- (i) The taxpayer is filing this statement to preserve its ability to make a qualified electing fund ("QEF") election for a taxable year after the election's due date (a "retroactive" election).
- (ii) Reasonable Belief Statement: The U.S. Shareholder ("Shareholder") filing this Protective Statement ("Statement") reasonably believes that Far Eastern Hong Xin Co., Ltd (the "Company" or "FEH") should not be treated as a passive foreign investment company ("PFIC") for the tax year ended December 31, 2009.
- (iii) IRC Sec. 1297 defines a "PFIC" as any foreign corporation if (1) 75 percent of more of the gross income of such corporation for the taxable year is passive income, or (2) the average percentage of assets held by such corporation during the taxable year which produce passive income or which are held for the production of passive income is at least 50 percent. "Passive income" is any income which is of a kind which would be foreign personal holding company income under IRC Sec. 954(c) and legislative history. Further, IRC Sec. 1297(c) provides that, where a foreign corporation owns directly or indirectly at least 25 percent of the stock of another corporation, for purposes of determining whether such foreign corporation is a PFIC, such corporation shall be treated as if it (1) held its proportionate share of the assets of such other corporation, and (2) received directly its proportionate share of the income of such other corporation.
- (iv) The "active financing exception" of IRC Sec. 954(h) provides that income from a financing activity in which a foreign corporation is predominantly engaged and with respect to which it conducts substantial activity is active (and not passive) income.
