

Fall Concert

Performances at Saint Johnsbury Academy, St. Johnsbury, Vermont, and Barre Opera House, Barre, Vermont were conducted by Louis A. Kosma and Lisa Jablow. Soloists from the Bel Canto Institute were Elise Jablow, Soprano, Joann Martinson, Soprano and included the Johnson State College Chorus and Vermont Philharmonic Chorus.
