Exceptions to this rule may include where the individual is working or disabled and there is a valid reason for their inability to afford the requested furniture/appliances. Unfortunately, the Foundation cannot assist in every situation where an individual moves and is in need of furniture/appliances. The Foundation has a \$750.00 limit on requests for furniture and/or appliances. All furniture/appliances are purchased through AI's Appliances and Furniture (phone number 313-526-2400). Please first submit the application to the Foundation and, if approved, an estimate will then be obtained from AI's for the requested items. The items the Foundation can approve include a bed, couch, coffee table, refrigerator, stove, dresser, kitchen table, chairs, lamps and love seat (not all items are approved for every request).

FUNDING GUIDELINES

GENERAL INFORMATION:

The IRS has granted charitable status to the Foundation to assist in emergency situations with temporarily impoverished individuals who lack the basic necessities of life. We are able to help such individuals who, through no fault of their own, are facing an emergency situation and with the Foundation's assistance they will be able to move forward and be self-sufficient. There must be a very strong likelihood that if the Foundation provides assistance the individual will not need help in the foreseeable future and will be independent and able to meet all their monthly economic obligations.

The Here to Help Foundation provides one-time grants to such individuals with identifiable and specific needs and where no other means of assistance are available through existing agencies or organizations (as the Foundation is a resource of last resort). The requested grant cannot be awarded if it will simply be a temporary solution and the individual will have a similar need in the near future. We'd love to help everyone but the IRS has specific requirements relative to assisting individuals directly and we must abide by those restrictions.

METHOD OF RECEIVING REQUESTS FOR GRANTS:

Grants awarded by the Here to Help Foundation arise from unsolicited requests sent to us via our on-line application form from a qualified advocate.

GEOGRAPHIC AREAS WHERE WE PROVIDE HELP:

Grants are provided within Southeastern Michigan, specifically the counties of Wayne and Oakland.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICANTS:

ELIGIBLE GRANTEES:

- Eligible grantees include those impacted by circumstances in which otherwise financially secure individuals become "temporarily impoverished" due to events occurring beyond their control.
- To assure the effectiveness of any grants, individuals in need would be subject to the following general guidelines:
 - a. A clear demonstration of need. Verification of economic situation/financial resources will be required.
 - b. Defined objectives for what the grant would

provide, including how it would assist the individual in moving forward and, ultimately, achieving a successful outcome and more enhanced life.

- c. Evidence of the ability to properly utilize the funds.
