**BY-LAWS
OF
FAMILY PROMISE OF LAS VEGAS, INC**

ARTICLE I: NAME

SECTION A The name of the organization shall be "FAMILY PROMISE OF LAS VEGAS, INC."

ARTICLE II: DEFINITIONS

SECTION A "Charter" - Shall mean the Certificate of Incorporation of Family Promise (The Corporation) as from time to time amended

SECTION B "Trustee" or "Trustees" - shall mean a member or members of the Board of Trustees of the Corporation who have become such in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws.

SECTION C "Board" - shall mean board of trustees of the Corporation

SECTION D "Homeless Family" - shall mean, but is not exclusively defined as, a group of people related in the first person, by marriage in the case of any adults and by blood or adoption in the case of children, consisting of one or more adult parents and one or more minor children, and any minor children that may be the issue of the minor children of the one or more adult parent.

A family may also mean two or more people who share goals and values, have long-term commitments to one another, and reside usually in the same dwelling place.

SECTION E "Whenever a masculine pronoun appears it is for convenience only and shall mean either male or female.

ARTICLE III: OBJECTIVES

SECTION A To organize, sponsor, and develop services and facilities for homeless families in Las Vegas and Greater Clark County, including providing and making available food, clothing, shelter and low cost housing and any local activity related to the furtherance of said objectives. Notwithstanding anything in the bylaws, this organization will at all times operate only within the confines of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, and operate exclusively for charitable purposes.

ARTICLE IV: BOARD OF TRUSTEES

SECTION A The business of the Corporation except as otherwise expressly provided by law or by the Articles of Incorporation, shall be managed by the Board of Trustees

SECTION B The Board of Trustees consists initially of nine (9) persons named as Trustees in the Charter. The number of Trustees serving on the Board may be changed from time to time by either adding or deleting members as deemed necessary by the board and voted on at their monthly meeting

SECTION C The term of the Board shall be two (2) years. The Board will be split into two groups of members at the first meeting thus allowing for only one half of the members to rotate off at the end of any given year. The election of Board members shall take place at the annual election meeting.

SECTION D Members of the board of Trustees may serve more than one term in succession with the approval of the remaining members of the Board.

SECTION E Any Board member may resign at any time giving written notice to the President or to the Board. Such resignation shall take effect at the time specified therein, and, unless otherwise specified therein, acceptance shall not be necessary to make it effective.

SECTION F Any Trustee may be removed, either with or without cause, at any time, by an affirmative vote of the majority of Trustees, at any meeting of the Board. Unexcused absence from three (3) consecutive regular meetings of the Board shall constitute cause for removal of any Trustee.

SECTION G At each meeting a majority of the Board members must be present to constitute a quorum. The decision of the majority present at any such meeting shall be the act of the Board. Whether or not there is a quorum at any meeting, the majority of Trustees who are present may adjourn the meeting from time to time to a certain day. The Trustees shall act only as a Board, and no individual Trustee shall have any authority as such.

ARTICLE V: OFFICERS

SECTION A The Board of Trustees will annually choose officers filling the positions of President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. These positions are voted upon by the members of the Board of Trustees. The term of service will be one year with the ability to be reelected to the same position one (1) time. The re-election may be extended by a supermajority of the board, consisting of a two thirds vote in the affirmative, to allow any officer to continue in their position past any time period of two years, to be voted upon annually. Elections of officers shall be held at the annual election meeting.

SECTION B The president shall preside at all meetings and the Board in general, shall perform all duties incident to the office of President, and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the board.

SECTION C The Vice President, in the absence of the President, shall preside at all meetings of the Board and in general, shall perform all duties incident to the office of President, and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Board.

SECTION D The Secretary shall keep the records and minutes of all meetings and attend to the Corporation's correspondence. The secretary shall perform all duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the President of the Board.

SECTION E The Treasurer is in charge and custody of, and is responsible for, all funds and securities of the Corporation and deposit all such funds in the name of the Corporation in such depositories as shall be designated by the Board. The Treasurer shall:

- 1) Render a statement of the condition of the finances of the Corporation at all regular meetings of the Board and a full financial report at the annual meeting of the Board.
- 2) Receive and give receipt for monies due and payable to the Corporation from any source whatsoever and, subject to the direction of the Board or of any committee thereunto authorized or of the President, pay out and supervise the disbursement of monies of the Corporation.
- 3) All disbursement of monies over two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) via check or draft or any other manner requiring a signature must have the signature of two (2) individuals, the treasurer and someone designated by the Board.
- 4) All checks, drafts, or other orders for payment of money, notes, acceptances, or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Corporation, shall be signed by such officers or agents, and in such a manner as shall be determined from time to time by resolution of the Board. Unless otherwise provided by the Board, endorsements for deposit to the Credit of the Corporation in any of its depositories may be made, without countersignature, by the President, Vice President or by any other officer or agents whom such power shall have been delegated by the Board, or may be made by hand-stamped impression in the name of the Corporation
- 5) In general perform all the duties incident to the office of the Treasurer, and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the president or by the Board.

ARTICLE VI: STANDING COMMITTEES

- SECTION A** The following are standing committees: Faith House Outreach, Finance, Public Relations, Technology, Board Development and Fund Development.
- SECTION B** The Board has the right to appoint an Ex-officio member to each committee should it desire.
- SECTION C** Ex-officio members of the committees shall not vote at committee meetings, except to resolve a tie vote. Each committee member present represents one (1) vote at any committee meeting.
- SECTION D** The Board shall at their discretion create or disband any standing committee or ad hoc committee.
- SECTION E** The Board shall appoint all committee chairpersons and approve activity at the committee level. All committee chairpersons must be a member of the Board.
- SECTION F** The Board shall make available guidelines for all standing committees. Said guidelines shall be reviewed and/or updated by the Board and the committee chairperson each year and a copy of said guidelines will be maintained with the Secretary as part of the Corporation's record.

ARTICLE VII: MEETINGS

- SECTION A** The regular meetings of the Board shall be held monthly unless otherwise specified by the Board.
- SECTION B** Special Meetings, if necessary, may be called by the President or a majority of the Board.

ARTICLE VIII: ANNUAL FINANCE REPORT

- SECTION A** The Treasurer shall be required to provide a financial report at the close of the Treasurer's term and to file copies of this report with the Board and with such other internal or external groups or individuals as the Board shall direct. The annual financial report shall become part of the permanent record of this corporation.
- SECTION B** The fiscal records of the organization shall be audited or reviewed each year, at the end of the fiscal year. The fiscal year end will be August 31.
- SECTION C** A brief monthly report is to be provided no less than three days before the monthly meeting.

ARTICLE IX: QUORUM

- SECTION A** A majority of the Board members present at any meeting shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE X: ELECTIONS

- SECTION A** A Nominating Committee shall be appointed by the Board at the regular scheduled meeting in October each year. Nominations shall be presented at the December Meeting at which time nominations may be made from the floor after the report of the Nominating Committee.
- SECTION B** Officers are to be elected at the regular December meeting. They shall take office at the conclusion of the regular December meeting.
- SECTION C** In the event of the vacancy of any elected officer, the Board shall call a special election to fill such a vacancy. Committee chairpersons shall be appointed by the Board. Such special elections are to take place at the regular monthly meeting.

ARTICLE XI: AUTHORITY

SECTION A The rules contained in "Robert's Rules of Order, Revised" shall govern this organization in all cases except when they conflict with the by-laws of this organization.

ARTICLE XII: AMENDMENTS

SECTION A The By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) super majority vote of the Board present at any regular meeting. The amendments must have been presented at the proceeding regular meeting of the organization and must not conflict with the provisions of this organization's charter.

SECTION B The Charter may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) super majority vote at the annual meeting. This may, but is not required to, include the vision and mission statements of Family Promise of Las Vegas.
