MID-CAREER GRANT PROGRAMGoals and Objectives

The James Marston Fitch Charitable Foundation, Inc. (the "Foundation") is being established in recognition of the unique contribution of Dr. Fitch to historic preservation in the United States. Its purpose is to advance the study and the practice of the preservation of the historic architectural heritage in the United States. The Foundation advances and supports preservation through a special research grant program as well as through such educational activities as seminars and lectures.

Mid-Career Grant Program

The Foundation will provide annual research grants in historic preservation to mid-career professionals. The grants are intended to support innovative original research and creative design which advance the practice of preservation. Projects must demonstrate usefulness to practitioners and the results must be in publishable form. The grants are to be regarded as incentives for innovative work rather than as a prize for past accomplishments

Eligibility

Grants will be available to qualified mid-career professionals with established backgrounds in historic preservation or related fields. Candidates must have an advanced or professional degree and 10 years professional experience in historic preservation or in related fields such as architecture, landscape architecture, urban design, planning, law, engineering, archaeology, architectural history and the decorative arts. The project must be relevant and useful to the preservation community in the United States. The Foundation will not discriminate based on race, sex, ethnicity, age, religion, disability or sexual orientation.

Application Process

An announcement of the grant program will be made each year. Approximately seven (7) months before the application is due, a press release describing the Foundation, its goals, and the requirements of the grant program and application will be mailed to approximately two dozen publications in the United States specializing in the field of historic preservation, architecture, architectural history, and related fields as well as to all existing university programs in historic preservation. The announcement will describe the criteria for selection, the details for the proposals and the submission deadline for that year. The administrator's name and the Foundation's address and telephone number will be given in the announcement.

Proposal Requirements

Applicants will be required to submit three (3) copies of their proposals. The proposal must contain: a brief description of the project and the work product, not to exceed three (3) pages; a schedule of work and budget showing how the grant money will be applied; a curriculum vita, including professional and academic background and past and present grants received; and, two (2) letters of support for the project.

- background, qualifications and professional experience of the applicant

Selection Process

The administrator will answer all inquiries by mail and telephone. No applications will be considered which arrive in person after, or are postmarked after, the deadline stated in the grant announcement. As applications are received, the administrator will log them in and hold them until all the applications are received. The administrator then sends the applications to the Board members and makes sure that everyone has had at least two weeks to review them.

All members of the Board of Directors will review each of the applications and grade them privately, using the letters A, B, C, F, and Does Not Apply. The applications are discussed at a special grant review Board meeting. If it is clear that there will not be a quorum, the meeting date will be rescheduled until a time when there will be a quorum. Board members will discuss each application in that meeting. When a Board member cannot attend, the member will have the option to hand in his or her grading sheet, which is consulted during the discussion at the Board meeting. Members can also consult by telephone. As a result of the discussions, the applications are narrowed to approximately ten (10). At the end of the discussion, the Board members present at the meeting vote to determine who will be awarded the grant(s).

Grant Award

The recipient(s) will be notified by mail. The main award will be divided into four (4) equal payments, to be made by check to the awardee. The first payment is upon award of the grant. Progress reports are required for the second and third payments. The final payment will be made only after the final report is submitted and approved. Projects are required to be completed within twelve (12) months of the grant award, except when an extension is approved by the Board of Directors. A Board member will be assigned to follow the progress of the awardee and to review and approve the progress reports and the final report, in consultation with the administrator and the chairperson.

Final and completed studies are required to consist of one complete original with appropriate illustrations and two complete copies. The Foundation requires that its grant is acknowledged in all publications and reserves the right to publish the results if it chooses to do so. Proper credit will be given to the author/recipient.

David Owen Tryba, FAIA, received the Richard Blinder Award for his proposal, *Denver's Civic Center Park*. David Tryba is Founding Principal of the firm, David Owen Tryba Architects, with a design philosophy grounded in modern contextual urbanism and the respect for historic context while using modernist design techniques.

Mr. Tryba's *Denver's Civic Center Park* project will document the process of achieving consensus to relocate the Colorado Historical Society and Museum within Denver's Civic Center Park. While bringing together diverse constituencies to site the Historical Society, History Museum, and Stephen H. Hart Reading Room within Civic Center Park, Mr. Tryba will document and illustrate how he builds support among these groups and the processes he employs. This documentation will provide guidance and insight to other cultural institutions contemplating the marriage of a new structure with a beloved historic landscape.

The Richard Blinder Award is generously underwritten by Beyer Blinder Belle, Mrs. Richard Blinder, and donations made to the Fitch Foundation in memory of Richard Blinder.

Kirk Huffaker received the Fitch Mid-Career Grant Award for his proposal, *The Architecture of W.A. Sarmiento: Defining Downtown Banks at Mid-Century*. Mr. Huffaker is Executive Director of Utah Heritage Foundation and actively involved with the Recent Past Preservation Network.

Mr. Huffaker's project will include research and photography of prominent bank architect W.A. Sarmiento's work throughout the United States. As Director of Design for the Bank Building and Equipment Corporation (BBC) from 1954-1965, Sarmiento helped the BBC to become the largest bank designer in the United States. Sarmiento's innovative design strategies and use of cutting-edge building techniques brought the best of mid-century modern architecture to Main Street. First Security Bank in Salt Lake City, Utah, designed by Sarmiento in 1955, was saved from demolition by the Utah Heritage Foundation and received a National Honor Award from the National Trust for Historic Preservation for its rehabilitation in 2006.

The James Marston Fitch Charitable Foundation, founded in 1988, was established to recognize the unique contribution of Dr. Fitch to the field of historic preservation in the United States. The purpose of the foundation is to advance the study and practice of preservation by supporting preservation endeavors through a research grant program as well as publications, seminars and lectures.

2009 James Marston Fitch Charitable Foundation Grantees

This year, the Fitch Foundation will award two grants to three individuals. While the projects vary in topic and scope, the Board believes that in their unique way, each tackles subjects that are much discussed in the field today.

Ned Kauffman, *Intangible Cultural Heritage: Identifying and Protecting the Intangible Dimensions of Buildings, Sites and Places* \$5000:

Kauffman will attend the ICOMOS International Scientific Committee on Intangible Heritage meetings in Dublin from October 26-31, 2010 using a portion of the grant to cover airfare, food, and lodging for 6 nights. Between now and then he will work with Marylin Truscott, Chairman of the Committee, as one of a small group of people developing the agenda for discussion. Following the meetings Kauffman will continue to work as part of a core group on follow-up projects which as of now are expected to include: development of an online series of articles and case studies; development of a formal ICOMOS statement on intangible heritage; and organization of a 2011 conference on intangible heritage. Kauffman will contribute a short article to the online series.

Laura Blokker and Heather Knight:

***Louisiana's Bousillage Tradition: Investigation of Past Techniques for Future Practice*, \$10,000**

Blokker-Knight's project addresses the Colonial building technique of *bousillage*, which was used in Creole and Arcadian Louisiana during the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. Based on the European tradition but adapted to the new world climate, *bousillage* is a multi-cultural building tradition that has had very few published comprehensive studies. Blokker and Knight propose to publish such a report: one that will combine materials analysis with oral history, field studies, trials and mock-ups and will outline next steps for a professional primer. They will present their findings at conferences next year.
