FOR VALUE RECEIVED, IFF, an Illinois not-for-profit corporation ("Borrower"), HEREBY PROMISES TO PAY to the order of BLOWITZ RIDGEWAY FOUNDATION ("Payee"), at Payee's office at 1701 E Woodfield Rd., Suite 201; Schaumburg, IL 60173, or at such other place in the United States of America as the holder hereof may designate, the principal amount of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00), together with interest thereon at the rate or rates hereinafter set forth. Principal shall be repaid in equal quarterly installments, beginning, January 1, 2011 of five thousand dollars (\$5,000). The loan shall be repaid over a five (5) year period, for a period of twenty (20) quarters. The final maturity date of this Promissory Note is October 1, 2015 (the "Maturity Date"), on which date the Borrower shall repay all outstanding principal and interest borrowed under this Promissory Note.

Borrower shall make quarterly payments of interest. Borrower shall pay such interest, in like money, at said office, calculated at the rate specified below, quarterly on the first day of April, July, October, and January of each year during the term hereof, with a final payment of accrued interest on the Maturity Date.

Interest shall be calculated for each calendar quarter at the fixed rate of 2.75% per annum. Notwithstanding any language herein contained to the contrary, interest shall accrue on the outstanding principal amount after the Maturity Date, whether by lapse of time, acceleration or otherwise, at a per annum rate of 7.75%. Interest shall be computed on the basis of a 365-day year over the number of days elapsed in the quarter immediately preceding the payment date.

This Note evidences discussions between the Payee and Borrower, where it was decided that the loan be used in the Borrower's General Loan Fund. If Borrower shall at any time use any amounts due hereunder or any earnings thereon other than in the manner agreed upon or shall at any time cease to operate for its present purposes, then the balance of the principal sum of this Note then unpaid, together with interest accrued and unpaid thereon, shall be immediately due and payable.

Borrower shall pay and be obligated for any and all costs and expenses, including, without limitations, court costs and attorneys' fees and expenses, incurred or sustained by Payee by reason of or in connection with the enforcement and collection of this Note or the exercise of any of the rights, powers and remedies available under this Note, at law or in equity.

This Note may be prepaid by Borrower, in whole or in part, without premium or penalty, at any time or times, upon three (3) business days' prior notice to Payee, with accrued interest on the principal amount outstanding to the date of such prepayment. All payments hereunder shall be applied first to repayment of interest accrued and unpaid, then to repayment of principal outstanding and unpaid.

Each of the following occurrences is hereby defined as an "Event of Default":

- (a) Borrower shall fail to make any payment of principal, interest, or other amounts payable under the Note when and as due,
- (b) There shall occur any default or event of default, or a similar event shall occur or continue under any instrument, document, note or agreement delivered to the Payee in connection with the Loan, including, but not limited to, the Note,
- (c) Any representation, warranty, schedule, certificate, financial statement, report, notice or other writing furnished by or on behalf of Borrower to the Payee is false or misleading in any material respect on the date as of which the facts therein set forth are stated or certified; or,
- (d) Borrower shall fail to comply with any provision hereof, which failure does not otherwise constitute an Event of Default, and such failure shall continue for ten (10) days after notice thereof to Borrower by the Payee or any other holder of the Note

Upon the occurrence of any Event of Default and during the continuance thereof, the Payee or any other holder of the Note may declare the Note and any other amounts owed to the Payee to be immediately due and payable.

Payment of principal and interest shall be made in such manner as is acceptable to the holder hereof. Whenever any payment to be made hereunder shall be due on a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday under the laws of the State of Illinois, such payment may be made on the next succeeding business day.

Payee shall not, by any act or omission to act, be deemed to waive any of its rights, powers or remedies hereunder, unless such waiver is granted pursuant to a writing signed by Payee, and then only to the extent specifically set forth therein.

Borrower, for itself and on behalf of all of its successors and assigns, hereby waives presentment for payment, demand, notice of dishonor, notice of non-payment, protest, notice of protest and diligence in collection, and all other notices in connection with the delivery, acceptance, performance, default, non-performance, or enforcement of this Note.

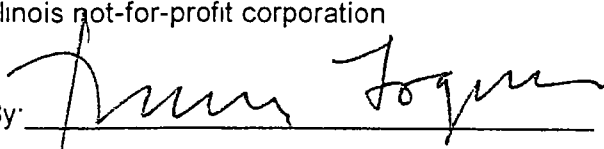
