NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This summary of significant accounting policies of Devon Horse Show and Country Fair Foundation (the Organization) is presented to assist in understanding the Organization's financial statements. The financial statements and accompanying notes are representations of the Organization's management, who are also responsible for their integrity and objectivity. These accounting policies conform to accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) and have been applied in the preparation of the financial statements.

Nature of Activities

The Organization is a nonprofit Pennsylvania corporation organized to maintain and improve the Devon Show Grounds located in Devon, Pennsylvania.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with GAAP.

Recently Issued Accounting Pronouncements

In September 2006, the FASB issued accounting guidance that defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value, and expands disclosures about fair value measurements. The Organization adopted this guidance on November 1, 2008, as required for its financial assets and financial liabilities. The FASB deferred the effective date of this guidance for one year as it relates to fair value measurement requirements for non-financial assets and non-financial liabilities that are not recognized or disclosed at fair value on a recurring basis. The Organization adopted the remaining provisions on November 1, 2009. The adoption did not have a material impact on the financial statements.

Date of Management Evaluation of Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through December 1, 2010, the date on which the financial statements were issued.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Cont'd.)

Promises to Give

Contributions are recognized when the donor makes a promise to give to the Organization that is, in substance, unconditional. Contributions that are restricted by the donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions expire in the fiscal year in which the contributions are recognized. All other donor-restricted contributions are reported as increases in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets depending on the nature of the restrictions. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to the unrestricted net assets.

The Organization uses the allowance method to determine uncollectible unconditional promises receivable. The allowance is based on prior years' experience and management's analysis of specific promises made.

Contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions.

Financial Statement Presentation

The Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets.

Concentration of Credit Risk

The Organization maintains its accounts with two banks. Cash balances with each bank in excess of \$250,000 exceed the insurable limit as allowed by FDIC. Total cash balances in excess of the insurable limit were \$828,754 at October 31, 2010.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

For the purpose of financial reporting, cash and cash equivalents consist of cash on deposit and certificates of deposit with maturity dates within three months of the date of acquisition.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Cont'd.)

Investment Income

Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets. Interest income and gains restricted by a donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions are met (either by passage of time or by use) in the reporting period in which the interest income is recognized.

Land

Land consists of land parcels and improvements located in Chester County, Pennsylvania which are used by the Devon Horse Show and Devon Country Fair for their annual event and known as the Devon Horse Show grounds. The total purchase price was allocated to land and is recorded at cost.

Property Improvements

Property improvements are stated at cost. Depreciation is provided under the straight-line and accelerated methods over the shorter of the estimated useful lives of the related property improvements or the estimated useful life of the asset.

Maintenance and repairs are expensed as incurred. Additions, betterments, and renewals, unless of minor amounts, are capitalized and depreciated. When property improvements are sold or otherwise disposed of, the cost and related accumulated depreciation accounts are relieved, and the resulting gain or loss is included in operations.

Intangible Assets

Intangible assets consist of loan placement fees and related costs which are amortized over the lives of the applicable loan. Amortization is expected to be \$4,300 through 2014 and \$1.792 in the fiscal year ended October 31, 2015.

Income Taxes

The Devon Horse Show and Country Fair Foundation is a nonprofit corporation organized under §501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, has made no provision for federal income taxes in the accompanying financial statements.

Depreciation expense was \$74,774 and \$53,201 for the years ended October 31, 2010 and 2009, respectively.

Contributed Services

A substantial number of unpaid volunteers have made significant contributions of their time to organize and supervise the Organization. No amounts have been recognized in the accompanying statement of activities, because the criteria for recognition of such volunteer time under ASC 958-605 (*Not-for-Profit Entities — Revenue Recognition*) have not been satisfied.

6. Mortgage Payable

The Organization has a mortgage payable in monthly installments of \$7,817 including interest at 5.75% of the outstanding principal balance and is secured by the Horse Show grounds and the guarantee of the Devon Horse Show and Devon Country Fair, Inc. The loan is due March 1, 2030. The amount outstanding at October 31, 2010 and 2009 was \$993,948 and \$1,125,658, respectively.

7. Second Mortgage Payable

In April 2005, an individual lent the Organization \$1,000,000 on an interest-free basis to be repaid in April 2015. The loan is secured by a second mortgage on its grounds and was recorded at fair value based upon the market interest rate (7%) at the loan's inception, and the difference was recorded as contribution revenue. The fair market value of the loan at 7% was determined to be \$497,633. The difference of \$502,367 was recorded as contribution revenue in the year received. Interest expense on the note of \$49,466 and \$46,131 has been imputed and recorded for the fiscal years ended October 31, 2010 and 2009, respectively, and has been added to the loan balance. The loan balance at October 31, 2010 and 2009 is \$733,733 and \$684,267, respectively.

8. Due to Affiliate

The Organization owes the Devon Horse Show and Country Fair, Inc. \$9,900 of which \$9,800 is for reimbursement of prizes in the three-gaited saddle horse class as of October 31, 2010. The Organization owed the Devon Horse Show and Country Fair, Inc. \$5,800 for services paid on their behalf as of October 31, 2009.

9. Net Assets - Designated

The Board has approved setting aside \$100,000 annually to be used toward the satisfaction of the mortgage obligations. During the fiscal years ended October 31, 2010 and 2009, the Organization received \$100,000 in promises to give for the Devon Horse Show and Country Fair, Inc. The mortgage is paid down in the year the promise is received.

10. Temporarily Restricted Net Assets

11. Endowment Fund

Permanently restricted net assets at October 31, 2010 and 2009 consist of an endowment fund established from a bequest under the will of Walter J. Mooney. The sum of \$100,000 is to be maintained as long as the Organization includes a three-gaited saddle class in its show or until the Organization dissolves. In the event the above happens, the principal balance plus accrued income will be paid to Bryn Mawr Hospital. The income is to be used annually to provide a suitable trophy and/or cash prize in a three-gaited saddle horse class at The Devon Horse Show.

11. Endowment Fund (Cont'd.)

The Organization has adopted investment and spending policies based on the requirements of the State Uniform Management of Institutional Funds Act (SUMIFA). As a result of the Organization's interpretation of SUMIFA, and in accordance with donor restrictions, contributions to the endowment fund are classified as permanently restricted net assets. The historic dollar value of those contributions must be maintained inviolate. Income from the fund is classified with temporarily restricted net assets until the purpose restriction is satisfied. When the purpose restriction is met, the net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets.

The donor-restricted endowment fund is invested in a Certificate of Deposit pursuant to the Organization's investment and spending objectives of subjecting the fund to low investment risk and providing its three-gaited program with current income. The Organization generally expends the endowment fund's investment income for the donor-designated purpose in the fiscal year following receipt.

12. Related Party Transactions

The Organization reimbursed Devon Horse Show and Country Fair, Inc. \$9,800 during the year ended October 31, 2010 (See Note 8). The Organization and Devon Horse Show share a common Board of Directors.

The Devon Horse Show and Country Fair, Inc. use the grounds owned by the Organization to maintain its operations. The parties have entered into a ten-year lease which expires February 2015 with annual lease payments of \$97,512. The Organization has waived the collection of this rent. As a result, the Organization has recorded rental income and a related in-kind contribution expense of \$97,512 for the use of the property for both years ended October 31, 2010 and 2009.

The Devon Horse Show and Country Fair, Inc. contributed \$100,000 each year to be used for the satisfaction of the mortgage obligations (See Note 7) for the years ended October 31, 2010 and 2009. The Devon Horse Show and Country Fair, Inc. contributed an additional \$13,944 for gallery renovations in the year ended October 31, 2010.
