterprise system.

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES RE GRANT REQUESTS:

The Towbes Foundation prefers to award grants to organizations whose objective(s) parallel the areas of primary interest set forth above.

In establishing grant-making priorities, the Towbes Foundation prefers to initiate grant requests and relies heavily upon its Board of Directors, consultants, and advisers to provide the necessary input to identify those philanthropic needs which most relate to these areas of primary interest to the Foundation.

To be considered, applicants must provide evidence of current state and IRS SO1(c)(3) tax-exempt status. Proposals must be submitted in writing (six copies) prior to April 1 of the year for which funding is sought and should set forth:

- 1. Full name, address and business telephone number of applicant
- 2. Statement of applicant's general charitable purposes, operating history, and experience of applicant's management
- 3. Names and addresses of applicant's Board of Directors, officers, and executive director:
- 4. Specific description of project for which grant is requested, including:
 - (a) amount requested.
 - (b) purpose of expenditure
 - (c) administrator of expenditures
 - (d) purpose and results expected
 - (e) duration of project
 - (f) other funding (amounts and sources)
 - 5. Last three years' financial statements
 - 6. Names of past major donors
- 7. Identity of other grantors contacted or to be contacted (including amounts requested from each) for this project.
