As a result of this change, a greater percentage of Medicaid is reimbursed to hospitals and unreimbursed Medicaid as a percentage of total expenses is significantly lower than those of hospitals in other states As a nonprofit hospital in South Carolina, the unreimbursed Medicaid percentage for SFH, Inc is fairly consistent with those of other hospitals in the state Part I, line 7c Unreimbursed costs from other means-tested government programs are computed by applying a costto-charge ratio to the total charges to patients covered under these programs. Part III, Line 4 Part III, line 2 Bad Debt Expense at cost is computed by applying the cost-to-charge ratio computed on Worksheet 2 to the aggregate bad debt expense for patient accounts recorded in the general ledger. Bad debt expense on the general ledger includes 1) actual write offs of discounted gross charges where it is determined an uninsured patient can pay and does not pay, and 2) the estimated write offs for uninsured patient accounts with outstanding balances after discount. Estimates are based on historical collection rates. When an uninsured patient is billed for patient care services, the charges are automatically discounted and the patient is requested to only pay the amount after discount. The discount is recorded as an adjustment to gross revenue and is not recorded in bad debt expense. If the balance after discount is not paid or not paid in full, the unpaid amount will be written off to bad debt expense. When a patient remits a payment on an account that has already been written off to bad debt expense, the payment is recorded as a recovery of bad debt, which reduces bad debt expense. The organization does not report an estimate for the portion of bad debt expense that may have been likely to qualify for financial assistance under the hospitals charity care policy. The organization takes the position that ample opportunity and assistance is provided to the patient to qualify under the financial assistance policy. If sufficient information is not provided, the organization must assume the patient does not qualify.

Part III, Line 8 Part III, Line 6 Medicare allowable costs reflected in Part III come directly from the facility's Medicare cost report. The cost report segregates the total facility actual expenses into costs for support departments, clinical departments (routine and ancillary) and nonreimburseable departments. The cost report uses appropriate statistical bases to "step down" support costs to allowable clinical and nonreimburseable departments. The charges for clinical departments are matched to the total cost for these departments for a cost-to-charge ratio. Medicare-specific allowable costs for in- and outpatient ancillary departments are computed by applying the department-specific cost-to-charge ratio to the Medicare program charges by department. For routine departments, a per diem total cost is computed and applied to Medicare program days for the Medicare routine program cost Part III, Line 8. The total shortfall of Medicare reimbursement compared to computed Medicare allowable costs should be treated as community benefit. The hospital improves access to patient care by providing services regardless of a patients ability to pay or the hospitals ability to receive full cost reimbursement for services. The hospital also relieves the government of a financial burden when it provides care to publically insured patients where reimbursement is less than cost of providing the service.

Part III, Line 9b Part III, Line 9b The hospital has a written policy that describes collection practices applying to patients who qualify for charity care or financial assistance. If full assistance is approved, no collection efforts are pursued on that patient's account(s). If partial assistance is provided, the patient is responsible for the adjusted account balance and collection efforts will follow the established practices for all patients where a self-pay balance exists. Collection efforts are not pursued on any pending FAP account Specific criteria exist for how much assistance, partial or total, will be provided to the patient based on the assessed need. Criteria is based on Federal Poverty Guidelines and is reviewed and updated annually. Once a patient has been deemed eligible for the Patient Financial Assistance. Program (FAP), the patient is notified by letter within 60 days after receipt of the application and supporting documentation. The patient retains eligibility for a period of twelve months from the date of the approval. This eligibility is signaled to hospital admissions, billing and collection staff by the assignment of a specific financial class with accompanying eligibility dates. At the end of those twelve months, the patient is responsible for reapplying for FAP eligibility.

Quantified Community Benefit and Community Building Activities The financial information was prepared in accordance with the Catholic Health Association's community benefit reporting guidelines and IRS instructions. As a tax-exempt entity, BSSFHS is exempt from federal and state taxation. However, BSSFHS contributes value to the community that consistently exceeds the benefit of this tax exemption. Over the years, BSSFHS periodically has an independent analysis performed by outside consultants knowledgeable of tax law. The consultants help to quantify the value of its tax exemption including income, unemployment, real estate, property and excise taxes, and the benefit of being able to borrow at tax-exempt interest rates. This independent analysis provides BSSFHS with a baseline methodology to compare its cost of community benefit services and the taxes that it would pay if it were a taxable entity. For the fiscal year ending August 31, 2010, BSSFHS provided over \$3 million in community benefit services and community building activities at cost. This is well in excess of the value of its potential tax obligation.

Part VI, Line 2 Bon Secours St Francis currently participates in local needs assessments of the medically underserved in Greenville County on a quinquennial basis through the direction of Greenville Forward (a local community organization). The fiscal agents behind the most recent needs assessment include BSSFHS, Greenville Forward, Greenville Hospital System (GHS), the United Way of Greenville County and the Piedmont Healthcare Foundation. The first health care assessment was conducted in 1998. Subsequent assessments since then have reflected successes and critical areas for action. Part VI. Line 3 BSSFHS Charity Care/Patient Financial Assistance Policy BSSFHS is committed to ensuring access to health care services for all. As a health care provider, BSSFHS treats all patients, whether insured, underinsured or uninsured, with dignity, respect and compassion throughout admission, delivery of services, discharge and billing and collection processes BSSFHS addresses the needs of the uninsured by providing free or reduced fees on hospital services, community outreach efforts to assist with Medicaid and SCHIP enrol lment, and free community-based preventive and primary care services BSSFHS proactively s creens to identify individuals and their families who may qualify for federal, state or lo cal health insurance programs or the Bon Secours Patient Financial Assistance Program (FAP) and assist the potential eligible patients through the qualification process. Potentially eligible patients that do not qualify for a federal or state health insurance program ar e referred to the Financial Assistance Coordinator located in Patient Financial Services f or assistance in completing the documentation required to establish FAP eligibility. Patie nts are responsible for providing the information necessary to complete the documentation. The FAP aids uninsured and underinsured patients who do not qualify for government-sponso red health insurance and who communicate their inability to pay for their medical care. The FAP provides 100% financial assistance to uninsured patients with annual family incomes at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines (FPG), as adjusted by the Medicare geog raphic wage index for each community served to reflect that communitys relative cost of living (Adjusted FPG). A sliding scale assistance policy is afforded patients that exceed the income guidelines for 100% assistance. Sliding scale assistance is provided to patients between 200% and 400% of the Adjusted FPG and progressively declines in proportion to the patients higher income level Additionally, all uninsured (i.e. self pay) patients are given a reduction to the amount of the full charges for medically necessary services through a community service adjustment (CSA) The CSA is market adjusted and based on the payment discount received by other health care payers doing business in the community. For these platients, the FAP also sets a maximum annual family payment liability to ensure that no family suffers a catastrophic financial burden to receive necessary health care services. Bas ed on research conducted by the Tax Foundation, a non partisan tax research group based in Washington DC, the maximum annual family liability is based on a sliding scale determined by the family income and size. The standard sliding scale is adjusted by the Medicare geo graphic wage index of each community served to reflect that community's relative cost of Living. All patients are eligible for a Prompt Pay Discount. In addition, a variety of other potential payment options are available. This patient financial assistance policy is communicated to patients verbally upon registration, visible postings of the policy in common areas throughout the hospital, brochures and on BSSFHS website www.stfrancisehalth.org BSSFHS is dedicated to meeting the needs of non-English speaking patients BSSFHS staffs 3 full-time onsite Spanish translators, as well as offering a dedicated Spanish phone line. In addition, BSSFHS employs the telephone language service, Cyracom, which assists in mee ting any language needs that arise. The translation services are offered to non-English spleaking patients from admission to discharge, including the financial process Programs are available through St. Francis that assists with the financial burden of treatment of illne ss, one specifically being cancer. St. Francis uses funds received through the Susan G. Ko men Grant to provide free mammograms to women who qualify. In addition, Bon Secours St. Fr ancis Foundation offers financial assistance for oncology patients who cannot afford treat ment or travel Additionally, a new program is in development through the BSSFHS Batson Ca ncer Unit and Patient Financial Services departments that will hire an Oncology Patient As sistance Coordinator. This coordinator will responsible for utilizing existing drug and pa tient financial assistance resources to allow for maximum drug and service coverage along with minimum out-of-pocket expenses for our oncology patient population. Patient financial counseling and patient need assessments will also be conducted under this position. The c coordinator will determine patient qualifications for grants, drug cost recovery programs and other paying sources related to lack of insurance coverage or lack of benefits, non-covered services, or patient ability to pay out of pocket costs. This position will permit follow-up and maintain patient accounts that qualify for assistance. Finally, the coordinator will create and maintain a patient assistance da

tabase and train staff to interpret and assist with maintaining the database. Any collection attorneys or agencies used by BSSFHS commit to follow BSSFHS value-based procedure, including, without limitation, BSHSI/BSSFHS Code of Conduct, in pursuit of estates, garnishme nts and judgments for non-payment.

Part VI. Line 4 BSSFHS primarily serves Greenville County, which is comprised of approximately 425,000 residents with a growth of over 40.000 people each year Greenville County is the largest county in the state and one of the fastest growing with a 13% population increase over the past 8 years. Conveniently located along Interstate 85 and less than a two-hour drive to Atlanta, Georgia and Charlotte, North Carolina, Greenville County has become a premiere destination for capital investment that now totals approximately \$300 billion annually and is home to 170 corporate headquarters including Michelin North America, Bowater, and Kemet, Per capita income for Greenville County is an average of \$24,215 (Greenville County Health Assessment, 2008) 13 2% of residents in Greenville County are in households that fall below the federal poverty guidelines (US Census) Currently, 37 2% of Greenville County (169,000 residents) are medically underserved 14 4% are currently using or qualify for Medicare and/or Medicaid. Two specific populations with large growth rates in the county are the senior population, with a 17% growth of residents 60 an older since 2000, and the Hispanic population, with an estimated growth of over 1200% estimated between 1990 and 2013 (Greenville County Health Assessment, 2008) The major health problems plaguing Greenville residents are cardiovascular disease, cancer and stroke. Greenville County data from 2008 indicates an ageadjusted rate of 181 4 (per 100,000) for cancer deaths. State level data from 2008 indicates an age-adjusted rate of 186 3 (per 100,000) for cancer deaths. Prevalence of cardiovascular disease in Greenville County is 5.5%, whereas the state of SC has a prevalence rate of 4.6% Mortality rates for stoke for Greenville County reached an age-adjusted rate (per 100,000) of 51.6 in 2007, while the state of South Carolina had an age adjusted rate (per 100,000) of 53 3 (State of South Carolina, Department of Health and Environmental Control, Bureau of Community Health and Chronic Disease Prevention, County Chronic Disease Fact Sheet, February 2010) Risk factors that contribute to the incidence of these diseases are also an issue in Greenville County. County level data from 2008 indicates 23% of Greenville County residents smoke, compared to 20% of South Carolina Additionally, 65% of Greenville residents are overweight, not significantly higher than 64% reflected by the state Finally 42% of Greenville County residents have high cholesterol, not statistically different from 43% reflected by the state (State of South Carolina, Department of Health and Environmental Control, Bureau of Community Health and Chronic Disease Prevention, County Chronic Disease Fact Sheet, February 2010) BSSFHS uses these statistics to develop community programming in partnership with local agencies, as well as improve on services within the hospital. For example, the St. Francis Breast Health Center, which was recently granted a full accreditation designation by the National Accreditation Program for Breast Centers (NAPBC), offers free mammograms, breast ultrasounds, breast MRI's and needle biopsies for patients who are unable to pay for these breast procedures with the help of funds received by the Susan G. Komen Foundation. In addition, two full time Breast Health Navigators are available at no cost to patients who have mammogram results that indicate breast cancer, as well as those whose results are abnormal but non-cancerous They offer emotional support to ensure our patients know all of their options and understand exactly what to expect during their testing and treatment BSSFHS has two specialty services that are recognized centers of excellence. The first is a fully accredited bone marrow transplant program that is the first and only of its kind in the area and one of just two programs in South Carolina. The unit is currently undergoing major expansions that will more than double current capacity for both inpatient and outpatient services. In addition, BSSFHS is the only hospital in Greenville to offer Robotic Surgery in 2009

Part VI, Line 5 In 2008, BSSFHS conducted an analysis to identify the most vulnerable neighborhoods within the broader community The analysis was based on socio/economic factors including household income, education, social/linguistic isolation, access to healthcare, housing, and environment. The criteria to select the initial vulnerable community of focus included the vulnerability assessment, the number of BSSFHS employees living in the community and the importance of BSSFHS presence as an anchor institution in the community. The BSSFHS decided to select Greenvilles Sterling community to have a full-time employee who works exclusively with this community Sterling is one of the most low-income populations in Greenville County According to the 2000 Census, Sterling was listed as a neighborhood with nearly 40% of its residents earning less than \$15,000/year. The full time employees to the is Director of Community Relationship Building, tasked with coordinating efforts to unlite the community (Sterling and the wider Greenville area with Sterling) together as well as provide support for health and social issues. Specifically, the Director assesses the nieeds and assets of the community by conducting resident interviews, community forums, focu s groups, and community summits. Data received is not only being used to develop programs and services that will work to alleviate paramount issues within this vulnerable community, but also create a sustainable, vibrant, and healthy environment. The community building activities exist for the sole purpose of co-creating a healthier community with the reside nts from that community. As an advocate for health, the Director facilitates dialogues, fo cus groups, and other related activities that help residents, caregivers, professionals, and others from an array of diverse backgrounds to see the connection between health, econo mics, culture, and neighborhood/environmental design/infrastructure BSSFHS works with residents and various stakeholders to help promote positive change in Sterling through struct ured programming that empowers residents to make sustainable improvements in the areas of economic development and prosperity, environmental stewardship, and healthier lifestyle choices. Since the start of community building activities in the Fall of 2008 and throughout the 2009 calendar year, our efforts in Sterling have received wide community support and attention. The Director of Community Relationship Building spends considerable time monthly going door to door engaging the community of nearly 900 residents personally. He attends their events and meetings on a regular basis at local churches or community centers. He has held various community engagement and health advocacy related events to educate the community on things taking place as well as provide opportunities for residents to participat e directly in the process as decision makers. In the Fall of 2008, the Director of Community Relationship Building revitalized community building efforts to be more tailored to the community of focus, calling the effort The Sterling Phoenix League Into early 2009, the Sterling Phoenix League has seen over 100 participants rally behind the communitys effort to revitalize, rotating themselves across 8 different teams that were set up around the following areas Health & Wellness Economic Development Housing Peace & Safety Community Spirit Going Green (Environment trails, gardens, urban farms, recycling) Youth Engagement Sen ior Advocacy The community also designed a Master Plan to help guide infrastructure improv ements, promote economic development, and honor the character and history of the neighborh god. Sterling residents have been centrally involved in all aspects of the Sterling Phoeni x League, eventually having created their own Sterling Community Land Trust in 2009, which is the first land trust organization in South Carolina. The Director of Community Relationship Building has spent considerable time facilitating and building the capacity of this organization as it will likely be a more organized and vocal representation for the community's interests in terms of historic preservation, housing, and economic development for the community BSSFHS is slated to provide initial seed funding for the organization during the 2011 fiscal year (Fall 2010 calendar year). The Director of Community Relationship Building has met with the residents and facilitated their leadership development and capacity building and helped projects like the Land Trust, Sterling Trail System, Community Garde ns, Sterling Health & Wellness events and assessments, and the Master Plan to come to frui tion Monthly meetings are held and bring residents, key stakeholders and community agencies together for updates and work sessions, at times facilitating groups as large as 50 to 80 people. The Director of Community Relationship Building has sought to leverage existing programs, resources, and relationships (or bridge

new ones) within Sterling and from outside the community to cover costs, share costs, or more efficiently use established budgets

Part VI. Line 6 BSSFHS has an open medical staff with privileges available to all qualified physicians BSSFHS operates an emergency room at both of its hospitals which provide se rvices 24 hours a day, seven days a week to ensure access to needed emergency care for all persons. In 2009-2010, the health system was led in its mission to serve the community by a governing board that included 17 members, fourteen of whom are representative of the community Additionally, BSSFHS supports several community programs through the Bon Secours mission to be good help to those in need As part of this mission. BSSFHS provides dedicate distaff and services with the sole purpose of measuring the needs of the community and engaging community partners to address the needs. These include the Community Ministries depairtment, which has four full-time dedicated staff members, the Faith Community Nursing Program, LifeWise (a community initiative targeting adults 55 and older), and Open Arms Hospic e, a partnership providing the only community Hospice House in the region. These dedicated staff assist in the following programs and also work to build collaborative partnerships in the community Access to Oral Health Care Program Oral disease is the most common, yet preventable, chronic health problem among children - five times more common than asthma (C.D.C. Jan. 2005). BSSFHS in collaboration with the Community Health Alliance and the key ser vice. partners Greenville Technical College and New Horizon Family Health Services, Inc. (N. HFHS), improved access to oral health care through an integrated service partnership that links businesses, funding agencies, a dental hygiene training program, and a mobile medica I unit with a primary care provider. The target population for this program includes low income, uninsured and Medicaid-covered children and adults in Greenville and surrounding co unties. The overall objective is to improve their oral health status by ensuring access to comprehensive and sustainable oral health services. Two key activities to accomplish this objective are 1) a community-based dental clinic providing a full range of oral health's ervices, and 2) operation of a mobile dental unit that will travel to churches, schools, s helters, and other sites Both components provide preventive, primary and restorative care through Greenville Technical Colleges dental hygienist training program as well as NHFHS dentists. In 2009-2010, BSSFHS and the partners involved in this program were able to educ ate and provide direct service to 2.644 underserved children and over 900 underserved adults and seniors in Greenville County community Healthy Connections Healthy Connections (HC) is a collaboration among health care providers, Greenville County Schools, Communitiesin -Schools, and the United Way of Greenville County HC has staff in four Title I schools in Greenville County (a school is considered Title I when over 60% of students are eligible for free and reduced lunch) Each school involved in the HC program works closely with sch ool nurses and additional school staff to identify health-related problems of students and determine the barriers to receiving needed care Services provided by HC staff include co ordinating the childs health care appointments, accompanying the child to the appointment, age appropriate education during visits and follow-up with the childs family Particular attention is paid to the parent, child, and staff relationship Self-Care for Families with School ChildrenAnnually, BSSFHS provides each family with a 4 year old kindergarten stude nt residing in Greenville County a self-care manual/resource for accessing appropriate health care in Greenville. The self-care guides are purchased from the American Institute of Preventive Medicine, Health at Home, explains common medical issues and provides a decision tree for how to care for the problem at home and how and when to seek appropriate medical care. In 2009-2010, this health literacy project, A Healthy You, documented a six-month follow-up study concluding that 51% of families surveyed were able to avoid one or more vi sits to the doctor in the past 6 months because of the Health at Home book (22% said they were able to avoid a visit to the doctor 3-4 times) In addition, 58% of families thought that the Health at Home books saved them money on medical or health care in the past 6 mon ths and at least 67% thought it would save them money on health care in the next 6 months. The Faith Community Nursing ProgramIn addition to the volunteer parish nurses and lay heal th promoters who met the needs of their local congregations, BSSFHS employs three nurses who directly serve and minister to vulnerable populations. These Faith Community nurses work with organizations throughout Greenville, focusing on the needs of the underserved in local organizations such as Triune Mercy Center, Mercy Housings Mulberry Court and St Anthony of Padua Catholic Church These Faith Community

nurses keep the community healthy by helping people with major health issues connect to the appropriate resources available in the community with an emphasis on spiritual health B SSFHS is actively involved in National Cover the Uninsured Week each year, assisting with advocacy efforts to help more people in Greenville County receive coverage. In addition, strong partnerships exist with the following local organizations. United Way of Greenville County, New Horizon Family Health Services (a federally-qualified health center), Greenville Free Medical Clinic, Greenville Technical College, Greenville Forward, Greenville County, School District, Upstate Homeless Coalition, Mercy Housing, Meals on Wheels, and local c hurches and universities. These local organizations support BSSFHS to identify community nieeds, as well as gaps in services, and work collaboratively to improve the health and wellniess of Greenville County.

Bon Secours Health System will be recognized for its leadership in justice, transforming the communities in which we serve and work into places of health and hope, and being a prophetic voice for systemic US health reform and a more humane world BSSFHS is comprised of two general acute care hospitals (St. Francis – Downtown and St. Francis – Eastside) and a physician joint-ventured ambulatory surgery center (Upstate Surgery Center), all of which are located in Greenville, South Carolina St Francis downtown is located in downtown Greenville and has 245 licensed beds, 16 operating rooms and offers a full range of medical/surgical services. Core clinical areas of excellence include cardiology/CV surgery, orthopedics, and general surgery. St. Francis eastside is located on the eastside of Greenville County, the fastest growing area of county with regards to residential growth as well as commercial and business growth. This facility has 93 licensed beds (35 of which are Labor/Delivery/Recovery/Post-partum units) and eight operating rooms. Core clinical areas of excellence include OB/GYN, ENT, and orthopedics. The health system operates two emergency departments on opposite sides of the county to ensure that all persons, regardless of their ability to pay, have access to emergency care. The Upstate Surgery Center is a physician joint-ventured ambulatory surgery center that is located on the eastside of Greenville County, very close in proximity to St Francis eastside. This facility has two licensed operating rooms and the primary surgical procedures performed are ENT and ophthalmology
