



1. Organization:

WOMEN'S WAY ("Organization", herein), a not-for-profit organization, raises money for women-centered funding, advocacy, and education to achieve women's equality, safety, economic self-sufficiency, and reproductive freedom. As the nation's oldest women's funding federation, it grants critical operating funds to its member agencies and, through its Community Women's Fund, to women-led, women-focused regional social services organizations addressing a broad continuum of issues that impact women of all ages, races, and socioeconomic backgrounds.

Programs, in addition to funding, include production of an unprecedented research report on the pace of progress for women; hosting an annual women's conference on women's leadership; monthly electronic initiatives about issues of importance to women, girls, and families; technical assistance to grantees; a monthly electronic newsletter about events and news relating to the Organization's work and the work of its funded agencies; and development of future leaders and philanthropists through the Young Women's Initiative. Funding from the Organization supports programs that advocate adult basic education, tenant and consumer training, rape crises intervention, domestic abuse counseling, healthcare options, legal rights, aging supports and more.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies:

Basis of accounting:

The Organization's financial statements are prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America (US GAAP), and, as such are required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets and permanently restricted net assets.

Net assets:

Net assets are categorized according to externally (donor) imposed restrictions. A description of the net asset categories is as follows:

Unrestricted net assets are those assets that are available for the support of operations and whose use is not externally restricted.

Unrestricted, board designated net assets are those assets that are available for the support of operations and whose use is not externally restricted but requires board approval.

Temporarily restricted net assets are those assets whose use by the Organization has been limited by donors to a specific time period or purpose.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies (continued):

Net assets (continued):

Permanently restricted net assets are those assets that the donor stipulates must be maintained by the Organization in perpetuity. The Organization has no permanently restricted net assets.

Contributions:

Contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily or permanently restricted support depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions.

Contributions, including unconditional promises to give, are recognized as revenue in the period when the promise to give is received. Contributions that are restricted by the donor are recorded as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions are met or expire within the fiscal year in which the contributions are received. All other donor-restricted contributions are reported as increases in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets depending upon the nature of the restrictions. When a restriction is met, temporarily restricted net assets are released to unrestricted net assets.

Conditional promises to give are recognized as contribution revenue when the conditions on which they depend are substantially met.

In-kind contributions:

The Organization records donated materials and donated services that create or enhance non-financial assets. Services that require specialized skills are recorded when provided by individuals possessing those skills that would otherwise need to be purchased. In-kind contributions are recorded at their fair market value at the time of receipt and are included in the financial statements as revenue and expense.

Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Cash and cash equivalents:

The Organization considers all highly liquid debt instruments purchased with an original maturity of three months or less, which are not intended to be held for investment purposes, to be cash equivalents.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies (continued):

Contributions and workplace campaigns receivable:

Contributions and workplace campaigns receivable are stated at the amount management expects to collect from balances outstanding at year end. An allowance is based on historical experience and management's analysis of collectability. As of August 31, 2010, the allowance consisted of \$9,094 and \$12,723 for contributions and workplace campaigns, respectively.

Investments:

Investments are stated at fair value based on published market rates. Unrealized gains and losses are included in changes in net assets. Investment income and gains restricted by a donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions are met (either by passage of time or by use) in the reporting period in which the income and gains are recognized.

Furniture and equipment and depreciation:

Furniture and equipment is stated at cost. Major additions and betterments are capitalized and ordinary maintenance and repairs, which do not improve or extend the life of the respective assets, are expensed as incurred. Upon sale or retirement, the cost of the asset and the related accumulated depreciation are removed from the accounts and the resulting gain or loss, if any, is included in changes in net assets. Donated assets are recorded at fair value at the date of donation. Depreciation is recorded by the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets, 5 to 7 years.

During the year ended August 31, 2010, the Organization disposed of furniture and equipment with an original cost and accumulated depreciation of \$3,849 and \$3,251, respectively.

Grants expended:

The Organization incurred grant expense under contracts with its member agencies and through an open grant making process for its Community Women's Fund. Total grants expended for the year were \$487,039.

Functional expenses:

The cost of providing the various programs and other activities has been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of activities and changes in net assets and in the statement of functional expenses. Expenses that cannot be directly attributed to a specific program are allocated across program and supporting services based upon estimates by management.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies (continued):

Income taxes:

The Organization is exempt from federal and state income taxes under IRC Section 501(c)(3) and similar state laws. As a result, no provisions are made for federal and state income taxes. The Organization is not a private foundation.

3. Contributions receivable:

Contributions receivable consists of various grants and contributions made to support the Organization's programs. Contributions due in future years are discounted to their fair value. Valuation of the future contributions receivable takes place at the time of contribution. As of August 31, 2010, contributions receivable consist of the following:

4. Fair value measurements (continued):

US GAAP establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value.

This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1, and Level 3 inputs have the lowest priority. The Organization uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Organization measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 3 inputs are used only when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available.

The financial instruments' level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

6. Unrestricted net assets, board designated:

Unrestricted net assets, board designated consists of contributions that have been made to fund internal programs, grants, and operations of the Organization. There is no related endowment.

7. In-kind contributions:

Revenue and expenses include donated legal services of \$37,547, which benefited the administration and programs of the Organization.

8. Commitments:

Office lease commitments:

The Organization's lease calls for an annual assessment for any change in operating expense and real estate tax over the lease base line in addition to annual rents.

Rent expense for the year ended August 31, 2010 was \$59,091, which is shown net of rent received from subtenants of \$6,381.

Equipment lease commitments:

The Organization leases office equipment under non-cancelable leases expiring at various times through February 2015. The related lease expense for the year ended August 31, 2010 was \$16,121.

9. Ernesta D. Ballard endowment fund:

A fund has been established at The Philadelphia Foundation for the benefit of WOMEN'S WAY called the Ernesta D. Ballard Fund for WOMEN'S WAY. Assets of the fund at June 30, 2010 were \$951,930. These assets are subject to the Foundation's ultimate control and absolute discretion. The Organization is currently receiving distributions based on the net income of the assets.

10. Employee benefit plan:

The Organization sponsors a 403(b) defined contribution plan for eligible employees who have been employed for more than one year. The Organization contributes 50% of employee elective deferrals up to 1.5% of employee compensation. The total contribution for the year ended August 31, 2010 was \$5,655.

11. Uncertain Tax Positions

The Organization has adopted the new accounting standard for uncertainty in income taxes guidance. The guidance requires entities to evaluate, measure, recognize and disclose any uncertain income tax positions taken on their respective returns.

The adoption of that guidance by the Organization resulted in no change to net assets. As of August 31, 2010, the Organization believes that they have no unrecognized tax benefits or obligations. The Organization continually evaluates expiring statutes of limitations, audits, proposed settlements, changes in tax law, and new authoritative rulings.

The Organization files an informational return in the U.S. federal jurisdiction and annual charitable registrations in various state jurisdictions. U.S. federal and state jurisdictions have statutes of limitations that generally range from three to five years.

12. Subsequent events:

The Organization has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements through November 15, 2010, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued. Based on the Organization's evaluation, no subsequent events meet the criteria under US GAAP for disclosure.
