The Foundation makes various awards to deserving participants by inviting applications from eligible persons in the community and the winners of the awards are decided by a committee appointed by the President.

Ruby Award (formerly known as Making a Difference for Women Award)

This award is given to women who through their personal or professional activities, are working to improve the lives of other women and girls. Examples of the type of work honored include: spearheading an effort to open a domestic violence shelter, starting a mentoring program for atrisk girls, or lobbying companies to provide on-site childcare.

Women's Opportunity Award

Recipients of this award are women seeking to improve their economic status by gaining additional skills, training and education. These women, who, as primary wage earners for their families, face severe hardships that prevent them from pursuing and achieving their educational and professional goals. Most are single mothers and/or reliant on public assistance as their source of income. Many are domestic abuse survivors. The recipients may use the cash awards to offset any costs associated with their efforts to attain higher education, including tuition, books, supplies, childcare and car care.

Violet Richardson Award

This award honors young women between the ages of 14 and 17 for their service to the community. These volunteer efforts include helping other disadvantages girls, fighting drugs, crime and violence, cleaning up the environment and working to end discrimination and poverty.

AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS OF SOROPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL OF WAIKIKI FOUNDATION, INC.

ARTICLE I

Name and Territorial Limits

- **Section 1.** The name of this organization shall be SOROPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL OF WAIKIKI FOUNDATION, INC., hereinafter referred to as the "organization."
- **Section 2.** The territorial limits the organization shall be those of Founder Region, Soroptimist International of the Americas.
- **Section 3.** The organization is a part of District VI, which includes the State of Hawaii, the United States Territory of Guam and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands.
- **Section 4.** The principal office of the organization shall be in the City and County of Honolulu, State of Hawaii. The specific mailing address is Post Office Box 1615, Honolulu, Hawaii 96806.

ARTICLE II

Purposes and Objectives

- **Section 1.** The specific and primary purposes and objectives for which the organization has been formed and for which it shall be administered and operated are to receive, administer and expend funds for charitable and educational purposes in connection with the following:
 - a. to promote the objectives and fulfill the purposes of Soroptimist as defined in the Constitution of Soroptimist International;
 - b. to educate and develop an interest among the membership of the organization for the promotion of service projects in the areas of economic and social development, education, environment, health, human rights/status of women, and international goodwill and understanding, particularly, but not limited to the improvement of the lives of women and girls;
 - c. to promote the ideals of good citizenship among the youth of Hawaii;
 - d. to recognize the school and community efforts and achievements of our high school seniors;
 - e. to encourage high concepts of patriotism and effective cooperation in home, community, national and international affairs;

- f. to provide financial assistance to mature women who must enter or return to the job market;
- g. to assist mature women in furthering their skills and training in order to upgrade their employment status;
- h. to provide an arena wherein outstanding young people in this community may study and discuss current events, thereby promoting better understanding of those questions which affect their lives;
- i. to provide financial assistance for charitable, educational, social welfare, medical or disaster relief purposes on a state, national or international level:
- j. to engage in any and all lawful activities incidental to the foregoing purposes, except that no part of the activities of the organization shall be or consist of participating in or intervening in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office nor shall it in any way engage in any activities prohibited under the Internal Revenue Code of the United States and, specifically, by Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws; and
- k. to receive and maintain a fund or funds of real or personal property, or both, and, subject to the restrictions and limitations hereinafter set forth, to use and apply the whole or any part of the income therefrom and the principal thereof for charitable, educational, social welfare, medical or disaster relief purposes either directly or by contributions to other organizations or groups or individuals including, but not limited to those that qualify for exemption under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.
- **Section 2.** The organization is not incorporated for profit, it will not issue any stock and no part of its assets, income or earnings shall be distributed to its members, officers or directors except for services actually rendered to the organization, or in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Section 1.a., hereinabove.

ARTICLE III

Members

Section 1. Admission to Membership

a. Any member may propose an individual considered eligible for membership in the organization. Such proposal shall be submitted to the membership committee, which shall verify the individual's eligibility, determine the individual's classification and assign a classification code for regular members. The membership committee shall then present eligible candidates to the board of directors for approval.

- b. With the approval of the board of directors, a written invitation to membership shall be sent to the proposed candidate within thirty (30) days.
- c. Invitations to membership shall remain open for ninety (90) days unless an extension is granted by the board of directors.
- d. An individual shall be enrolled as a new member upon the organization's receipt of the individual's written acceptance of the invitation to membership, the individual's payment of all fees and dues, and the organization's transmittal of the individual's federation new member fees and dues with a Form 5008 to federation headquarters.

Section 2. Categories of Membership, Privileges and Responsibilities

- a. Membership in the organization shall be represented by the following categories:
 - (1) Regular actively engaged in a business or profession, in a management or executive position or in an occupation of comparable status or responsibilities.
 - (2) Retired/Unemployed recently retired or temporarily/permanently unemployed from a position comparable to a regular member status.
 - (3) Embarking beginning a career comparable to regular member status, to be so categorized for a period not to exceed two (2) years from the date of admission to membership.
 - (4) Life members designated and described in the 1999 Federation Bylaws. "Active Life" members, eligible for regular membership, having opted for life category after 25 years' membership; "Retired Life" members, no longer employed, having opted for life membership after 15 years' membership. This category was assigned only to those members eligible on or before July 1, 2001.
- b. Regular, retired/unemployed, embarking and life members whose participation meets the requirements set by these Bylaws may speak, make motions and vote.
- c. All members whose participation meets the requirements set by these Bylaws may be elected to or retain office and serve as a member of the board of directors.
- d. All members in good standing may serve on one or more committees.
- e. No member shall hold more than one elected office within the organization except as a delegate or alternate delegate to a federation convention, regional conference or district meeting.
- f. Any member in good standing of another Soroptimist club may transfer membership to the organization, provided written verification has been received from the former club and that all financial obligations of the member have been satisfied.

Section 3. Attendance Requirements

a. Number of Meetings: To be a member in good standing, hold office and vote, a member is expected to participate in the organization's activities and to attend a minimum of twelve (12) of its meetings per year, which may include but not be limited to attendance at any of the following: (i) business meetings, (ii) program meetings, (iii) special meetings, (iv) board of directors meetings, (v) committee meetings, (vi) federation conventions, (vii) region conferences, (viii) district or leadership training meetings, (ix) other Soroptimist meetings, or (x) any other meeting or function designated by the board of directors.

b. Leave of Absence

- (1) Any member desiring to take a leave of absence from the organization must submit a request to the board of directors in writing, stating the reasons and the period for which said leave is being requested. If the board of directors determines that just cause, such as a member's illness, travels or temporary removal from the community exists for the member's request, the board of directors may grant a leave of absence to the member for a period of not more than twelve (12) months.
- (2) All mandatory fees and dues must be paid by a member taking a leave of absence.

c. Termination of Membership

- (1) The following shall be reasons for termination of membership from the organization: (i) resignation, (ii) nonparticipation in the organization's activities, (iii) failure to fulfill financial obligations within thirty (30) days of the due date, (iv) failure to maintain the requirements for membership, and (v) conduct that adversely reflects upon the Soroptimist organization.
- (2) No membership may be terminated for reasons other than resignation without giving the member an opportunity for a hearing before the board of directors after a thirty (30) day written notice of termination to the member. A two-thirds (2/3) vote of the total number of voting members of the board of directors is required for termination of membership when grounds for termination have been determined to exist. The decision of the board of directors shall be final.
- (3) The board of directors shall have authority to remove from office any elected officer, board member or committee chair for failure to perform the duties of office or duties required of such officer, board member or committee chair. Before action is taken by the board of directors, notice shall be given to such officer, board member or committee chair of the specific failure and opportunity shall be given to such person to appear and answer at a hearing before the board of directors. A two-thirds (2/3) vote of the total number of voting members of the board of directors shall

be required for removal. The decision of the board of directors shall be final.

- d. Should an elected member of the board of directors need to take a leave of absence during their term of office, the office shall be declared vacant.
- e. If an elected member of the board of directors misses more than three consecutive board meetings without cause, that person shall resign from office.

ARTICLE IV

Officers

Section 1. Elected Officers

- a. Elected officers of this organization shall be:
 - (1) President
 - (2) President-Elect
 - (3) Vice-President
 - (4) Secretary
 - (5) Treasurer
 - (6) Assistant Treasurer
- (7) Two (2) Directors (one (1) director elected each year to serve a 2-year term)
- (8) Two (2) Endowment Directors (one (1) endowment director elected each year to serve a 2-year term)
- (9) One (1) Region/District Delegate and two (2) Alternate Delegates. (The alternate delegates may be chosen by the board of directors at such time necessary.)

Section 2. Eligibility for Office

- a. All members in good standing shall be eligible to serve in an elective position of the organization.
- b. To be eligible for the office of president or president-elect, the member shall have previously served on the organization's board of directors.

Section 3. Duties of Officers and Directors

- a. The President shall:
 - (1) direct the conduct of the business of the organization;
- (2) preside at meetings of the organization and the board of directors:
- (3) chair the Meeting Planning Committee (see Article IX, Section 2.:
 - (4) appoint a parliamentarian;
- (5) serve ex officio as a member of all committees except the nominating committee;

- (6) serve as the organization's delegate to federation conventions and as one of the delegates to region conferences and district meetings;
- (7) retrieve the organization's mail from the post office box, copy the bank statements before sending them to the treasurer, and circulate that copy at the board of directors' meeting with said copy to become part of the secretary's records;
- (8) assist the secretary in the preparation of the annual report and retain a copy of said report in the president's permanent file; (see ARTICLE VI, Section 3.)
- (9) handle all correspondence relating to the duties of this position; and
 - (10) perform such other duties as pertain to the office.
- b. The President-Elect shall:
 - (1) become familiar with all areas of Soroptimist;
 - (2) prepare for assuming the presidency;
- (3) appoint the chairs, coordinate the activities of and serve as ex officio member of the technical committees except as provided in ARTICLE IX, Sections 1.b. Finance Committee, 1.d. Laws and Resolution Committee, and 1.g. Soroptimist Orientation and Leadership Training (SOLT) Committee;
- (4) serve as a delegate to region conferences and district meetings;
- (5) serve as the alternate delegate for the federation convention;
- (6) handle all correspondence relating to the duties of this position; and
- (7) have such other duties and powers as arise from membership on the board of directors or as assigned by the president.

c. The Vice-President shall:

- (1) appoint the chair, coordinate the activities and serve ex officio as a member of all service projects and awards committees;
- (2) receive, review and present to the board of directors for approval and payment, budgeted requests;
- (3) receive, review and present to the board of directors requests for financial assistance from groups and/or individuals presented to the organization throughout the year, giving preference to non-503(c)(3) organizations (groups and/or individuals seeking such financial assistance shall indicate the specific purpose for such request and provide a copy of their most recent tax return, if deemed necessary); (see ARTICLE IX, Section 3.c. hereinbelow)
- (4) serve as one of the authorized signators on checks issued by the organization;

- (5) handle all correspondence relating to the duties of this position; and
- (6) have such other duties and powers as arise from membership on the board of directors or as assigned by the president.

d. The Secretary shall:

- (1) keep the minutes of the meetings of the organization and board of directors;
 - (2) maintain a roll of membership;
- (3) be custodian of the permanent records of the organization;
- (4) submit to the organization the minutes of the business meetings and policy recommendations of the board of directors;
- (5) send out notices of special meetings of the organization and board of directors;
- (6) arrange for another member to take minutes at any meeting which the secretary is unable to attend;
- (7) serve as one of the authorized signators on checks issued by the organization;
- (8) assist the president in the preparation of the annual report and retain a copy of said report in the president's permanent file. (see ARTICLE VI, Section 3.)
- (9) handle all correspondence relating to the duties of this position; and
- (10) have such other duties and powers as arise from membership on the board of directors or as assigned by the president.

e. The Treasurer shall:

- (1) record all financial transactions (including receipts and disbursements) on the organization's accounting system;
- (2) serve as one of the authorized signators on checks issued by the organization;
- (3) pay bills for expenses and service awards authorized by the organization's budget(s);
- (4) collect and deposit all donations made to the organization and issue receipts to said donors;
- (5) review the attendance sheets, related deposit slips and compare these to the actual deposits made to the bank once a month;
- (6) reconcile all of the organization's bank statements monthly and verify that all vouchers and receipts have been properly submitted;
- (7) annually obtain a credit card for use by the Treasurer for the payment of duly authorized disbursements, not to exceed \$6,000.00;

- (8) prepare monthly financial statements and comparative budget reports including a report of the current valuation of the organization's restricted/endowment fund;
- (9) file the annual corporate exhibit with the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs on or before September 29 of each year;
- (10) on or before October 15 of each year, provide to the organization's CPA the information required for filing the annual Form 990 (EZ) with the Internal Revenue Service due on November 15:
 - (11) serve as a member of the finance committee;
- (12) handle all correspondence relating to the duties of this position; and
- (13) have such other duties and powers as arise from membership on the board of directors or as assigned by the president.

f. The Assistant Treasurer shall:

- (1) serve as one of the authorized signators on checks issued by the organization;
 - (2) act in the absence of the treasurer as required;
- (3) be responsible for collecting, itemizing and depositing meal payments from meetings, paying meeting venue, and providing data to the treasurer for recording;
- (4) issue dues bills, collect dues, deposit in proper account and provide data to the treasurer for recording;
- (5) be responsible for all receipts and disbursements in connection with fundraising activities of the organization, provided, however, that this particular activity may be performed in connection with one or more members of the event's committee;
- (6) order supplies and other materials as needed by the organization from federation headquarters;
 - (7) serve as a member of the finance committee;
- (8) work closely with the treasurer during the last three months of the fiscal year to become familiar with all financial matters pertaining to the organization in anticipation of assuming the office of treasurer;
- (9) handle all correspondence relating to the duties of this position; and
- (10) have such other duties and powers as arise from membership on the board of directors or as assigned by the president.

g. The Directors shall:

(1) serve as advisors in all matters pertaining to the organization;

- (2) serve as chair of the Laws and Resolutions Committee during the first year of a 2-year term, and as chair of the SOLT Committee during the second year of said term;
- (3) handle all correspondence relating to the duties of this position; and
- (4) have such other duties and powers as arise from membership on the board of directors or as assigned by the president.

h. The Endowment Directors shall:

- (1) monitor the organization's investments, with the assistance of professional advisors as necessary, to ensure an optimum level of growth for the service fund(s). (see ARTICLE II, Section 1.k.);
- (2) advise the board of directors on investment recommendations along with the assistance of professional advisors for approval by a majority vote of the board of any investment and policy changes relating to the organization's funds;
- (3) serve as members of the finance committee during the first year of a 2-year term, and as chair of the finance committee during the second year of said term;
- (4) conduct or arrange for the fiscal year-end review of the financial books of the organization before turning them over to the organization's professional CPA;
- (5) handle all correspondence relating to the duties of this position; and
- (6) have such other duties and powers as arise from membership on the board of directors or as assigned by the president.

i. The Delegate(s) shall:

- (1) have voting rights and represent the organization as follows:
 - (a) the president shall serve as the voting delegate at a federation convention. The president and president-elect shall serve as two (2) voting delegates at a region conference and district meeting. The elected delegate shall serve as the third voting delegate at a region conference and district meeting.
 - (b) the delegate(s) shall give a written and/or oral report to the membership at the first meeting of the organization held after the convention, conference or district meeting attended by said delegate(s).
- (2) attend events described hereinabove for educational purposes and share the information so gained with the membership to further the purposes and objectives of the organization as outlined in ARTICLE II.

- (a) the organization shall defray the expenses of a delegate to a federation convention and the three (3) delegates to a region conference and district meeting in amounts authorized in the annual budget approved by the membership.
- (3) collect donations from the membership for any federation or region fundraising efforts and transmit same to the treasurer for deposit and distribution;
- (4) handle all correspondence relating to the duties of this position; and
- (5) have such other duties and powers as arise from membership on the board of directors or as assigned by the president.

Section 4. Term of Office; Removal from Office

- a. All officers and delegates, with the exception of directors and endowment directors, shall hold office for one (1) year, for a term beginning on July 1 and ending on June 30.
- b. Directors and endowment directors shall hold office for staggered 2-year terms beginning on July 1 and ending on June 30, with one (1) director and one (1) endowment director elected in an even-numbered year and the other director and endowment director elected in an odd-numbered year.
- c. Officers, directors and endowment directors shall not be eligible for more than two (2) consecutive terms in the same position.
- d. Should an officer, director, endowment director or delegate need to take a leave of absence during their term of office, the office shall be declared vacant.
- e. If a board member misses more than three (3) consecutive board meetings without cause, said board member shall resign from office.

Section 5. Vacancies

- a. In the event of a vacancy in the office of president, the president-elect shall become president.
- b. Should any delegate be unable to perform the duties of the delegate, the president shall with the approval of the board of directors, appoint an alternate delegate.
- c. Any other vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term by the board of directors, with the appointment to be ratified by the membership at the next following business meeting.

ARTICLE V

Nominations and Elections

Section 1. Nominating Committee

- a. The nominating committee shall be formed in February. It shall be comprised of three (3) members as follows:
 - (1) The president-elect shall chair the nominating committee.
 - (2) The board of directors shall select a second member who may be but need not be a member of the board.
 - (3) The membership shall elect the third member.
 - b. Nomination Procedures
 - (1) The committee shall place a notice in the organization's March newsletter, inviting each member to suggest names for consideration and providing a form for this purpose. Nominations shall be solicited for the following positions:
 - (a) each officer and delegate. (see ARTICLE IV, Section 1.a.)
 - (b) one-half of the directors and endowment directors. (see ARTICLE IV, Section 1.a.)
 - (2) Nominating forms shall be returned to the nominating committee no later than March 15.
 - (3) The nominating committee shall contact all nominees to obtain their consent to stand for election to the office for which they were nominated. For any positions for which no nominations are received, the committee shall seek candidates either from nominees for other positions or from other eligible members.
 - (4) The report of the nominating committee shall be published in the organization's May newsletter.

Section 2. Elections and Installation of Officers

- a. The election shall be held at the May business meeting. The report of the nominating committee shall be read again at this meeting and additional nominations may be made from the floor, provided the prior consent of the nominee has been obtained.
- b. Election shall be by ballot for any office for which there is more than one nominee. For any office for which there is only one nominee, said nominee shall be deemed to have been elected by acclamation. Members shall not hold more than one elected office except for the position of delegate or alternate delegate.
- c. New officers, directors, endowment directors and delegates shall be installed at the program meeting in June.

ARTICLE VI

Meetings and Special Meetings

Section 1. Regular Meeting Day

- a. Unless otherwise ordered by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members, the organization shall hold at least two (2) meetings each month.
- b. The normal meeting time shall be at 12:00 noon on the second and fourth Tuesday of each month. The board shall determine which Tuesday meeting will be the business meeting and which will be the program meeting.
- c. The place of the regular meetings of this organization shall be determined by the board of directors.
- d. If the regular meeting date of the organization falls on a holiday, the meeting may be rescheduled by the board of directors to an alternate date, with notice of said change to be given in the organization's newsletter.
- e. No program meetings shall be held during the months of December, February (the joint awards presentation) and June.
- f. Attendance at business meetings shall be limited to the organization's members and prospective members. Other guests may attend with the prior consent of the president.

Section 2. Special Meetings

- a. Special meetings of the organization may be called by the president or shall be called upon the written request of at least three (3) regular members. The business to be transacted at any special meeting shall be limited to that specified in the notice of the meeting.
- b. Special meetings except for those pertaining to bylaws amendments (see ARTICLE XVI, hereinbelow), shall require forty-eight (48) hours' notice to each member, provided either personally, in writing, by telephone, by facsimile transmission or by electronic mail.

Section 3. Annual Meeting/Joint Board Meeting

The first meeting in June shall be the annual meeting to receive reports of the outgoing officers and committees, to receive the annual report of the president and secretary which shall consist of a one-page summary containing the following information:

- i) the names of all members of the board of directors and committee chairs:
- ii) the names of all new members inducted and their categories/classification;
- iii) the names of all members terminated and the reasons for their terminations;

- iv) awards and service projects and the amounts expended for each:
 - v) fundraising events and the gross and net amounts received; and
- vi) information pertaining to other significant events throughout the year.

A copy of their annual report shall be provided to the Historical Committee for retention in its permanent file. New officers, directors, endowment directors and delegates shall be installed at this annual meeting.

The second meeting in June shall be a joint meeting of the outgoing and incoming boards of directors.

Section 4. Quorum; Proxies

Fifteen (15) voting members of this organization shall constitute a quorum for any duly called regular or special meeting. The lack of a quorum at any regularly scheduled business meeting, however, shall not preclude the conduct of business, as absent voting members shall be deemed to have given their proxies to the secretary in order to establish a quorum for the meeting to be called to order. A majority vote of those voting members present shall be necessary for any action of the organization.

ARTICLE VII

Board of Directors

Section 1. Members of the Board of Directors

The board of directors shall be comprised of:

- a. elected officers, who for the purpose of reports to the regulatory agencies shall be reported as "directors";
- b. two (2) directors, two (2) endowment directors and one (1) delegate;
 - c. immediate past-president with non-voting status; and
- d. parliamentarian, appointed by the president, with non-voting status.

Section 2. Duties of the Board of Directors

The board of directors shall:

- a. have administrative control over the affairs, funds and properties of the organization;
- b. authorize payments from the organization's funds for expenses within the organization's budget;
- c. act upon invitations to membership, resignations, terminations and disciplinary matters;
 - d. receive reports of committees;
- e. implement conflict of interest procedures as outlined in ARTICLE XIII, Conflict of Interest;
 - f. submit policy recommendations to the membership; and

g. perform such other duties as the organization, federation or region may require.

Section 3. Board Meetings

Unless otherwise ordered by the organization or the board of directors, regular meetings of the board shall be held once a month at a place and time designated by the president. From time to time, or in an emergency situation, teleconferencing or a similar means may be considered as an alternative method of holding board meetings.

Section 4. Quorum; Proxies

A majority of the board of directors shall constitute a quorum. The lack of a quorum at any regularly scheduled meeting of the board of directors shall not preclude the conduct of business. Absent board members shall be deemed to have given their proxies to the secretary in order to establish a quorum for the meeting to be called to order. A majority vote of those board members present shall be necessary for any board action.

Section 5. Special Board Meetings

- a. At least twenty-four (24) hours notice, written, personal, by telephone, by facsimile transmission or by electronic mail, shall be given each board member for special board meetings called by the president or any two (2) voting board members; the notice of said meeting shall include the purpose for which it is being called.
- b. An Executive Committee may act in lieu of a meeting of the entire board of directors in an emergency situation and is comprised of the following:
 - 1. President
- 4. Secretary
- 2. President-Elect
- 5. Treasurer
- 3. Vice-President

When action is necessitated due to an emergency situation, approval by any three (3) of the five (5) members of the Executive Committee shall be required to authorize such action. The Executive Committee may confer in person, by telephone conference, by facsimile transmission or by electronic mail, and shall immediately notify the other board members of any actions taken by their committee.

ARTICLE VIII

Limitation of Personal Liability

Section 1. Limitation of Personal Liability of Board Members

A board member shall not be personally liable for monetary damages for any action taken, or failure to take any action in the performance of their duties unless the board member or members shall have engaged in self-dealing, willful misconduct or recklessness in the performance of their duties.

ARTICLE IX

Committees

Section 1. Technical Committees

The technical committees of the organization shall be as listed below. The president-elect shall appoint the chairs, serve ex officio as a member and coordinate the activities of these committees except as provided in ARTICLE IX, Sections 1.b. Finance Committee, 1.d. Laws and Resolution Committee and 1.g. Soroptimist Orientation and Leadership Training Committee.

- a. Advocacy Committee. This committee shall:
- (1) study the need for and/or plan for a legislative workshop or seminar each year during the State's legislative session, or at some other time deemed to be more suitable, and not in conflict with ARTICLE II, Section 1.j. hereinabove; and
- (2) perform such other duties as directed by the president or the board of directors.
- b. <u>Finance Committee</u>. The second year endowment director shall chair this Committee. The treasurer, assistant treasurer and the first-year endowment director shall serve as the remaining members of this committee. This committee shall:
 - (1) prepare and distribute by June 1 of each year, the administrative and service budgets for the next fiscal year, reflecting the purposes, objectives and financial condition/requirements of the organization for adoption by the membership at the June business meeting;
 - (2) in conjunction with the preparation of proposed administrative and service budgets for the next fiscal year, prepare a comparative budget with the prior and current years' income and expenditures;
 - (3) arrange for and ensure that the review of the treasurers' books is completed within seventy-five (75) days of the end of the fiscal year (see ARTICLE X, Section 5. hereinbelow);

- (4) assist the treasurer and assistant treasurer in establishing effective financial control systems for the organization's funds; and
- (5) perform such other duties as directed by the president or the board of directors.
- c. Historical Committee. This committee shall:
- (1) maintain the organization's archives, scrapbooks, newsletters and mementos for display at appropriate meetings;
- (2) maintain a copy of the annual report (see ARTICLE VI) in the committee's permanent file;
- (3) provide a photographer at meetings and other gatherings; and
- (4) perform such other duties as directed by the president or the board of directors.
- d. <u>Laws and Resolutions Committee</u>. This committee shall be chaired by the first-year endowment director and shall:
 - (1) review annually the organization's Bylaws and Standing Rules to determine the need for amendments or revisions;
 - (2) review mailings and instructions from the federation and region to ensure that the organization's Bylaws are in conformance:
 - (3) draft or arrange for the drafting of required amendments to the organization's Bylaws and Standing Rules for adoption by the membership;
 - (4) prepare and forward any amendments proposed by the organization to the federation and/or region bylaws committee in time for consideration at conventions or conferences; and
 - (5) perform such other duties as directed by the president or the board of directors.
 - e. Membership Committee. This committee shall:
 - (1) perform such duties as outlined in ARTICLE III, hereinabove;
 - (2) act to ensure that the organization's regular membership maintains the optimum number suggested by the board of directors:
 - (3) monitor membership terminations in order to reinstate terminated members or recruit other regular members as needed;
 - (4) maintain an attendance record for all members and periodically contact absent members to ascertain the reasons for absences:
 - (5) maintain a record of leaves of absence and contact the member urging resumption of attendance when the leave expires;
 - (6) welcome visitors and issue make-up cards to visiting Soroptimists;
 - (7) contact members to make reservations for meetings;

- (8) help the assistant treasurer, if necessary, in the collection of meal and other payments at meetings of the organization and provide appropriate data to the treasurer for deposit and recordation;
- (9) arrange for lei, flowers or gifts for guest speakers or others as appropriate or as directed by the board of directors;
- (10) review annually the potential for extension into other areas for establishment of new clubs;
- (11) complete the Form 5008 (membership transaction report) for each new member for transmittal by the treasurer to the federation, region and district director;
- (12) complete the Form 5010 (membership information or termination form) documenting changes in name, address, classification, member status or officer and forward same to the federation, region and district director;
- (13) maintain a current roster of all member information, and provide any information changes to the officers and the chair of the newsletter committee, respectively;
- (14) provide the assistant treasurer with information to order name badges, member pins, etc.;
- (15) store the organization's banners and other items and deliver same to the organization's meeting venue;
- (16) maintain contact as appropriate with the organization's friendship links; and
- (17) perform such other duties as directed by the president or the board of directors.
- f. Public Relations Committee. This committee shall:
- (1) be responsible for preparing and sending to all members, on or before the first day of each month, a newsletter notifying them of regular meetings and other activities to be held during that month and such other information about the organization and its members as necessary and appropriate;
- (2) send the newsletter to the organization's friendship links, other Soroptimist clubs in District VI, federation, region and district officers as determined by the board of directors;
- (3) prepare news releases pertaining to the organization's activities to promote and enhance its image and the image of Soroptimist in order to educate the public about its purposes and objectives;
- (4) if feasible, publish notices of the organization's meetings in daily or weekly newspapers; and
- (5) perform such other duties as directed by the president or the board of directors.

- g. <u>Soroptimist Orientation and Leadership Training (SOLT)</u>
 Committee. This committee shall be chaired by the second-year director and shall:
 - (1) have the general responsibility for educating the members as to the heritage, purposes, objectives, policies and programs of the organization;
 - (2) be responsible for encouraging and preparing the members to assume leadership roles within the organization and the community as a whole; and
 - (3) perform such other duties as directed by the president or the board of directors.
- h. <u>Ways and Means Committee</u>. The assistant treasurer shall be a member of this committee. This committee shall:
 - (1) be responsible for planning an annual event to raise funds to support the organization's service activities, handle or assist with the accounting for said event, which responsibility may, within the president's approval, be assigned to an ad hoc committee established for this purpose;
 - (2) submit, for membership approval, methods of raising funds for the organization's service projects, specifying the investment of time, resources required and the estimated net profit to be realized from such fundraising;
 - (3) direct fundraising projects as have been approved by the membership; and
 - (4) perform such other duties as directed by the president or the board of directors.
 - i. Additional Technical Committees.

Additional Technical Committees may be appointed by the president as required.

Section 2. Meeting Planning Committee

The president shall chair this committee, which shall:

- a. meet during the first month of the fiscal year to plan a calendar of programs for the entire year, noting special days of importance to the organization, the federation and Soroptimist International;
- b. arrange topics, programs and activities for meetings throughout the year, including but not limited to economic and social development, education, environment, health, human rights/status of women and international goodwill and understanding; and
- c. encourage and invite all members to participate in meeting activities by introducing and/or thanking speakers, leading seminars, etc.

Section 3. Service Projects and Awards Committees

The vice-president shall appoint chairs as needed and coordinate the activities of the organization's service projects and awards committees and serve ex officio as a member of these committees.

a. Service Projects.

Special service projects may be selected from time to time by the membership and any additions or changes thereto shall require approval by the board of directors and the membership.

(1) Sponsored Organizations ("S" Clubs).

This committee shall oversee the organization's sponsorship of one or more "S" club(s) for high school students. The committee shall select a member to serve as advisor and liaison to each "S" Club who shall take responsibility for monitoring the activities and programs thereof.

(2) Youth Forum Committee.

This committee shall coordinate any Youth Forum that the organization shall choose to sponsor from time to time.

b. Awards Committees.

(1) Joint Awards Committee.

This committee shall serve as the organization's liaison to the Joint Awards Committee involving other Soroptimist clubs on Oahu, rotating duties in the selection process and presentation of the following three awards (which are designated as the organization's identifying projects). at an awards ceremony:

- (a) Women's Opportunity Awards (WOA)
- (b) Violet Richardson Awards (VRA)
- (c) Youth Citizenship Awards (YCA)

This joint awards committee is also responsible for submitting the names of the winners of the above awards for district, region and federation competition levels.

(2) Naming A Fellow Committee

This committee shall coordinate the selection process of naming a Fellow from among the organization's membership whenever a \$1,000 donation is made by the organization to the Founder Region Fellowship program.

(3) Ruby Award (fka MADWA)

This committee shall:

- (a) select from the community at large, recipients nominated for this award. This award honors individuals, groups or businesses who strive to improve the lives of or advance the status of women and girls;
- (b) arrange for recognition of the recipient at a meeting of the organization; and
- (c) submit the information on the organization's awardees for consideration at region and federation competition levels.

c. Additional Service Projects and Awards Committees.

The vice-president may establish one or more additional special projects and awards committees from time to time upon approval of the board of directors and the organization's membership and appoint the chairs thereof. Criteria for such awards shall include, but not be limited to, the prospective recipient's ability to obtain funds from other sources and/or the use of such funds for its own administrative or overhead expenses. (see ARTICLE IV Section 3.c.(3) hereinabove.)

ARTICLE X

Fiscal Matters

Section 1. Fiscal Year

The fiscal year shall be July 1 through June 30.

Section 2. Dues, Fees and Assessments

- a. Annual dues are payable not later than June 1 of each year, and are delinquent if not paid by June 30 of that year.
- b. The board of directors shall review the organization's financial condition by March of each year and, if justified, recommend a dues increase for the subsequent year. Notice of such proposed increase shall be given in the organization's April newsletter and the members shall vote on the board's recommendation at the April business meeting.
 - c. Dues shall not be increased more than once each year.
- d. Dues amounts for the various member categories for each current fiscal year shall be included in the organization's Standing Rules.
- e. Members may have the option of paying dues in two (2) semi-annual installments of fifty percent (50%) of the total amount on or before June 1 and December 1.
- f. Annual dues shall include an amount sufficient to cover all mandatory dues, fees and assessments payable to the international, federation and region, but shall exclude any assessments or donations which may be allocated as service funds.
 - g. Members admitted after August 1 shall pay pro-rated dues.
- h. There shall be a new member fee in an amount to be determined annually by the board of directors.
- i. A regular member in good standing with another Soroptimist club who transfers to this organization shall pay no new member fee, but shall pay dues for the current billing period, unless dues for said period were paid to the former club.
- j. A former member of this organization who was in good standing when membership was terminated shall pay no new member fee if reinstated within one (1) year of the date of termination. Annual dues shall be paid at the time of reinstatement. If any amounts were owed the

organization at the time of the previous termination, they shall be paid in full prior to reinstatement.

k. Any subsequent increases in international, federation and/or region dues, fees and/or assessments may result in an identical increase in this organization's annual dues, upon approval by the board of directors.

Section 3. Budgets

- a. The finance committee shall prepare and distribute by June 1 of each year, the operating and service budgets for the next fiscal year, reflecting the purposes, objectives and financial condition/requirements of the organization for adoption by the membership no later than the June business meeting.
- b. Budget items in the operating budget as adopted may be shifted from one line designation to another by action of the board of directors.
- c. Disbursements from service fund(s) shall be made in accordance with the duly adopted service budget.

Section 4. Funds

- a. The organization shall establish a minimum of two (2) fund accounts.
 - The first account shall be referred to as the (1) "restricted/endowment fund" which shall consist of the "principal" This fund shall receive deposits from investment portfolio. restricted donations, revenue from the sale of investments. interest/dividends from the account's investments and transfers from the operating account. The board of directors shall annually review and approve an amount to be transferred to the operating account for service projects and awards based on the established formula. No other disbursements from this restricted/endowment fund shall be made without the approval of the board of directors. A professional financial advisor may be engaged on behalf of the organization to assist the endowment directors in the development of investment guidelines to be approved by the board of directors and membership.
 - (2) A second account shall be referred to as the "operating account" which shall consist of deposits from fundraising activities, membership dues, members' non-restricted contributions and any other receipts, as well as disbursements for budgeted expenses, including but not limited to services, educational and other operating expenses for the current fiscal year. All interest/dividends earned in this account shall be retained in the account. At the end of each fiscal year, after retaining the amount derived from the current year's fundraising efforts and allocated for the following year's budget, the board of directors shall authorize

the transfer of a portion of the then remaining balance in said operating account to the restricted/endowment fund, with a recommended guideline for said transfer of cash to be fifty percent (50%) of the then balance.

- b. No disbursements from either of the above accounts shall be made without an appropriate voucher with receipts or other supporting data attached. Said voucher requests shall be approved by an officer, director or endowment director.
- c. Authorized signators on checks drawn on the above fund accounts shall be the Vice-President or Secretary in conjunction with the Treasurer or Assistant Treasurer.

Section 5. Financial Review

The endowment directors shall be responsible for arranging for and ensuring that a review of the books of the treasurer and assistant treasurer is completed within seventy-five (75) days of the end of the fiscal year. (see ARTICLE IX, Section 1.b.(3) hereinabove)

Section 6. Bonding of the Treasurer(s)

No surety bond shall be required for the treasurer or the assistant treasurer of the organization.

ARTICLE XI

Restricted/Endowment Fund

Section 1.

This organization has been established as a 501(c)(3) corporation meeting the requirements of the United States Department of the Treasury, Internal Revenue Service, to provide continuous funding for the organization's annual recognition awards, the Women's Opportunity Awards, Violet Richardson Awards and Youth Citizenship Awards (i.e. identifying projects) and other awards and/or service projects approved by the membership. (see ARTICLE IX, Section 3.)

Section 2.

The organization's Restricted/Endowment Fund shall be administered by two (2) duly elected endowment directors. (see ARTICLE IV, Section 3.h.)

ARTICLE XII

Lawful Activities

Section 1.

The organization may engage in any and all lawful activities incidental to the purposes and objectives stated in ARTICLE II hereinabove, except that no part of the activities of the organization shall be or consist of participating in or intervening in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office nor shall it in any way engage in any activities prohibited under the Internal Revenue Code of the United States and, specifically, by Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 and any successor statute.

Section 2.

Notwithstanding any possible future amendments or repeat of any provisions of said Section 501(c)(3) of said Internal Revenue Code of 1954 pertaining to political campaigns, the organization shall not participate in any partisan political activities.

ARTICLE XIII

Conflict of Interest

In order to avoid any actual or perceived conflicts of interest by its officers, directors, endowment directors and/or members that might jeopardize the organization's designation as a 501(c)(3) corporation under the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code as herein defined, the following situations shall be identified as indicative of conflicts of interest:

- a. any transaction involving another entity, including a nonprofit, in which a member of this organization has a financial interest or is a member, officer, director, agent, partner, associate, trustee, personal representative, receiver, guardian, custodian, conservator or other legal representative;
- b. any member of the organization accepting gifts, entertainment or other favors from an individual or entity that does or seeks to do business with the organization; and
- c. any transaction involving a grant or donation to a spouse, parent, step-parent, child, brother or sister or a spouse of any of the foregoing, or a member.

To avoid conflicts of interest, the following procedures shall occur:

a. Prior to board or committee action involving a potential conflict of interest, the member of the organization having such conflict of interest, and who is in attendance at said meeting, shall disclose all facts

material to the conflict of interest, such disclosure to be reflected in the minutes of said meeting.

- b. Any member of the organization who has a conflict of interest shall not participate in or be permitted to hear the board's or committee's discussion of the matter except to disclose material facts and to respond to questions. Such member shall not attempt to exercise any personal influence with respect to the matter, either at or outside the meeting.
- c. The member having a conflict of interest shall not vote on the transaction or be present in the meeting room when the vote is taken.
- d. In the event it is not entirely clear that a conflict of interest exists, the member with the potential conflict of interest shall disclose the circumstances to the presiding officer or committee chair, who shall determine whether there is a conflict of interest subject to this policy.
- e. Each member shall be asked to review a copy of this policy annually, and each officer, director, endowment director or delegate will be requested to acknowledge in writing that such review has occurred.

ARTICLE XIV

Standing Rules

The organization's Standing Rules supplement these Bylaws but may be adopted and/or amended without affecting these Bylaws. Current Standing Rules are attached and made a part hereof.

ARTICLE XV

Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in the current edition of *Robert's Rules of Order*, *Newly Revised*, shall be in the parliamentary authority for all matters not specifically covered by these Bylaws or higher Soroptimist law. The president shall appoint the organization's parliamentarian.

ARTICLE XVI

Amendments to Bylaws

These Bylaws may be amended at any regular or duly called special meeting of the organization by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present, provided that due notice of the proposed amendment(s) with copies thereof attached shall have been provided to the members at least ten (10) days prior to the meeting, by either the secretary or by the Laws and Resolutions Committee. (see also ARTICLE IX, Section 1.d.)

ARTICLE XVII

Dedication and Dissolution

Section 1.

The property of the organization is irrevocably dedicated to social welfare purposes and no part of the net income or assets of this organization shall ever inure to the benefit of any officer, director, or member thereof or to the benefit of any private persons.

Section 2.

Upon the dissolution of the organization as provided in Article VII of the Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation dated March 7, 2009, all assets remaining after payment or provision for payment of all debts and liabilities of this organization shall be distributed to one or more entities organized and operated exclusively for social welfare purposes and which shall have established their tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, said receiving entity or entities to be selected and approved by the then membership of the organization at the time of dissolution.

1. Dues must be received by the assistant treasurer by June 1 for membership renewal.

Effective July 1, 2008 annual dues are:

\$160.00 Regular and retired/unemployed member dues
\$80.00 Life member dues
(dues for embarking members will be determined)
\$45.00 New member fee, plus prorated dues upon enrollment

- 2. Members are urged to attend all regularly scheduled meetings and to make reservations when contacted by the membership committee or by e-mail. The member may cancel before noon on the Friday preceding the meeting. If cancellations are not received, the member will be invoiced at the current meal cost, unless that meal has been purchased by another. Members are also encouraged to attend and participate in all special events of the organization.
- 3. The member's cost for each meal shall be the amount charged by the venue, rounded to the next dollar.
- 4. Members are encouraged to make a monetary donation to the organization (eg. "buy roses") in celebration of anniversaries of membership or for other significant occasions.
- 5. The pin worn by the organization's president consists of its charter president's pin, which has been mounted on a gold disc. At the end of each term, the president shall pass this pin on to the successor.
- 6. Membership pins are presented to members upon induction. In the event a member's pin is lost, the member is responsible for paying for a replacement pin.
- 7. The president's correspondence and other files shall be purged of extraneous materials before turning them over to the successor. With the exception of the permanent files required to be maintained by the treasurer and minutes to be retained by the secretary, all other files of members of the board of directors and committee chairs, shall likewise be purged of extraneous materials before turning them over to their successors.
- 8. Vouchers for reimbursable expenses must be submitted to the treasurer within 60 days, accompanied by all supporting data.
- These Standing Rules may be amended by a majority vote of the members present at a regular or special meeting provided due notice of the proposed amendment has been given.
- 10. These Standing Rules may be suspended by a majority vote of the members present at a regular or special meeting of the organization provided the request to suspend states the specific purpose of such suspension.
