The organization accepts requests and there are no preselected charitable organizations. The primary purpose of the organization is to promote the legacy of President Andrew Johnson, who was the great-great grandfather of the donor.

We have completed a book on the life of the President. We worked with Dr. Robert Orr who is well versed on this subject. We commissioned him to do this book for a specific purpose. The original commission was for him to do the "true story of the President." This book is about 80 pages plus photos, is a hardback edition and is presented to all students in the Greeneville and Greene County schools. Our initial group was all students in the 8th through 12th grade at each school located in Greene County. This is a continuing project as we return to each school each year to the 8th grade. We leave extra books for transfer students. The books are delivered by and lectures provided by the Author. We have provided books to all of the initial group. Some of these books have been provided to the National Park Service for their use.

Past projects have been acquisition of various pieces of memorabilia of the Johnson family for the National Park Service, the Presidential Library at Tusculum College and other interested public agencies.

Since Greeneville is the home of Andrew Johnson we are blessed to have the Tailor Shop, his home, his grave, and other sites maintained by the National Park Service. The corporation has assisted in providing a statue of the President and a replica of his birthplace. The Park Service opens and closes it for visitors. The corporation provides maintenance and general upkeep on an ongoing basis.

We have provided rare books relating to the President and/or his family to the Greeneville/Greene County Library and assisted the library in the renovation of acquired property for their genealogy section that houses their collection of Johnson items. They have many items from the Johnson era that are available for viewing and/or use by the public and historians.

We have also acquired three impeachment tickets for the National Park Service.

We continue to assist in the acquisition of Johnson memorabilia for the library and for the Park Service. We participate in the local "August 7" Day Celebration.

The Bartlett home was left to the local chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution for use in their tax exempt function. We maintain the home and pay expenses such as utilities, insurance, and repairs.
