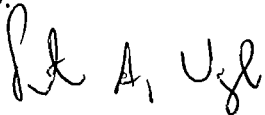

Vogt were designated initial co-trustees of the Foundation. William T. Vogt died on February 4, 2002. Lorine E. Vogt continues to serve as the sole trustee of the Foundation. Under Article 3, Lorine E. Vogt, designated Peter A. Vogt to serve with her as a co-trustee on May 6, 2003.

Lorine E. Vogt died on October 11, 2008. At such time, Article 3 provides that "...the successor trustees shall be William T. Vogt, if then living, and the grantors' then living children and the then living adult descendants, per stirpes, of a deceased child, it being the intent of the grantors that each of the branches of the grantors' family represented by their three children shall always have voting power equal to that of each of the other branches for as long as such branch has living adult members and regardless of the number of living adult members in such branch."

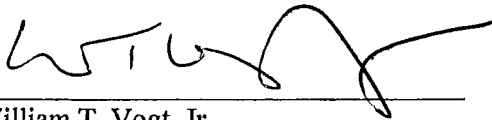

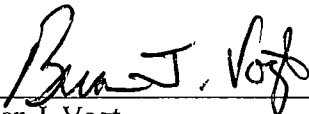
