NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1 - Summary of significant accounting policies

Nature of activities - Kinney Drugs Foundation, Inc. (the "Foundation") is a private charitable foundation. The Foundation was established to foster better health care throughout Central and Northern New York and Vermont by giving grants to organizations that are dedicated to help in the support of quality health care.

Basis of presentation - The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Accounting Standards Board's (the "FASB") authoritative guidance on financial statements of not-for-profit organizations. Under this guidance, the Foundation is required to report information regarding its assets, liabilities, revenues and expenses according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets and permanently restricted net assets.

Contributions and contribution receivable - Unconditioned promises to give are recognized as contribution revenue in the period received. Contribution receivable is stated at the amount management expects to collect from outstanding balances. Multi-year contributions are discounted to their present value using the prime interest rate. At December 31, 2010, contribution receivable due in less than one year is \$65,475; from one to five years is \$17,403 and the discount on the contribution receivable is \$1,803. At December 31, 2009, contribution receivable due in less than one year is \$65,292; from one to five years is \$23,257 and the discount on the contribution receivable is \$2,311.

Unrestricted net assets - Unrestricted net assets consist of the net assets of the Foundation that are neither temporarily restricted nor permanently restricted by donor-imposed stipulations. These amounts are available for the support of operations. The Foundation has no temporarily restricted or permanently restricted net assets.

Grants - Grants are recorded as an expense if they are unconditional and approved by the Board of Directors for payment. Multi-year grants are discounted to their present value using the prime interest rate.

Investments - Investments are reported at fair value in accordance with the FASB's authoritative guidance on accounting for certain investments held by not-for-profit organizations. The Foundation's investment process seeks to achieve a predictable, reliable and continuous source of funds to support the grants from the Foundation. Funds are invested in a well diversified asset mix, which includes primarily equity and fixed income securities, that is intended to result in a consistent inflation protected rate of return.

Fair value and financial instruments - Fair values of financial instruments are based upon quoted market prices where available. If such quoted market prices are not available, fair values are based upon models that primarily use, as inputs, observable market-based parameters. Valuation adjustments may be made to ensure that financial instruments are recorded at fair value and may include amounts based upon unobservable parameters. Any such valuation adjustments are applied consistently over time. The FASB issued authoritative guidance on fair value

measurements that defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value under generally accepted accounting principles, and expands disclosures about fair value measurements (See Note 7.)

Revenue recognition - All dividend and interest income from investments in securities is recognized as revenue when earned.

Income taxes - The Foundation is exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code as an exempt private operating foundation.

The Foundation has reviewed its operations for uncertain tax positions and believes there are no significant exposures. The Foundation will include interest on income tax liabilities in interest expense and penalties in operations if such amounts arise. The Foundation is no longer subject to Federal examinations by tax authorities for years before 2007.

Contributed services and facilities - During the years ended December 31, 2010 and 2009, the value of contributed services and facilities (other than the Foundation's administrator's salary, as disclosed in Note 5) meeting the requirements for recognition in the financial statements was not material and has not been recorded. These consisted mainly of accounting and administrative volunteers and facilities.

Cash and cash equivalents - The Foundation considers all highly liquid investments with a maturity of three months or less when purchased to be cash equivalents.

Financial instruments and credit risks - The Foundation maintains cash balances, which may exceed the amounts insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC), at one financial institution. Amounts in excess of FDIC insurance limits are subject to normal credit risk. The Foundation's investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest, market and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect the net assets of the Foundation.

Use of estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Subsequent events - Management has evaluated subsequent events through May 24, 2011, the date which the financial statements were available for issue. There have been no subsequent events that would require disclosure or adjustment to the financial statements.

Note 2 - Investments

Investments are presented in the financial statements at fair value and are subject to normal market fluctuations. Investments consisted of the following:

On April 17, 2008, Kinney Drugs, Inc. purchased all of the common stock of Kinney Drugs, Inc. held by the Foundation through their Joint Offer to Exchange. The terms of the agreement for the sale of the stock consisted of a 30% cash payment and 70% in the form of a promissory note. At the date of the sale, there were 29,083 shares with a fair market value of \$2,617,470. Therefore, \$785,241 was received in cash and \$1,832,229 was recorded as a promissory note. The note bears interest at the rate of 5% per annum, payable on a quarterly basis. The principal payments will be paid in April 2012 and April 2015 and will be equal to the greater of one-half of the original principal amount of the note or 80% of the appraised value of one-half of the number of shares originally purchased with the note. The promissory note is subject to credit risk.

Note 3 - Grants payable

Grants payable in more than one year are discounted to their present value at the time the grants are made using the prime interest rate. Grants payable are payable in the following periods:

Note 4 - Income taxes

The Foundation is exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code as an exempt private operating foundation. However, private operating foundations are subject to an excise tax on net investment income. The excise tax was 2% of net investment income for the years ended December 31, 2010 and 2009. The excise tax expense was \$2,470 and \$1,790 in 2010 and 2009, respectively. The Foundation received a refund of \$438 and \$2,857 in 2010 representing 2009 and 2008 overpayments, respectively.

Deferred excise taxes arise from unrealized gains or losses on investments. At December 31, 2010 and 2009, deferred excise taxes are not material to the Foundation's financial statements and, therefore, have not been recorded.

Note 5 - Related party transactions

Certain Board members of the Foundation are also members of the Board of Directors of Kinney Drugs, Inc. The Foundation receives support from Kinney Drugs, Inc. for the continuance of the Foundation, including cash contributions, contributed services and use of facilities. In 2010 and 2009, the Foundation received cash contributions of approximately \$155,000 and \$180,000, respectively, from Kinney Drugs, Inc. The Foundation's administrator's salary is paid by Kinney Drugs, Inc. The Foundation recognized approximately \$49,100 and \$49,000 as contribution revenue and salary expense in 2010 and 2009, respectively. Certain Board members and employees of Kinney Drugs, Inc. have pledged contributions to the Foundation. Contribution receivable includes approximately \$45,000 and \$42,000 from Board members and employees at December 31, 2010 and 2009, respectively.

Note 6 - Agency transaction

The Foundation sponsors an annual fundraising campaign on behalf of the Children's Miracle Network ("CMN") through sales of CMN balloons in the Company's stores. This annual fundraising campaign raised the following funds that were remitted to CMN in addition to the amount remitted from the Foundation's resources:

As the specified beneficiary of the balloon sales was CMN, these funds have been excluded from the Foundation's revenue and expenses in the accompanying statements of activities.

Note 7 - Fair value measurements

The FASB's authoritative guidance on fair value measurements provides a framework for measuring fair value under generally accepted accounting principles. The guidance applies to all financial instruments that are being measured and disclosed on a fair value basis.

As defined in the guidance, fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. In determining fair value, various assumptions are utilized, including assumptions about risk and/or the risks inherent in the inputs to the valuation techniques. These inputs can be readily observable, market corroborated, or generally unobservable inputs. Based on the observability of the inputs used in the valuation techniques, the Foundation is required to provide the following information according to the fair value hierarchy. The fair value hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). Level 2 inputs are inputs other than quoted prices included in Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability. Financial assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis include investments. The Foundation's investments are reported at fair value utilizing Level 1 and 2 inputs.
