The Filene Center at Wolf Trap is the only National Park for the Performing Arts We presented 106 performances from late May to early September Over 423,000 tickets were sold to shows that included performances of musical theater, symphony & film, dance, opera, pop, rock and more with an average ticket price of \$39 The Filene Center has the second largest theatrical stage in the country, seats 7,028, nearly 4,000 of which are covered with open sides and views of the tall trees and rolling hills in the Park The remainder of the seating is uncovered on a sloping lawn where patrons can bring picnics to enjoy before and during performances The Barns at Wolf Trap presented 93 performances from October to early May at our 382 seat indoor venue Almost 30,000 tickets were sold to see legendary artists and exciting up-and-coming talents in a diverse array of musical genres with an average ticket price of less than \$26 The theater was built from two restored 18th century barns and was a gift from our founder, Catherine Filene Shouse
