On January 27, 2010, The Mark Wentworth Home filed Chapter 11 under the United States Bankruptcy Court District of New Hampshire.

On April 30, 2010, the Bankruptcy Court confirmed the Home's plan of reorganization. The confirmed plan provided for the following:

Assets Limited as to Use - The Home's assets limited as to use were determined to be beyond the reach of creditors due to their restricted nature.

Secured Debt - The Home's \$14,000,000 of secured debt was exchanged for a \$10,000,000 secured note and a payment of \$100,000.

Interest Rate Swap - The Interest Rate Swap Agreement with Lehman Brothers was settled for \$113,577 to be paid in three annual installments of \$37,859 beginning June 10, 2010.

Living Innovations, Inc. Claim - This unsecured claim of approximately \$209,000 was settled for \$12,540.

General Unsecured Claims - Each unsecured claim in this class (total \$55,126) could elect to receive either:

- a. distribution in cash equal to 3% of the claim, or
- b. three equal annual distributions in cash equal to 2% of the claim.

Claims of \$2,000 or less - Each holder (total of \$14,325) was entitled to receive 4.5% of the claim.

On April 30, 2010, the Home accounted for the reorganization using fresh-start reporting. Accordingly, all assets and liabilities are restated to reflect their reorganization value, which approximates fair value at the date of reorganization.
