

School Without Walls (SWW) is a non-formal training program that serves the church in the countries of the former Soviet Union (FSU) by providing practically-oriented ministry training to the Next Generation of young Christian leaders who desire to multiply the impact of the church through practical ministry outreach to their communities, but who are unable to attend formal institutes of theological training. SWW students and graduates directly impact the mission of Russian Ministries by their involvement in evangelistic outreaches (summer camps, sports evangelism, social evangelism and others) and assistance with church planting and other ministry initiatives, all of which positively affect church growth. Currently, approximately 2,000 students receive training annually through SWW at 65 locations and more than 500,000 adults and children in the former Soviet Union have been positively impacted through their ministry outreaches.

4b (Code:) (Expenses \$ **60,036** including grants of \$ **60,036**) (Revenue \$)
Summer camps have proven to be one of Russian Ministries' most effective programs for evangelizing children in the former Soviet Union. Russian Ministries helped to launch the camping movement in 1999. Today thousands of children in the countries of Russia, Ukraine, Belarus and Moldova know about Christ as a result, including 7,630 children who attended one of 107 week-long sessions of summer camp in 2010. Not only do summer camps promote indigenous evangelism, an important component of Russian Ministries' mission, but they also contribute to church growth (another major component) as many children and their families begin attending church as a result of their experiences with summer camp and some go on to become Christian leaders in their churches and communities.

In response to the alarming number of homeless children in Russia and Ukraine, Russian Ministries initiated the "Home for Every Orphan" movement in 2008 to help place orphans and other homeless children in national Christian homes through adoption and foster care. Through partnering with two Western Christian organizations and seven national Christian organizations, Russian Ministries has already helped to place 1,000 homeless children in Russia and Ukraine in loving Christian homes. This initiative responds to the biblical mandate to care for orphans, while facilitating indigenous evangelism of children and contributing to church growth, two of Russian Ministries' major mission components
