In performing the calculations required for Part X, the only assets available to make charitable distributions is the cash available in a checking accounts in the name of Community Finance Corporation or its underlying disregarded tax entities This represents the calculated average of monthly cash balances of \$754,456 used in Part X (which also includes \$790,148 in cash - non - interest bearing as of the end of year book value on Page 2. Part II line 1 on the Balance Sheet) All other assets on the balance sheet are not included in the calculations in Part X because they represent assets on deposit with trustee/fiscal agents that are permanently restricted and cannot be accessed by Community Finance Corporation based on the provisions of legal documents such as trust indentures, loan agreements, promissory notes, and management agreements. These assets are on deposit with trustee/ fiscal agents and are the result of the issuance of publicly financed bond issues.
