On June 24, 2008 the Wenner-Gren Foundation awarded a grant in the amount of \$125,000 to the Department of Social and Cultural Anthropology at the National University of Mongolia. The purpose of the grant is to upgrade the institutional capacity of the Department of Social and Cultural Anthropology in order to make the department an institution that offers internationally sound anthropological research and training in Mongolia, and thus establish the field of socio-cultural anthropology firmly in Mongolia.

The specific objectives of the project are to 1) develop a sound doctoral program that meets international standards, 2) train four new doctorates jointly with the Mongolian and Inner Asian Studies Unit (MIASU) and the Department of Social Anthropology, University of Cambridge, and recruit them as faculty members in the Department of Social and Cultural Anthropology, and 3) build an up-to-date resource collection on socio-cultural anthropology and upgrade technical capacity of the department.

The grant covers the period January 1, 2009 through December 31, 2013. The grant is being disbursed in five annual installments of \$25,000. The \$25,000 installment for the period January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010 was paid in two installments: \$7,500 on December 11, 2009 and \$17,500 on January 26, 2010. The annual progress report and financial accounting for the 2010 installment were received in January 2011 and are attached to this tax return.

Annual Narrative Report (2009-2010 Second year second installment)

Background

According to the project plan, in the second year, we had following tasks to perform, for instance to send two of our doctoral students to Cambridge to study and work under the supervision of their supervisors for one full term, to develop two syllabi for our PhD curriculum development and to send one faculty member to Cambridge for one month to develop the courses syllabi under Cambridge anthropologists supervision, to purchase books necessary for the two chosen courses and to purchase three PCs. The project implementation of the current has completely accomplished with success. In the following I provide details of actions took place in the range of the project.

PhD students in Cambridge

The first and the most important task was to send two PhD students to Cambridge. They were obliged to take courses, get supervision from their supervisors, develop their PhD project, write essays and conduct library research. The students, I.Byambabaatar and J.Lhagvademchig, arrived in Cambridge by the mid of January 2010 just before the commencement of the Lent Term. J.Lhagvademchig worked under the supervision of Prof C Humphrey and developed his research project on Mongolian Buddhism while I Byambabaabar supervised by Dr D Sneath on ecological change nomadic pastoralism. All of their costs to stay in Cambridge were covered from the project as it is planned.

Development of doctoral courses

Prof D.Bumochir worked in Cambridge for one month to develop two PhD course syllabi. The visit took place during the stay of the two PhD students, therefore it was beneficial to organize and guide them in Cambridge. The two courses were developed during the trip was *Power and Politics of Mongolia and Inner Asia* and *Anthropology and Area Studies: Anthropology of Russia, Central Asia and China*. The former was advised and co-designed by Dr D Sneath and the later by Prof C Humphrey and Dr E U Bulag. In addition to developing the syllabi the project also purchased books to be used in the courses. Since both of the courses are to be with anthropological regional studies most of the books were on Anthropology of Mongolia, Inner Asia, China, Central Asia and Russia. Since the chosen books were not general anthropology but regional studies their costs were relatively high and not available on sale. Therefore, chapters of

rare books were photocopied as well as articles from journals for the restricted use of the department only.

Doctoral student stipend

As we planned in the project starting from this academic year the project offers small grant for the four chosen PhD students. The amount of the grant is 100USD per month per person. For those who spent three months in Cambridge received 900 USD each in total because they received other benefits to stay in Cambridge. While the other two PhD student who did not visit Cambridge this time were funded 1200USD each.

Purchase and installment of personal computers

The project purchased three PCs for PhD students use. Two of the PCs are specifically for the two selected PhD students enrolled in the program and the remaining one is for the general use of the rest of PhD students of the department. All the PCs now have internet connections and necessary office programs installed.

In the third year of the project in 2011 we plan to send two of our PhD students to Cambridge. Their stay will commence from January 2011 when the Lent term starts. This is year Mr P Chuluunbat and Ms B Tsetsentsolmon will study in Cambridge. They will work under the supervision of Prof Caroline Humphrey, Dr E Bulag and Dr D Sneath.

Prof L Munkh-Erdene will visit Cambridge to develop two PhD course syllabi which will be taught in Mongolia in the following year. The two courses are *Anthropology and History* and *Political Economy of Nomadic Pastoralism*. Necessary books will be purchased and articles and chapters will be photocopied along the development of the courses.

Two PCs will be purchased for the use of the departmental graduate students specially for those involved in the project.

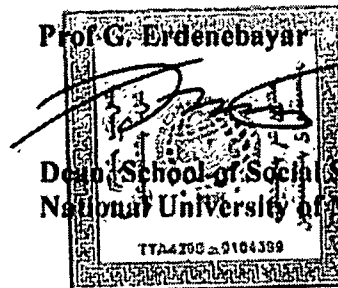

On June 24, 2008 the Wenner-Gren Foundation awarded a grant in the amount of \$125,000 to the Museum of Anthropology at the Universidad Nacional de Cordoba. The purpose of the grant is train professionals who will undertake research teaching and application of archaeology, social anthropology and bioanthropology, prioritizing two main research lines: 1) culture and politics, emphasizing human rights, violence, multiculturalism, identity and politics; and 2) material culture and ways of life, placing special attention on social archaeology, hunter gatherers, environment, technology, heritage and museum studies.

The specific objective is to equip graduates with the necessary knowledge, skills and experience to carry out their activities from an integrative and interdisciplinary perspective, training them to contribute to the enrichment of these sciences and their applications. The goal within five years is to: 1) enlarge the number of doctorates in anthropology in the University's PhD program, 2) augment the number of ongoing research projects, 3) increase international relations, 4) integrate graduate teaching in the degree program, and 5) stimulate greater involvement of anthropology in non-academic realms.

The grant covers the period January 1, 2009 through December 31, 2013. The grant is being disbursed in five annual installments of \$25,000. The \$25,000 installment for the period January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010 was paid on February 16, 2010. The annual progress report and financial accounting for the 2010 installment was received in January 2011 and are attached to this tax return.

Annual progress report 2010

The Anthropological Doctoral Program at the Museum of Anthropology of Córdoba aims to prepare professionals for research and academic education in Anthropological Sciences, with specialized training in the three classic sub-areas of research: social anthropology, archaeology and bioanthropology.

The program began in 2009 and we can summarize the goals met during the first year in the following items:

- a. We fulfilled the legal and administrative obligations of the doctorate, in accordance with existing national regulations
- b. We acquired equipment, both for classroom and field work, as well as books for updating the library of the Museo de Antropología.
- c. We organized 3 courses with visiting professor from Brazil and USA
- d. We obtained a grant from the National Ministry of Science and Technology to invite one teacher from Brazil.
- e. We opened the enrolment of students, with 70 applicants, of which 55 were eligible (39 in Social Anthropology, 14 in Archaeology and 2 in Bioanthropology), coming from different provinces of Argentina and abroad.

During 2010, the second one of development of the five years program, we began with the execution of the second phase of the project, which is centred on courses given by both local and guest instructors, the execution of research seminars based on ongoing projects at the Museum, and on field work carried out by the students. This stage will last 30 months, but in the first 12 months it was planned to focus the efforts on courses and in preparing students for field work.

According to this plan, we can say that during this year we have accomplished all of the goals that were planned for this period, according to the proposed schedule:

- a. There were held 11 courses covering the three fields of anthropology: 3 courses in bioanthropology, 3 courses in archaeology and 5 courses in cultural anthropology (See Appendix 1).
- b. We counted with the visit of four foreign professors:
 - i. Dr. Michael Crawford, from the University of Kansas, and one of the partners of our project, dictated a course on Anthropological Genetics.
 - ii. Dr. Mercedes Saldo Puerto, from the Universidad de Guatemala and member of the Equipo Argentino de Antropología Forense, dictated a course on Forensic Anthropology
 - iii. Dr. Els Lagrou, from the Universidad Federal do Rio de Janeiro, Brazil (one of the other partner of the project) dictated a course on Anthropology of Art.
 - iv. Dr. Pierre Lemonnier, from the Université de Provence, France, dictated a course on Anthropology of Material Culture and Everyday Objects.
- c. We had invited Dr. Denise Arnold, from the Instituto de Lengua y Cultura Aymara, de La Paz, Bolivia, to give a course on Andean ethnography at the end of this year, but we have to reschedule it for the beginning of the next one, due to the agenda of Dr. Arnold.
- d. The other courses were dictated by professors of the Museo de Antropología, who are members of the staff of the project, and by professors from other universities of Argentina (Universidad de Buenos Aires, Universidad Nacional de Rio Negro, Universidad Nacional de La Plata).
- e. In total, 290 students took the different courses of the doctorate. Approximately 85 % of them have passed them successfully.
- f. There was held a research seminar on lithic technology based on an ongoing project at the Museum, directed by Dra. Roxana Cattáneo.
- g. We have acquired 62 books, in Spanish and in English, for updating the library of the Museo de Antropología.
- h. We have received 15 projects of the students to begin their dissertation research, which are now under evaluation by the academic committee of the doctorate.
- i. Eight of these students are working at research projects at the Museum of Anthropology

In summary, we can say that we have not only fulfilled all the goals of the second year of development of the project, but we made more progress than we originally planned for this year.

In order to measure the success of the program during its progress, we had devised a series of fulfillment indicators as an indirect assessment of the degree of achievement of the development

goals. In the following table we summarize the activities we had planned for the second year, their respective foreseen fulfilment indicators and the status of their implementation.

Plans for 2011

For the next year we will continue with the planned actions in our proposal in the IDG, and until now we have not planned to introduce any significant change.

For 2011 we proposed to:

- Continue with the courses, given by both local and guest instructors,
- Acquire books as well as field and office equipment.
- Grant outstanding students to undertake fieldwork
- Hold meeting for discussion of projects and evaluations between teachers and students.

As we put in the IDG application, we hope that upon completion of this year, students will have: continued their training, acquired theoretical content through participation in required courses; and, obtained their first experience of intensive fieldwork. Through a meeting of all students and teachers by the end of the year, in which ideas and experiences are shared, students are expected to reach a higher level of reflexive thinking which would enable them to improve their next phase of fieldwork.

The continuous updating of the library will enhance the possibilities of the students to prepare for their exams as well as their future theses.

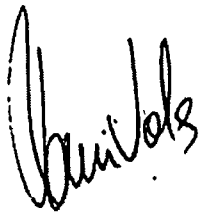

On June 2, 2009 the Wenner-Gren Foundation awarded a grant in the amount of \$125,000 to the Department of Sociology and Anthropology at Tribhuvan University. Through a collaboration with Cornell University, the department aims to improve the theoretical and methodological training of Ph.D students and upgrade the credentials of current faculty who do not hold a Ph.D. The IDG grant will be used to upgrade the current curriculum, provide modest support for research, intensify international exposure and exchange and build up the library and electronic resources. Currently in Nepal, the research agenda in anthropology is frequently determined by NGOs and development agencies where many of the students and faculty gain their experience. The IDG will allow more freedom for the department itself to determine its academic concerns. A primary aim is to significantly improve the theoretical and methodological capacity of the anthropology department as opposed to applied/development anthropology, thereby allowing the department to be competitive and contribute internationally.

The grant covers the period January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2014. The grant is being disbursed in five annual installments of \$25,000. The first annual \$25,000 installment for the period January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010 was paid on December 9, 2009. The annual progress report and financial accounting for the 2010 installment were received in January 2011 and are attached to this tax return.

2010 Progress Report – Tribhuvan University, Kathmandu, Nepal

The Institutional Development Grant was awarded to the Department of Sociology and Anthropology, Tribhuvan University, Kathmandu, Nepal. Through a collaboration with Cornell University, the department aims to bring improve the theoretical and methodological training of Ph.D students and upgrade the credentials of current faculty who do not hold a Ph.D. The IDG grant will be used to upgrade the current curriculum, provide modest support for research, intensify international exposure and exchange and build up the library and electronic resources. Currently in Nepal, the research agenda in anthropology is frequently determined by NGOs and development agencies where many of the students and faculty gain their experience. The IDG will allow more freedom for the department itself to determine its academic concerns. A primary aim is to significantly improve the theoretical and methodological capacity of the anthropology department as apposed to applied/development anthropology, thereby allowing the department to be competitive and contribute internationally.

Faculty in the Department of Sociology/Anthropology at the central campus of Tribhuvan University, Kirtipur, Nepal, have been energetic in starting the work. To date, a faculty committee has designed an ambitious core curriculum for the doctoral program, significantly enriching the previous tutorial-only program with three compulsory seminars: one an intensive survey of anthropological theory; another on research design and proposal-writing; and a third on South Asian ethnography. Faculty members have already met and are collaborating with faculty at Cornell. In January at a joint meeting the participating project members worked to approve and revise syllabi for these seminars, as well as to establish selection criteria and procedures for the first 5 month student research grant, 3-month faculty research grant, 2 international conference travel awards, and the one-semester exchange student fellowship for study at Cornell. The first exchange doctoral student is expected to arrive at Cornell in August 2010.

Dr. Gregory Maskarinec of Univ of Hawaii who now has a Fulbright Visiting Fellowship to come to Nepal will be giving some lectures on theories and methods in anthropology to Ph.D candidates during the Fall semester 2010. While the course outline determined at the January meeting is already in use and Ph.D. candidates have begun meeting to discuss the theoretical and methodological issues relevant to their respective projects. In the Fall, the department hopes to increase the regularity and intensity of these meetings.

Attached herewith is an accounting for the 2010 calendar year expenditures on the Wenner-Gren Institutional Development Grant for the Central Department of Sociology/Anthropology at Tribhuvan University in Nepal, which is being administered financially by Cornell University (Agreement No. 59722-9157) under a special agreement, which does not assess any F&A against the grant.

The attached table reiterates the originally agreed upon disbursement of funds (columns a, b, c, d & g) and reports on spending prior to December 31, 2010, at Tribhuvan University (column e) or Cornell (column h), as well as the date of projected expenditure of the remaining funds at Tribhuvan University (column f) or Cornell (column i).

Most of the funds have been expended as proposed, although in some instances—international conference travel for Tribhuvan faculty and health insurance for visiting doctoral student at Cornell—the budgeted allotment proved inadequate. Fortunately, we were able to obtain supplemental funds from the Association of Nepal and Himalayan Studies (for conference expenses) and the Department of Anthropology at Cornell (for health insurance). Although the actual costs of conference participation exceeded the allocated amount, we have saved \$550 because we received supplemental support from ANHS. We would like to carryover this amount for academic year 2011-2012 for the same line.

The main discrepancy between proposed and actual work is that the projected arrival of the visiting doctoral student from the Tribhuvan program to Cornell was postponed from the fall 2010 semester to the spring 2011 semester because of difficulties in getting all the relevant policies and procedures into place quickly enough to select, admit and process visa clearances for the fall 2010 semester. The faculty involved in this aspect of the IDG will have to meet to decide whether to continue a spring semester placement for this fellowship in 2012 and beyond, or whether, now that the process has been established, it is desirable to return to the original plan of having the Tribhuvan doctoral candidate participate at Cornell in the fall semesters.

On November 16, 2010 the Wenner-Gren Foundation awarded a grant in the amount of \$125,000 to the Archaeological Studies Program (ASP) at the University of the Philippines. The grant is to provide assistance to ASP to develop an archaeological science based PhD program at the University of the Philippines. This goal is both challenging in terms of physical and human resources as investing in them with limited funding sources has always been a predicament. In meeting this challenge, the ASP faculty has developed a program that will initiate a new laboratory or expand existing ones and developing the human resources through the training of PhD students with the skills and research capability of specific archaeological science approaches. The program entails that every year a specific laboratory will be the focus of development through the procurement of necessary equipment, supporting the training and research of a PhD student in collaboration with our expert/specilalist/colleague/s. At the end of the IDG program, ASP will be having five functional laboratories, manned by capable personnel with PhDs, that will be used to train prospective PhD students working in the Southeast Asian Region.

The grant covers the period January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2015. The grant is being disbursed in five annual installments of \$25,000. The first annual \$25,000 installment for the period January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2011 will be made in January 2011.

On August 14, 2008 the Wenner-Gren Foundation awarded a grant in the amount of \$65,000 to the Royal Anthropological Institute to support the Royal Anthropological Institute's Urgent Anthropology Fellowship Program. I am writing to request a no-cost extension to my RAI fellowship in urgent anthropology through October 2010 in order to complete final fieldwork this summer and write-up of my project results this autumn. My project, "Using Local Knowledge to Assess Environmental Change and Restoration in Coastal Marine Ecosystems," seeks to contribute to our need to better understand and management changing coastal marine ecosystems of vital importance to indigenous peoples of the North Pacific. To date my investigations into marinescapes in Southeast Alaska and Sakhalin Island, Siberia have revealed, among other things, critical connections between indigenous areas of historical occupation and use and contemporary coastal hotspots for biocultural diversity and ecological restoration. As testimony to the urgency of the project, recently, I was invited to testify in front of a special session of the Alaska State Legislature's Fisheries Committee on my findings concerning the depleted status of Pacific herring, a critical biological foundation and cultural keystone species, and its effects on coastal ecosystems.

Unfortunately, due to recent volcano activity, which grounded flights in the UK for parts of this spring, I was not able to complete a planned fieldwork trip to Alaska, and have rescheduled the trip for July and August 2010, along with a second trip to Siberia. Upon completion of this fieldwork and compilation of the results, I propose to submit my final report by 1 November 2010.

Also, please note I have recently accepted a permanent post in the UK, as Senior Research Fellow and MSc Course Director at the Environmental Change Institute, School of Geography and Environment, University of Oxford. My full contact details are listed below.

Interim Project report on Religious Narratives of Uyghurs in Xinjiang

Rahile Dawut

My project work is nearing completion. With the generous support of the RAI during these two years of project work, we have not only documented a lots of disappearing religion rituals; even more importantly, we have gotten to know a great deal of local knowledge related to religion and other field. This project has been our best chance so far to improve our understanding of religion life of Uyghurs in Xinjiang.

Unfortunately, during these two years, various circumstances in China and in Xinjiang particularly affected our field work to rural area in Xinjiang at some degree. After a riot in Urumqi on July 5, 2009 in Xinjiang, conducted field research in rural area become very difficult. We have to postpone some of our field work since the hash political situation in this region. From July, 2009 to the June, 2010, the Internet has been completely unavailable throughout Xinjiang, and as a result, we cannot access the research materials related to our field. Despite these various obstacles and limitations, we did our best to document more religious voices of disappearing culture.

One of my project work is about Shrine(*Mazar*) visitation among the Uyghurs. Big shrine visitation provide a space for epic narration, songs, and poetry related to Islam and Sufism, and that, due to Xinjiang's political environment and the fact that at this point most performers of these works are elderly, these cultural aspects are in danger of disappearing; therefore, I set aside a great deal of time to record these examples of folk culture.

My next focus is about Sufi Sisterhood among the Uyghurs.

Since the Sufi sisterhood and religious rituals regarded as superstition and illegal religious activities and banned in many area their cultural space withdrew and the

practices associated with them are quickly disappearing. Some Sufi Sisterhood begin to perform their rituals underground. So we spent an amount of time to document the practices, narratives, and rituals which are still performed among the women Sufi communities.

In order to obtain the most comprehensive record of *Mazar* and women Sufi practices, we carried out ethnographic research in three traditional Uyghur centers--Hotan, Kashgar and Turpan. We documented one big shrine festival and oral epic narratives related to religion in Hotan. Two women's Sufi sisterhood in Kashgar, one women's Sufi sisterhood and one man's Sufi brotherhood in Turpan. In all of them, we recorded and videotaped the rituals, the music and songs, the chants, the narratives, the dance, and other artistic expressions. Now we are going to write ethnographies on Religious life of Uyghurs according to the findings.

We have edited video and audio recordings of some of the materials we had. Our interview materials have also been fully edited and organized. Now we are on the process of making a number of ethnographic films on the basis of these materials. We are also currently preparing these materials for use as a teaching resource. We are going to work on English translation of the ethnographic materials in the coming months. At present, I have published two articles on the basis of this research.

Since our video documentations comes from different Sufi groups and Mazars in different area so how to organise these video materials and make an ethnographic film become a problem we face currently. Maybe it is better to make three different ethnographic film according to the contents.

The RAI fellowship in Urgent Anthropology (2009/10) was granted to the project "Anthropological and ethnological research and documentation among the inhabitants of the Nicobar Islands" with Dr. Simron Jit Singh as the principle investigator. The fellowship is hosted by the School of Anthropology and Conservation, Kent University, U.K. The project was prepared with the following objectives of (a) provide further support in the rehabilitation process on the Nicobar Islands, (b) prepare a selection of scientific publications, and (c) prepare a digital archive for access by the Nicobarese community. The progress towards these objectives is as follows:

Support in the rehabilitation process

Soon after the tsunami of 2004, a fund to support the self-rehabilitation efforts of the Nicobarese community was created with the help of three major donors (Caritas Austria, Universal Music Company, and Klagenfurt University). The fund is called Sustainable Indigenous Futures (SIF) Fund. Dr. Simron Jit Singh was the advisor to the fund and had the critical function to liaison with various stakeholders on the islands, undertake monitoring and evaluation, as well as prepare progress reports. Until 2009, the SIF fund handled projects directly with the indigenous councils and the Nicobar Youth Association (NYA), following which the steering committee of SIF decided to collaborate with the Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS), Mumbai, who have long standing credibility in development and disaster relief work, with an office in Port Blair, the capital of the Andaman & Nicobar Islands. This decision was taken to relieve Singh of the difficult and multiple roles in this process, and to engage a responsible organisation as a go-between based in India and the islands.

An agreement was signed with TISS in summer 2009, with the commitment that Singh would spend some months with the TISS team in Port Blair and train them to take over the rehabilitation projects. These projects relate to the revival of livelihoods (through establishing a network of co-operative societies) and capacity building (through setting up of island knowledge centres – IKCs). From 15 October to 30 November 2009, Singh closely collaborated with the members of the Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS) in Mumbai and Port Blair, with the aim to train and guide the team who are engaged in these projects. This phase of engagement was, in large part, achieved with the support of the RAI fellowship. Presently the TISS team is strongly engaged in field work, surveys, community mobilisation and institution building. Singh receives regular feedback from TISS and maintains only a soft advisory function.

Scientific publications

Since the beginning of 2010, Singh has been able to spend some time to write up several scientific publications based on the data collected over the past years. Having withdrawn to a great extent from the SIF process, the RAI fellowship made it possible to allocate some time to writing. Two visits to the School of Anthropology and Conservation, Kent University, U.K. were made in 2010 (March and July) for discussions with colleagues (Dr. Raj Puri and Prof.

Mike Fischer in particular) and searching for anthropological literature to support the scientific publications. The progress of these publications is as follows:

Digital Archive

Singh has carried out extensive field research among the inhabitants of Central Nicobars since 1999. In addition to material from his own field research, Singh has also searched historical archives and museums abroad for useful, documents and documentation on the Nicobarese culture and way of life. With the tsunami and its aftermath, such culture and Nicobarese way of life has seen certain degree of transformation. From time to time several from the Nicobarese community have expressed their wish to revive what can be revived, or at least set up a documentation centre that shows their way of life. Over the years, to this end, Singh has proposed, within the framework of the RAI fellowship, to build up a digital archive of documents, and audio-visual material and make it available to the A & N Administration (Archives Department) and the community (via the Island Knowledge Centres), and

elsewhere under different terms and conditions. The main target group users of this archive will be the community, tourists, students and researchers. Progress towards this objective is as follows:

1. With the guidance of Prof. Mike Fischer at Kent University, a concept has been drawn up for the archive, and software has been agreed. Discussions on the technical details such as resolution of images and documents, file format, structuring of data, etc. has been discussed that now needs to be tested.
2. Discussions with Dr. Heide Leigh-Theisen (former curator of insular SE Asian collections, Museum of Ethnology Vienna) took place and sought her support in building this archive by way of advice as well as assist in finding a suitable technical solution in the scanning of images and documents in Vienna. Dr. Leigh-Theisen has been a close collaborator on Singh's research on the material culture of the Nicobarese for many years.
3. Discussions are ongoing with the relevant departments of the Andaman and Nicobar Administration, as also with the Chief Secretary himself, for housing the archive in Port Blair and on the Nicobar Islands and to draw up terms and conditions for its access.
