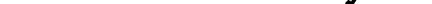

Guidelines for Grants

- 1.) Grants will be made once a year, in December. All grant applications must be submitted no later than November 15.
- 2.) No grants will be made to individuals; all grantees must be tax-exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and qualify as "not a private foundation" under Section 509(a) of the Code.
