Audited financial statement footnote: Patient accounts receivable are stated at estimated net realizable value. Scott & White maintains allowances for uncollectible accounts for estimated losses resulting from a payor's inability to make payments on accounts. Scott & White uses a balance sheet approach to value the allowance account based on historical write-offs, payor type, and the aging of the accounts. Accounts are written off when collection efforts have been exhausted. Management continually monitors and adjusts, as necessary, allowances associated with its receivables. The majority of uncollectible accounts result from uninsured patients and patient co-pays and deductibles.

Part III, Line 8: SWH-RR is a nonprofit hospital that voluntarily participates in the Medicare program. Medicare payments received do not cover the costs incurred to provide services to Medicare patients. In reporting the community benefit portion of the American Hospital Association/Texas Hospital Association survey, the Medicare short-fall is included in community benefit reporting.

Costing methodology/source: All payments to providers of services must be based on the reasonable cost of services covered under title XVIII of the Act. Reasonable cost includes all necessary and proper costs incurred in rendering the services. Reasonable cost takes into account both direct and indirect costs of providers of services, including normal standby costs. The general services or overhead cost is stepped down and allocated through statistical data to equitable allocate the expenses to the hospital service departments.

Part VI, Line 2: Scott and White Hospital - Round Rock regularly reviews and utilizes reports on current health needs compiled by entities such as the Williamson County Public Health District. In addition to these reports, medical analysts study inpatient and outpatient records to provide a comprehensive look at health trends in the community so we can appropriately tailor the services offered. The hospital has initiated plans to conduct our own health needs assessment anticipating a completion early in 2012.

Part VI, Line 3: SWH-RR educates patients in regards to their eligibility for financial assistance in a number of ways. Patient billing statements include phone contact information for patients seeking information regarding financial assistance. Financial counselors are available at each location to assist patients in determining eligibility, assisting with applications for assistance, as well as making payment arrangements. Additionally, SWH-RR contracts with a 3rd party vendor to routinely screen self-pay patients for eligibility for local, state and federal assistance programs that may be available. These services are offered at no cost to patients.

The system also includes Scott & White Clinic, a multi-specialty tax-exempt physician clinic with approximately 76 locations in Central Texas as of August 31, 2010, and Scott & White Health Plan, a tax-exempt HMO and insurance company with approximately 200,000 members. Scott & White Healthcare provides planning, management, and financing support for the other entities in the system. All health care delivery organizations in the system, including Scott & White Clinic, function in a manner to support their tax-exempt status. All entities operate under a consistent governance arrangement, provide services to Medicare and Medicaid patients, provide charity services to patients under system-wide charity and financial assistance plans and have consistent accounting and bad debt policies. All financial accounting, billing, and collection activities are performed or managed by a system-wide finance department.



Each such amendment made by the Restated Certificate of Formation has been effected in conformity with the provisions of the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act and the Texas Business Organizations Code and such Restated Certificate of Formation and each such amendment made by the Restated Certificate of Formation were adopted on January 29, 2010 in the following manner:

The Restated Certificate of Formation and the amendments made by such Restated Certificate of Formation were adopted and approved pursuant to the Corporation's bylaws at a meeting of the Board of Trustees of Scott and White Memorial Hospital and Scott, Sherwood and Brindley Foundation (SWMHSSBF), the sole corporate member of the Corporation, held on January 29, 2010, and received the vote of a majority of Trustees then in office, there being no other members having voting rights in respect thereof.

### **ARTICLE FOUR**

The Articles of Incorporation and all amendments thereto are hereby superseded by the following Restated Certificate of Formation, which accurately copy the entire text thereof, including any previous amendments and as amended as set forth above:

### ARTICLE ONE ENTITY NAME AND TYPE

The filing entity is a non-profit corporation. The name of the entity is Scott & White Hospital – Round Rock.

### ARTICLE TWO REGISTERED OFFICE AND AGENT

### ARTICLE THREE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The management of the affairs of the corporation is vested in the Board of Directors. The standards for a director designated as a Director shall be controlled by Chapter 22.221 of the Texas Business Organizations Code (BOC). The number of Directors constituting the board of Directors and the names and addresses of the persons who are to serve as Directors until the next annual meeting of members or until their successors are elected and qualified are as follows.

### ARTICLE FOUR MEMBER

The non-profit corporation shall have one corporate member, Scott & White Healthcare. The member shall have such rights and obligations as are set forth in the BOC, this Certificate of Formation, and the Bylaws of the Corporation.

### ARTICLE FIVE PURPOSES

This non-profit corporation is established for the following purposes, which are not expressly prohibited under Chapters 2 or 22 of the BOC, including any purpose described by Chapter 2.002 of the BOC:

- A. The Corporation is organized and shall be operated exclusively for charitable, educational, literary and scientific purposes, and the Corporation pledges its assets for use in performing those purposes, within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws, by engaging directly in any business or activities permitted by the BOC in support of such purposes and by making distributions to other organizations for use, by the distributees, in support of such purposes, as described and limited in Articles Five and Six hereof, and, in furtherance of these purposes, the Corporation shall be organized and operated as set forth in this Article Five. The pledge set forth in the preceding sentence is intended, and shall be construed, to be a dedication of such assets to the accomplishment of the purposes of the Corporation and not to create a lien or security interest on the assets or the revenues of the Corporation or to limit the Corporation's ability to encumber its assets and revenues.
- B. The Corporation shall, directly or through its affiliates and subsidiaries, own and/or operate health care facilities, provide health care services and engage in such other health care related activities as may be necessary or desirable, all for the purposes of:
  - 1. Performing managerial, financial, educational, administrative, and custodial functions for its affiliated entities including the support of medical facilities or services for the use and benefit of the public.
  - 2. Furnishing medical and health care services in any form, for the care, treatment and prevention of diseases within and without hospitals, without regard to the person's ability to pay in accordance with the charity policy adopted by the Corporation.
  - 3. Providing for the construction, support, maintenance and operation of health care facilities; providing education in health care and disease prevention; and providing and maintaining a training institution for medical, nursing and allied health personnel.
  - 4. Possessing all the powers authorized and allowed to non-profit charitable corporations, under the BOC, which do not, except to an insubstantial degree, represent any activities or powers that are not in furtherance of the exempt purposes of this Corporation.
  - 5. Doing any and all other acts, things, business or businesses in any manner connected with or necessary, incidental, convenient, or auxiliary to any of the purposes hereinabove enumerated or calculated, directly or indirectly, to promote the charitable purposes of the Corporation.

### ARTICLE SIX MANNER OF DISTRIBUTION

The corporation is authorized on its winding up to distribute the non-profit corporation's assets in a manner other than as provided by Chapter 22.304 of the BOC. The manner of distribution is as follows:

Upon dissolution of the Corporation, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, any interest in any funds, property or assets of any kind, real, personal or mixed, shall not be transferred to private ownership, but shall be distributed exclusively to its Member, provided that in the event its Member is not then a Qualified Recipient (as hereinafter defined), the assets which would have been distributed to its Member shall be distributed by the Board of Directors, in its sole discretion, to an entity which is a Qualified Recipient. "Qualified Recipient" means an organization that is existing and qualified as exempt from federal income taxation under Section 501(a) of the Code as an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Code.

### ARTICLE SEVEN POWERS

The Corporation shall have the power to engage in any and all lawful activities incidental to the purposes of the Corporation; provided, however, that with respect to the exercise of such powers:

- A. The Corporation shall neither have nor exercise any power, nor shall it engage directly or indirectly in any activity, that would invalidate its status as a corporation that is exempt from federal income taxation as an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, or as a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Code;
- B. No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, any Director or officer of the Corporation, or any other private individual (except that compensation may be paid and expenses may be paid or reimbursed for services rendered to or for the Corporation in furtherance of one or more of its purposes, provided that such compensation and expenses are reasonable and not excessive in amount); and
- C. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall consist of the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate or intervene (including the publishing or distribution of statements or otherwise) in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

### ARTICLE EIGHT LIMITATIONS OF POWER

- 8.01 Actions Requiring Approval of the Member. The following actions shall be taken only upon the approval of the Board of Directors of the Member, by majority vote, and approval of the Board of Directors of the Corporation shall not be required for such actions:
  - (a) Amendment, restatement or repeal of the Certificate of Formation or Bylaws of the Corporation.

- (b) Sale, exchange, lease or other transfer of all or substantially all of the assets of the Corporation, including under Subchapter F of Chapter 11 of the BOC.
- (c) Merger or consolidation of the Corporation, including a plan of merger under Subchapter F of Chapter 11 of the BOC.
  - (d) Dissolution of the Corporation.
  - (e) Election of members to the Board of Directors of the Corporation.
  - (f) Removal of a member of the Board of Directors of the Corporation.
- (g) Creation of affiliates or subsidiaries of the Corporation, and approval of their initial governing documents.
- (h) Incurrence of debt not otherwise included in the capital or operating budgets of the Corporation.
  - (i) Discontinuing the operations of a licensed health care facility controlled by the Corporation.
  - (j) Voluntary winding up under Chapter 11;
- (k) Revocation of a voluntary decision to wind up under Chapter 11.151 of the BOC.
- (l) Cancellation of an event requiring winding up under Chapter 11.152 of the BOC.
  - (m) A reinstatement under Chapter 11.202 of the BOC.
  - (n) A distribution plan under Chapter 22.305 of the BOC.
  - (o) A plan of conversion under Chapter 11, Subchapter F of the BOC.
  - (p) A plan of exchange under Chapter 11, Subchapter F of the BOC.
- (q) Such other approval rights with respect to the Corporation as set forth in the Bylaws.

### ARTICLE NINE ACTION BY WRITTEN CONSENT

Any action required by the BOC to be taken at a meeting of the Directors of the Corporation, or any action that may be taken at a meeting of the Directors or of any committee, may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the action to be taken, is signed by a sufficient number of Directors or committee members as would be necessary to take that action at a meeting at which all of the Directors or members of the committee were present and voted.

### ARTICLE TEN LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

- 10.01 General Limitation of Liability for Directors.
- (a) A Director shall discharge the Director's duties, including duties as a committee member, in good faith, with ordinary care, and in a manner the Director reasonably believes to be in the best interest of the corporation.
- (b) A Director is not liable to the Corporation, a member, or another person for an action taken or not taken as a Director if the Director acted in compliance with this section. A person seeking to establish liability of a Director must prove that the Director did not act:
  - (1) in good faith;
  - (2) with ordinary care; and
  - (3) in a manner the Director reasonably believed to be in the best interest of the Corporation.
- 10.02 Exceptions for Limitation of Liability of Directors (Directors). Pursuant to Chapter 7.001(b) of the BOC, a Director (Director) of the organization is not liable to the organization or its owners or members for monetary damages for an act or omission by the person in the person's capacity as a Director (Director), except that Chapter 7.001(b) does not authorize the elimination or limitation of the liability of a Director (Director) to the extent the person is found liable under applicable law for:
- (1) a breach of the person's duty of loyalty, if any, to the Corporation or its owners or members;
  - (2) an act or omission not in good faith that:
    - (a) constitutes a breach of duty of the person to the Corporation; or
    - (b) involves intentional misconduct or a knowing violation of law;

- (3) a transaction from which the person received an improper benefit, regardless of whether the benefit resulted from an action taken within the scope of the person's duties; or
- (4) an act or omission for which the liability of a Director (Director) is expressly provided by an applicable statute.
- 10.03 <u>Limitation of Liability of Officers</u>. Pursuant to Chapter 22.235(a) of the BOC, an officer is not liable to the corporation or any other person for an action taken or omission made by the officer in the person's capacity as an officer unless the officer's conduct was not exercised:
  - (1) in good faith;
  - (2) with ordinary care; and
- (3) in a manner the officer reasonably believes to be in the best interest of the Corporation.

This section shall not affect the liability of the Corporation for an act or omission of the officer.

10.04 Amendment of Statutes. If the BOC, the Charitable Immunity and Liability Act of 1987, as amended, or any federal or other state statute is amended to authorize the further elimination or limitation of the liability of Directors or officers of the Corporation, then the liability of a Director or officer of the Corporation shall be limited to the fullest extent permitted by the statutes of the State of Texas and the United States of America, as so amended, and such elimination or limitation of liability shall be in addition to, and not in lieu of, the limitation on the liability of a Director or officer of the Corporation provided by the foregoing provisions of this Article 10. Any repeal of or amendment to this Article 10 shall be prospective only and shall not adversely affect any limitation on the liability of a Director or officer of the Corporation existing at the time of such repeal or amendment.

### ARTICLE ELEVEN INDEMNIFICATION

11.01 <u>Indemnification</u>. The Corporation shall indemnify and advance expenses to any current or former Director, officer, committee member, employee, or agent of the Corporation, and their respective successors in interest, to the fullest extent allowed by the BOC, applicable federal and state law, this Certificate of Formation, the Bylaws, and the indemnification policies adopted from time to time by the THR Board of Directors. The Corporation shall have the power to purchase and maintain at its cost and expense insurance on behalf of such persons.

### 11.02 <u>Limitation of Indemnification</u>.

(a) The Corporation shall only indemnify a current or former Director, officer, committee member, employee, or agent of the Corporation who was, is, or is threatened

to be made a respondent in a proceeding to the extent permitted by Chapter 8.102 of the BOC if it is determined in accordance with Chapter 8.103 of the BOC that:

- (1) the person:
  - (A) acted in good faith;
  - (B) reasonably believed:
    - (i) in the case of conduct in the person's official capacity, that the person's conduct was in the Corporation's best interests; and
    - (ii) in any other case, that the person's conduct was not opposed to the Corporation's best interests; and
  - (C) in the case of a criminal proceeding, did not have a reasonable cause to believe the person's conduct was unlawful;
- (2) with respect to expenses, the amount of expenses other than a judgment is reasonable; and
- (3) indemnification should be paid.
- (b) Action taken or omitted by a Director (Director) or delegate with respect to an employee benefit plan in the performance of the person's duties for a purpose reasonably believed by the person to be in the interest of the participants and beneficiaries of the plan if for a purpose that is not opposed to the best interests of the Corporation.
- (c) Action taken or omitted by a delegate to another enterprise for a purpose reasonably believed by the delegate to be in the interest of the other enterprise or its owners or members is for a purpose that is not opposed to the best interests of the Corporation.
- (d) A person does not fail to meet the standard under Subsection (a)(1) solely because of the termination of a proceeding by:
  - (1) judgment;
  - (2) order;
  - (3) settlement;
  - (4) conviction; or
  - (5) a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent

ARTICLE TWELVE
AMENDMENT OF CERTIFICATE OF FORMATION
AND BYLAWS

The power to amend the Certificate of Formation and Bylaws of the Corporation shall be exclusively reserved to the Member as set forth in the Bylaws of the Corporation. Other reserved powers may be set forth in the Bylaws.

### ARTICLE THIRTEEN CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

The Board of Directors shall, in the exercise of its overall duties and responsibilities, take such steps as it deems appropriate to avoid and resolve potential conflicts of interest between the personal interests of Directors and the activities and interests of the Corporation. Such steps shall include adopting and requiring compliance with duality and conflict of interest policies and procedures and providing a method for individuals to disclose and resolve potential conflicts of interest. All conflicts of interest shall be disclosed to the Board of Directors and made a matter of record.

### ARTICLE FOURTEEN **EFFECTIVENESS OF FILING**

This document becomes effective on May 28, 2010, and is filed by the Secretary of State.

### ARTICLE FIFTEEN **EXECUTION**
