PLAN AND AGREEMENT OF MERGER

THIS PLAN AND AGREEMENT OF MERGER (the "**Agreement**") is dated as of the 1 day of November, 2010, by and between GENOCIDE INTERVENTION NETWORK, INC., a Delaware corporation ("**GI-Net**"), and SAVE DARFUR COALITION, a District of Columbia non-profit corporation ("**SDC**"; sometimes hereinafter together with GI-Net, the "**Constituent Corporations**").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, SDC is a non-stock corporation organized and existing under the laws of the District of Columbia;

WHEREAS, GI-Net is a non-stock corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Delaware;

WHEREAS each of SDC and GI-Net has obtained tax exempt status as a 501(c)(3) entity pursuant to the pertinent provisions of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended;

WHEREAS, SDC and GI-Net believe they can better achieve their respective goals by combining their operations; and

WHEREAS, the board of directors of each of SDC and GI-Net deem it desirable, upon the terms and subject to the conditions herein stated, that GI-Net be merged with and into SDC and that SDC be the surviving corporation (the "**Merger**") in accordance with the terms and provisions set forth in this Agreement, Title 8, Chapter 1 of the Delaware General Corporation Law (the "**DGCL**"), and Title 29, Chapter 3, Subchapter I of the District of Columbia Nonprofit Corporation Act (the "**DCNCA**").

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual obligations and undertakings set forth herein, GI-Net and SDC hereby agree as follows:

Section 1 Terms of Merger.

1.1 **Merger of GI-Net with and into SDC.** In accordance with, and subject to, the provisions of this Agreement, GI-Net shall be merged with and into SDC, which, at and immediately after the Effective Time (as defined below), shall be and is hereinafter sometimes referred to as the surviving corporation (the "**Surviving Corporation**"). At the Effective Time, the identity, existence, corporate organization, purposes, powers, objects, franchises, privileges, rights, immunities, restrictions, assets, debts, liabilities and duties (collectively, the "**Corporate Rights**") of SDC shall continue in effect and be unimpaired by the Merger, and the Corporate Rights of GI-Net shall be merged with and into SDC, which shall, as the Surviving Corporation, be fully vested in accordance with §259 of the DGCL and §29-301.44 of the DCNCA.

1.2 Name. Following the Merger, the name of the Surviving Corporation shall be "Save Darfur Coalition".

1.3 Membership Rights. Neither SDC nor GI-Net has any members, and following the Merger the Surviving Corporation shall have no members.

Section 2 Closing; Effective Time of Merger.

2.1 Closing Date. Subject to the satisfaction or waiver of the conditions to closing set forth in Section 7 of this Agreement, the closing of the Merger contemplated hereby (the "Closing") shall occur on a date to be agreed to by GI-Net and SDC (the "Closing Date"), which date shall be no later than December 31, 2010. GI-Net and SDC shall each use its reasonable efforts to complete all administrative and logistical preparations for the Merger as soon as practicable in order to facilitate a Closing Date of November 1, 2010, if practicable, or as soon thereafter as is practicable.

2.2 Actions at Closing. On the Closing Date, GI-Net and SDC shall cause to be filed (a) with the Secretary of State of the State of Delaware the Certificate of Merger, annexed hereto as Exhibit A and (b) with the Office of the Mayor, Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs for the District of Columbia, the Articles of Merger, attached hereto as Exhibit B. The Certificate of Merger and the Articles of Merger shall be executed and delivered in the manner provided in §256 of the DGCL, and §29-301.42 of the DCNCA, respectively.

2.3 Effective Time. The Merger shall become effective upon the later of the filing of the Certificate of Merger with the Secretary of State of the State of Delaware and the filing of the Articles of Merger with and the subsequent issuance of a certificate of merger by the Office of the Mayor, Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs for the District of Columbia (such later time being the "Effective Time"), which filings shall occur on the Closing Date.

Section 3 Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Surviving Corporation.

3.1 Articles of Incorporation. Immediately following the Effective Time, the articles of incorporation of SDC attached hereto as Exhibit C shall be the articles of incorporation of the Surviving Corporation, and shall continue in effect until further amended in accordance with the terms thereof and applicable law.

3.2 Bylaws. Immediately following the Effective Time, the bylaws annexed hereto as Exhibit D shall be the bylaws of the Surviving Corporation and shall continue in effect until further amended in accordance with the terms thereof and applicable law.

Section 4 Directors, Officers and Staffing of Surviving Corporation.

4.1 Board of Directors. Immediately following the Effective Time, the Board of Directors of the Surviving Corporation (the "New Board") shall consist of 14

individuals, who shall be the persons listed on the attached Exhibit E, each of whom shall serve in such role until their respective successor is duly elected and qualified or until their earlier resignation or removal.

4.2 Officers. Immediately following the Effective Time and subject to Section 4.3(b)(i) and (ii) below, the officers of the Surviving Corporation shall be the persons listed on the attached Exhibit F, each of whom shall serve in such role until their respective successor is duly elected and qualified or until their earlier resignation or removal.

4.3 Staffing Activities. Immediately following the Effective Time:

(a) the individuals listed on the attached Exhibit G shall constitute the Hiring Committee of the Surviving Corporation which shall continue the search for a new President. The Constituent Corporations hereby agree that such new President may serve the role of "Executive Director" of the Surviving Corporation, as the New Board may determine in its sole discretion;

(b) the following individuals shall be appointed to serve the Surviving Corporation in the staff positions and upon the terms and conditions set forth below:

- (i) Mark Hanis shall serve as "President" of the Surviving Corporation on an interim basis and report to the New Board, until his successor is duly elected and qualified or until his earlier resignation or removal;
- (ii) Sam Bell shall serve as "Executive Director" of the Surviving Corporation on an interim basis and report to the President, until his successor is designated by the New Board or until his earlier resignation or removal; and
- (iii) Mark Lotwis shall serve as "Senior Director of Campaign Advocacy" of the Surviving Corporation and as a member of senior staff.

4.4 Benefits. Immediately following the Effective Time, the Surviving Corporation shall provide employee benefits (the "Employee Benefits") (including, without limitation, medical, vision and dental health insurance, paid holiday and vacation time, paid sick leave and the right to participate in a 403(b) or similar retirement plan(s)) to former GI-NET employees employed by the Surviving Corporation on terms substantially equivalent to those provided by GI-NET, provided that such terms shall be no less favorable than the terms applicable to employee benefits provided to any current SDC employee.

Section 5 Representations and Warranties.

5.1 Representations and Warranties of GI-Net. In order to induce SDC to enter into this Agreement and to consummate the transactions contemplated hereby, GI-Net represents and warrants to SDC as follows:

(a) Organization and Corporate Power of GI-Net. GI-Net is a non-profit corporation duly organized, validly existing and in good standing under the laws of the State of Delaware, is duly qualified to do business as a foreign corporation in the states listed on Schedule 5.1(a), and has all requisite corporate power and authority to own, lease and operate its assets and to carry on the activities which are currently conducted by it. True, correct and complete copies of the articles of incorporation and bylaws of GI-Net as amended to date, have been made available to SDC by GI-Net.

(b) Authorization of GI-Net. GI-Net has all requisite corporate power and authority to enter into this Agreement, to take and perform all procedures and acts required by it to consummate the transactions contemplated by this Agreement in accordance with the terms hereof, and otherwise to fulfill its obligations under this Agreement. The execution and delivery by GI-Net of this Agreement and any other agreements, documents and instruments to be executed and delivered by GI-Net pursuant hereto, and the consummation by GI-Net of the transactions contemplated hereby and thereby and the performance of its obligations hereunder and thereunder, have been duly and validly authorized by all necessary corporate actions of GI-Net, and no other corporate proceeding on the part of GI-Net is necessary under any provision of law to authorize the execution and delivery by GI-Net of this Agreement and any other agreements, documents and instruments to be executed and delivered by GI-Net pursuant hereto or to consummate the transactions contemplated hereby. This Agreement has been duly and validly executed and delivered by GI-Net.

(c) Enforceability. This Agreement and the agreements, documents and instruments executed and delivered by GI-Net pursuant to this Agreement constitute valid and binding agreements of GI-Net, enforceable against GI-Net in accordance with their respective terms, except to the extent that (a) such enforcement may be subject to any bankruptcy, insolvency, reorganization, liquidation, fraudulent transfer, moratorium or other laws, now or hereafter in effect, relating to or limiting creditors' rights and remedies generally and (b) the remedy of specific performance and injunctive and other forms of equitable relief may be subject to equitable defenses or to the discretion of the court before which any proceeding therefor may be brought.

5.2 Representations and Warranties of SDC. In order to induce GI-Net to enter into this Agreement and to consummate the transactions contemplated hereby, SDC represents and warrants to GI-Net as follows:

(a) Organization and Corporate Power of SDC. SDC is a non-profit corporation duly organized, validly existing and in good standing under the laws of the District of Columbia, is duly qualified to do business as a foreign corporation in the states listed on Schedule 5.2(a), and has all requisite corporate power and authority to own,

lease and operate its assets and to carry on the activities which are currently conducted by it. True, correct and complete copies of the articles of incorporation and bylaws of SDC as amended to date, have been made available to GI-Net by SDC.

(b) Authorization of SDC. SDC has all requisite corporate power and authority to enter into this Agreement, to take and perform all procedures and acts required by it to consummate the transactions contemplated by this Agreement in accordance with the terms hereof, and otherwise to fulfill its obligations under this Agreement. The execution and delivery by SDC of this Agreement and any other agreements, documents and instruments to be executed and delivered by SDC pursuant hereto, and the consummation by SDC of the transactions contemplated hereby and thereby and performance of its obligations hereunder and thereunder, have been duly and validly authorized by all necessary corporate actions of SDC, and no other corporate proceeding on the part of SDC or its members is necessary under any provision of law to authorize the execution and delivery by SDC of this Agreement and any other agreements, documents and instruments to be executed and delivered by SDC pursuant hereto or to consummate the transactions contemplated hereby. This Agreement has been duly and validly executed and delivered by SDC.

(c) Enforceability. This Agreement and the agreements, documents and instruments to be executed and delivered by SDC pursuant to this Agreement constitute valid and binding agreements of SDC, enforceable against SDC in accordance with their respective terms, except to the extent that (a) such enforcement may be subject to any bankruptcy, insolvency, reorganization, liquidation, fraudulent transfer, moratorium or other laws, now or hereafter in effect, relating to or limiting creditors' rights and remedies generally and (b) the remedy of specific performance and injunctive and other forms of equitable relief may be subject to equitable defenses or to the discretion of the court before which any proceeding therefore may be brought.

Section 6 Covenants.

6.1 Access to Information. Between the date hereof and the Effective Time, each of GI-Net and SDC shall provide the other with reasonable access to its books, records and properties during normal business hours. Should the Merger not be completed, SDC and GI-Net agree to return promptly all information and documents exchanged during the Merger negotiations and such information shall remain subject to the Non-Disclosure Agreement executed by the parties as of May 27, 2010 (the "Non-Disclosure Agreement").

6.2 Conduct of Business of Company. Between the date hereof and the Effective Time, each party shall, except as agreed to by the other party or as otherwise provided herein, continue to conduct its business in the ordinary course and consistent with past practices.

6.3 Reasonable Efforts to Complete Merger. Each party shall use its reasonable efforts to satisfy the other party's conditions to closing and to effectuate the

transactions contemplated hereby. GI-Net and SDC shall cooperate with one another to plan for an orderly integration of their activities and operations on the Effective Time.

Section 7 Conditions to Closing.

7.1 Conditions to Obligations of GI-Net. The obligation of GI-Net to enter into the transactions contemplated by this Agreement at Closing is subject to the following conditions:

(a) The representations and warranties of SDC set forth in Section 5.2 of this Agreement shall be true and correct in all material respects;

(b) SDC shall have performed in all material respects all obligations required to be performed by it under the terms of this Agreement including, but not limited to, obtaining all material consents required to be obtained by SDC and filing all notices, documents and other instruments necessary and required under any material contract or applicable law by which SDC is bound, except where the failure to obtain any such consents and to make any such filings could reasonably be expected to not have a material adverse affect on the Surviving Corporation; and

(c) GI-Net and SDC shall have mutually agreed to an operating budget for the Surviving Corporation which shall be effective for the remainder of the fiscal year ending September 30, 2011.

7.2 Conditions to Obligations of SDC. The obligation of SDC to enter into the transactions contemplated by this Agreement at Closing is subject to the following conditions:

(a) The representations and warranties of GI-Net set forth in Section 5.1 of this Agreement shall be true and correct in all material respects;

(b) GI-Net shall have performed in all material respects all obligations required to be performed by it under the terms of this Agreement including, but not limited to, obtaining all material consents required to be obtained by GI-Net and filing all notices, documents and other instruments necessary and required under any material contract or applicable law by which GI-NET is bound, except where the failure to obtain any such consents and to make any such filings could reasonably be expected to not have a material adverse affect on the Surviving Corporation; and

(c) GI-Net and SDC shall have mutually agreed to an operating budget for the Surviving Corporation which shall be effective for the remainder of the fiscal year ending September 30, 2011.

Section 8 **Miscellaneous.**

8.1 **Amendment.** At any time prior to the filing of the Certificate of Merger with the Secretary of State of the State of Delaware and the filing of the Articles of Merger with the Office of the Mayor, Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs for the District of Columbia, this Agreement may be amended or abandoned by the Boards of Directors of GI-Net and SDC to the extent permitted by the laws of the District of Columbia and the State of Delaware notwithstanding favorable action on the Merger by either or both of the Constituent Corporations. No such amendment shall be effective unless in a writing executed by the both parties hereto.

8.2 **Termination.** This Agreement may only be terminated prior to the Closing (a) by agreement of the parties, (b) by either party, by written notice to the other, if the Closing has not occurred on or before December 31, 2010, other than by reason of a breach by the terminating party of its obligations hereunder, or (c) by either party, upon the material breach by the other party of its obligations hereunder, provided that the terminating party has given the other party notice of such breach and the other party has not cured such breach within 30 days following such notice.

8.3 **No Implied Waiver.** Any failure of any party to comply with any obligation, covenant, agreement or condition contained in this Agreement may be expressly waived in writing by the other party to whom the obligation is owed. Notwithstanding the foregoing, no failure or delay on the part of either party hereto to exercise any right, power, or privilege hereunder shall operate as a waiver nor shall any single or partial exercise of any right, power, or privilege preclude any other further exercise thereof or the exercise of any other right, power or privilege.

8.4 **Notices.** All notices and other communications required or permitted to be given to any party under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be delivered in person against written receipt therefor, by overnight delivery service maintaining records of receipt, or by facsimile transmission confirmed by overnight delivery service maintaining records of receipt, to such party at the address set forth below or at such other address such party designates by notice to the other party in accordance with this Section 8.4:

All notices and communications shall be deemed to have been received: (i) in the case of personal delivery, on the date of such delivery; (ii) in the case of facsimile transmission, on the next business day after the date on which the sender receives confirmation by facsimile transmission that such notice was received by the addressee; and (iii) in the case of overnight delivery service, on the first business day following the day sent.

8.5 Publicity. All external communications about the Merger or this agreement shall be jointly approved by GI-NET and SDC prior to being issued or publicly released. The Merger shall be publicly described as "SDC and GI-NET are joining forces."

8.6 Entire Agreement. Except for the Non-Disclosure Agreement executed by the parties as of May 27, 2010, this Agreement constitutes the complete agreement of GI-Net and SDC with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior agreements, discussions and understandings with respect thereto.

8.7 Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the District of Columbia, without regard to the conflict of laws provisions thereof.

8.8 Successors and Assigns. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their permitted successors and assigns. No party may assign its rights or obligations hereunder to any other person or legal entity without the prior written consent of the other party.

8.9 Third-Party Beneficiaries. Nothing in this Agreement, expressed or implied, is intended or shall be construed to confer upon or give to any person, firm, corporation, or legal entity, other than the parties hereto and their permitted successors and assigns, any rights, remedies or other benefits under or by reason of this Agreement.


8.10 Interpretation. As used herein, unless the context otherwise requires, the singular shall include the plural and vice versa, words of any gender shall include words of any other gender, "or" is used in the inclusive sense, and the term "herein" or words to similar effect shall refer to this Agreement as a whole rather than the specific section or paragraph where such term appears. Headings are included for convenience only, do not constitute a part of this Agreement, and shall not be used to construe or interpret this Agreement.

8.11 Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, all of which together shall evidence a single agreement.



The Secretary is to mail any such process to the Surviving Corporation at 1025 Connecticut Avenue, NW Suite 310, Washington, DC 20036.
