FREY FOUNDATION JOINT WRITTEN CONSENT OF THE MEMBERS AND TRUSTEES

March 4, 1991

The undersigned, being all of the Members and Trustees of the Frey Foundation, a Michigan nonprofit corporation (the "Corporation"), do hereby, pursuant to Sections 407 and 525 of the Michigan Nonprofit Corporation Act, consent that the records of the Corporation may show that the following actions were taken in lieu of a meeting as of the date written above:

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 2 of the Corporation's Bylaws was amended on March 4, 1991 to provide that each descendant of Edward J. Frey and Frances T. Frey who has attained age 30, except for certain adopted descendants, shall be eligible for membership in the Corporation.

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 3 of the Corporation's Bylaws provides that the Corporation's Secretary will notify each individual of his or her qualification for membership in the Corporation at the time such individual first becomes qualified.

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 2 of the Bylaws has never been implemented by the Corporation.

WHEREAS, the Secretary of the Corporation has not adopted the practice of notifying individuals of their qualification for membership in the Corporation.

WHEREAS, the current Members of the Corporation are three descendants of Edward J. Frey and Frances T. Frey, namely John M. Frey, David G. Frey and Edward J. Frey, Jr., and in connection with a reorganization of the Corporation's governance structure, desire to amend the Bylaws in two phases: in the first phase, the automatic eligibility provision for membership will omitted from the bylaws and in the second phase, the bylaws will be amended and restated to allow any interested descendant from the next generation to become a member.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS:

RESOLVED, that the Bylaws of the Corporation be and they hereby are amended to delete Article II in its entirety and to replace it with the following:

ARTICLE II

<u>Membership</u>

- Section 1. <u>Current Members</u>. The Corporation will have one class of Members, consisting of John M. Frey, David G. Frey and Edward J. Frey, Jr. Each of John M. Frey, David G. Frey and Edward J. Frey, Jr. shall be referred to as a "Current Member".
- Section 2. New Members. Upon the death, legal incapacity or resignation of a Current Member, the membership of the Corporation will be divided into three membership classes. Upon the death, legal incapacity or resignation of a Current Member, each of his adopted or natural born children who are thirty years of age or older shall become a Member in that membership class upon filing an acceptance of membership with the Secretary. If upon the death, legal incapacity or resignation of a Current Member, none of his children accept membership, that membership class shall remain open for future acceptance of eligible Members, but will be considered dormant for purposes of voting.
- Section 3. <u>Termination of Membership</u>. An individual's membership shall be terminated only upon that individual's death, written resignation delivered to the Corporation's Secretary, or legal incapacity. The other Members may not remove or expel a member.
- Section 4. Quorum and Voting Requirements within, and among Three Membership Classes. At such time that the Corporation consists of three membership classes, the quorum and voting requirements of this Section 4 shall apply, notwithstanding anything contained in the Corporation's Bylaws to the contrary, including, specifically, Article III, Sections 6, 7, 8 and 10.
 - a. Quorum. A majority of the Members of each membership class will constitute a quorum of the respective class, whether present in person or by proxy. In addition, a majority of the membership classes must be present or represented at a meeting to achieve a quorum.
 - b. <u>Voting</u>. Each membership class is entitled to one vote on each matter submitted to a vote of the Members. A vote may be cast in person, by proxy, or by electronic transmission if participating in a meeting by remote communication. The affirmative vote of a majority of the Members within a membership class will constitute the vote and action of the class. The majority vote of the votes cast by the membership classes will constitute the vote and action of the Members, unless unanimity is required by law, other sections of these Bylaws or the Articles of Incorporation.

RESTATED ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

(a Michigan Nonprofit Corporation)

Pursuant to the provisions of Act 162, Public Acts of 1982, as amended (the "Act") the undersigned corporation executes the following Restated Articles:

- 1. The present name of the Corporation is Frey Foundation.
- 2. The identification number issued by the Bureau is 822085.
- 3. All former names of the Corporation are: The Frey Foundation.
- 4. The date of filing the original Articles of Incorporation was January 22, 1974.

The following Restated Articles of Incorporation supersede the Articles of Incorporation as amended and restated and shall be the Articles of Incorporation of the Corporation:

ARTICLE I

The name of the Corporation is Frey Foundation.

ARTICLE II

Purposes

The Corporation is organized to receive and administer funds exclusively for such religious, charitable, scientific, literary and educational purposes as permitted for organizations defined in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code"), including the making of grants to public institutions and organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code and that are committed to making a difference in the lives of individuals, families and communities in Western Michigan, especially the Grand Rapids area plus Emmet and Charlevoix counties, and conducting all activities incidental or necessary to accomplishing the foregoing purposes or as otherwise permitted by Section 501(c)(3) of the Code.

ARTICLE III

Powers and Limitations

The Corporation may exercise generally any power that is consistent with the purposes described above and that a nonprofit corporation organized under the provisions of the Act may exercise. The Corporation may deal with and distribute the Corporation's property in such a manner as will best promote its objectives and purposes, without limitation except such, if any, as may be contained in instruments under which such property is conveyed to the Corporation.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any activities or have any purposes that are not permitted for (i) an organization exempt from federal income taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code and other related legislation and regulations as they now exist or may hereafter be amended, (ii) an organization eligible to receive tax deductible contributions under Section 170(c), Section 2055, Section 2522, or Section 2106 of the Code and related legislation and regulations as they now exist or may hereafter be amended, or (iii) a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Michigan pursuant to the Act.

No part of the Corporation's direct or indirect activities shall consist of carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, except to the extent permitted by Section 4945 of the Code. The Corporation shall not participate in or intervene in (including publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE IV

Registered Office and Resident Agent

The street address (which is also the mailing address) of the Corporation's registered office is 40 Pearl Street, NW, Suite 1100, Grand Rapids, Michigan 49503. The name of the resident agent at the registered office is Milton W. Rohwer.

ARTICLE V

Form of Organization, Assets and Financing

The Corporation is organized on a non-stock basis.

As of December 31, 2009, the Corporation had no real property assets and had personal property assets consisting of each and investments of approximately \$123,000,000 and furniture, equipment and leasehold improvements of approximately \$140,000.

The Corporation is financed through contributions and investment income

The Corporation is organized on a membership basis. The Corporation's membership and manner of member selection are as prescribed in the Corporation's bylaws.

ARTICLE VI

Limitation of Volunteer Trustee's and Officer's Liability

Except as otherwise provided by law, a volunteer Trustee or volunteer officer of the Corporation is not personally liable to the Corporation or its members for monetary damages for a breach of the Trustee's or officer's fiduciary duty.

The Corporation assumes all liability to any person other than the Corporation or its members for all acts or omissions of a volunteer trustee incurred in the good faith performance of his or her duties as a trustee other than liability for excise taxes imposed under Chapter 42 of the Code and liability resulting from claims arising under state law for mismanagement of the Corporation's assets.

The Corporation assumes the liability for all acts or omissions of a volunteer officer, other than liability for excise taxes imposed under Chapter 42 of the Code, provided that:

- (a) the volunteer was acting or reasonably believed he or she was acting within the scope of his or her authority;
- (b) the volunteer was acting in good faith;
- (c) the volunteer's conduct did not amount to gross negligence or willful or wanton misconduct;
- (d) the volunteer's conduct was not an intentional tort; and
- (e) the volunteer's conduct was not a tort arising out of the ownership, maintenance or use of a motor vehicle as described in Section 209(e)(v) of the Act.

ARTICLE VII

Indemnification of Trustees and Officers

The Corporation shall indemnify any trustee or officer of the Corporation who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending, or contemplated action, suit, or proceeding by reason of the fact that he or she is or was a trustee or officer, or is or was serving at the request of the Corporation in another capacity, to the fullest extent permitted by both the Act and Chapter 42 of the Code The Corporation may indemnify persons who are not trustees or officers to the extent authorized by resolution of the Board of Trustees or by contractual agreement authorized by the Board of Trustees. A change in the Act, these Articles,

or the bylaws that reduces the scope of indemnification shall not apply to any action or omission that occurs before the change.

ARTICLE VIII

Dedication of Assets

No part of the income or assets of the Corporation shall inure to the private benefit of any individual, member, or trustee.

The Corporation may be terminated and dissolved at any time and for any reason upon the unanimous vote of the votes cast by the membership classes.

Upon termination, the Corporation's assets will be distributed to three funds at the following foundations: Grand Rapids Community Foundation, 75%; Charlevoix County Community Foundation, 12.5%; and Petoskey-Harbor Springs Area Community Foundation, 12.5%. If a named community foundation is not then in existence or not then qualified as a charitable organization described in Section 501(c)(3) and a public charity described in Section 509(a)(1), (2) or (3) of the Code, the probate court in that county will determine the most appropriate recipient for the distribution, understanding that the intent of the donors was to provide a perpetual source of funding to make a difference in the lives of individuals, families and communities in that region or county. In no event may the Board distribute an amount greater than 10% of the Corporation's investment portfolio in any single year. Any amendment to this Article will require probate court approval to be effective.

ARTICLE 1X

Restrictions and Limitations

Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles, the following limitations shall apply for so long as the Corporation is classified as a "private foundation" under the provisions of Section 509 of the Code as it now exists or may hereafter be amended:

- 1. The Corporation shall distribute its income for each taxable year at such time and in such manner so that it will not become subject to the tax on undistributed income imposed by Section 4942 of the Code or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws;
- 2. The Corporation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Code, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws;
- 3. The Corporation shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943(c) of the Code or of any corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws;

- 4. The Corporation shall not make any investments so that it would be subject to tax under Section 4944 of the Code or of any corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws,
- 5. The Corporation shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Code or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

ARTICLE X

Amendments

Amendments to Article VIII and Article X of these Articles of Incorporation will require the approval of the probate court applying the principles of the <u>cy pres</u> doctrine. All other provisions of these Articles of Incorporation may be amended upon the unanimous vote of the votes cast by the membership classes.

These Restated Articles of Incorporation were duly adopted on the 13th day of May, 2011 in accordance with Section 642 of the Michigan Nonprofit Corporation Act. These Restated Articles of Incorporation restate, integrate, and do further amend the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation and were duly adopted by the written consent of all of the members entitled to vote in accordance with Section 407(3) of the Act.

AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS

FREY FOUNDATION

ARTICLE I Membership

Section 1. Classes of Members. The Corporation will have three classes of members, one class to represent the families of each of John M. Frey, David G. Frey and Edward J. Frey, Jr.

Section 2. Qualification for Membership during the Lifetime of a Current Member. Each of John M. Frey, David G. Frey and Edward J. Frey, Jr. is a current member of his respective membership class ("Current Member"). During his lifetime, each Current Member may appoint as members of his respective membership class, one or more of his adopted or natural born children as of the date of adoption of this bylaw provision (May 13, 2011).

Section 3. Qualification for Membership following the Death of a Current Member. For 90 days following the death of a Current Member, each of his adopted or natural born children who is at least thirty years of age who is not yet a member of the membership class, may become a member of the Current Member's respective membership class upon indicating to the Secretary of the Corporation his or her acceptance of the appointment. If upon the death of a Current Member, none of his descendants accept membership and there are no other members in that class, the membership class will remain open for future acceptance of qualified members, but will be considered dormant for purposes of voting.

Section 4. New Members. After 90 days following the death of a Current Member, the Corporation's Secretary shall notify each individual of his or her qualification for membership at the time such individual first becomes qualified. To be eligible for membership the individual must be a descendant of Edward J. and Frances T. Frey and be thirty years of age or older. For purposes of this Section 4, an individual adopted by a descendant of Edward J. and Frances T. Frey will be deemed a descendant and eligible for membership only if he or she was adopted prior to his or her seventh birthday and was adopted by a descendant of Edward J. and Frances T. Frey who was under the age of 50 years old at the time of such adoption. Spouses of descendants of Edward J. and Frances T. Frey are not eligible for membership. An individual qualified to be a member, but who is not already a member, may become a member by delivering to the Corporation's Secretary a written acceptance of membership.

Section 5. Termination of Membership. Each Current Member will serve as a member of his respective membership class until his death or resignation. A Current Member, during his lifetime, may remove members of his respective membership class. Upon the death or resignation of a Current Member, each member of that respective membership class will serve until his or her death or resignation. The other members may not remove or expel a member.

except for good cause shown and upon the affirmative vote of 75% of all of the then-serving members of the Corporation, voting individually, and not as a class or classes. For purposes of determining whether the 75% threshold is met, the member subject of the removal will not be included.

ARTICLE II Members' Meetings

- **Section 1. Times and Places of Meetings.** Meetings of the members will be held at such place and at such time as the Board of Trustees determines.
- Section 2. Annual Meeting. An annual meeting of the members for election of trustees, presenting to the members a copy of the Corporation's financial report for the preceding fiscal year and for such other business as may come before the meeting shall, unless action to be taken at the meeting is instead taken by written consent as permitted by law, be held each year at the time and place fixed by the Board of Trustees.
- **Section 3. Special Meeting.** The Board of Trustees, the Chairperson, the President or a membership class may call a special meeting of members at any time.
- Section 4. Notice of Meeting. Written notice of the time, place, and purposes of an annual or special meeting of members must be given either personally, by mail or by electronic transmission to each member not less than 10 nor more than 60 days before the date of the meeting. Notice by electronic transmission will be deemed to have been given when electronically transmitted to the person entitled to the notice or communication in a manner authorized by the person.
- **Section 5. Waivers by Attendance**. A member's attendance at a meeting will result in both of the following:
 - (a) waiver of objection to lack of notice or defective notice of the meeting, unless the member at the beginning of the meeting objects to holding the meeting or transacting business at the meeting; and
 - (b) waiver of objection to consideration of a particular matter at the meeting that is not within the purposes described in the meeting notice, unless the member objects to considering the matter when it is presented.
- **Section 6. Quorum.** A majority of the members of each membership class will constitute a quorum of the respective class, whether present in person or by proxy. In addition, at least two of the membership classes must be present or represented at a meeting to achieve a quorum.
- **Section 7. Voting Rights.** Except as otherwise provided in Article I, Section 5 of these Bylaws, each membership class is entitled to one vote on each matter submitted to a vote of the members. A vote may be cast in person, by proxy, or by electronic transmission if participating

in a meeting by remote communication. The affirmative vote of a majority of the members within a membership class will constitute the vote and action of the class. Except as otherwise provided in Article I, Section 5 of these Bylaws, the majority vote of the votes cast by the membership classes will constitute the vote and action of the members, unless unanimity is required by law, other sections of these Bylaws or the Articles of Incorporation.

Section 8. Participation in a Meeting by Conference Telephone or Remote Communication. A member may participate in a meeting of members by conference telephone or other means of remote communication by which all persons participating in the meeting may hear each other. All participants must be advised of the means of remote communication in use and the names of the participants in the conference must be divulged to all participants. Such participation in a meeting constitutes presence in person at the meeting.

ARTICLE III Board of Trustees

Section 1. Election and Term of Office. The Board of Trustees of the Corporation will consist of not less than three nor more than eleven trustees, as determined by the members from time to time. So long as three membership classes are in existence and none of them are dormant, each membership class will elect at least one person to serve as trustee. If there are only two membership classes because one of them is dormant, each class will elect at least two trustees. If there is one membership class in existence because two of them are dormant, it will elect at least three trustees.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, each membership class may elect up to three trustees, as determined by the members from time to time. Each membership class may elect one nonfamily member to serve as a trustee. In addition, the membership classes may collectively, upon their unanimous vote, elect up to two non-family trustees; however, the total number of nonfamily trustees may not exceed the greater of three trustees or 30% of the total trustees serving on the board. A non-family trustee means an individual who is not a descendant of Edward J. and Frances T. Frey. For purposes of this provision, a trustee who is an adopted child eligible to become a Member will be considered a family trustee. Spouses of descendants of Edward J. and Frances T. Frey are not eligible to be family trustees nor non-family trustees. Any amendment to this Article III, Section I of the Bylaws to increase the allowable number of non-family trustees will require the unanimous vote of the votes cast by the membership classes.

- **Section 2.** New Trustees. The Corporation's Sccretary shall provide each new trustee with current copies of the Articles of Incorporation, bylaws, and other pertinent information regarding the organization and operation of the Corporation.
- Section 3. Trustee Terms. The terms of the trustees will be staggered so that at each annual meeting, approximately one-third of the trustees will be elected. The members of the first Board of Trustees as of the date these Amended and Restated Bylaws are adopted will be divided as nearly as possible into three classes of equal size: the first class to serve a one-year term, the second class to serve a two-year term and the third class to serve a three-year term. Thereafter, the term of office of any trustee will be for three years from the date of his or her election or

appointment by the Appointing Authority, defined below, and continue until his or her successor has been elected and qualified, unless the trustee is appointed to fill a vacancy, in which event it will be for the remainder of the term to which the trustee is succeeding.

- **Section 4. Resignation and Removal.** A trustee may resign by written notice to the Corporation's Secretary. A trustee may be removed by the membership class or classes that elected him or her ("Appointing Authority"), or may be removed upon the affirmative vote of a majority of the votes cast by the membership classes.
- **Section 5. Vacancies.** Vacancies may be filled by the respective Appointing Authority for the unexpired portion of the departing trustee's term in accordance with the procedures established in the foregoing sections of this Article.
- **Section 6. Powers.** The Board of Trustees shall manage the Corporation's business and may exercise all the Corporation's powers, except those powers that are reserved to the members.
- **Section 7. Emeritus Trustees.** A retiring Trustee may be designated as an Emeritus Trustee. Status as Emeritus Trustee is an honorary position and no Emeritus Trustee shall have the right to vote or to receive notice of, attend, or be heard at a Board of Trustees meeting.

ARTICLE IV Committees

- Section 1. Committees of Trustees. The Board of Trustees may appoint one or more committees to consist of one or more trustees. A committee of trustees may exercise any of the powers and authority of the Board of Trustees, but only to the extent provided in the Board of Trustees resolution constituting the committee and subject to the limitations of delegable authority specified in Section 528 of the Michigan Nonprofit Corporation Act. The Board of Trustees may designate one or more individuals who are not trustees to receive notice of, attend, and be heard at a committee meeting, but such individuals shall not be entitled to vote.
- **Section 2.** Advisory Committees. The Board of Trustees may appoint one or more committees to consist in whole or in part of individuals who are not trustees. Any such committee shall serve solely in an advisory capacity to the Board of Trustees and may not exercise any of the powers and authority of the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE V Board of Trustees Meetings

Section 1. Regular Meetings. A meeting of the Board of Trustees shall be held immediately following the members' annual meeting, at the same place, for the purpose of electing officers and transacting any other business. Board of Trustees meetings shall be held thereafter at the time and place the Board of Trustees specifies at its annual meeting each year. No notice of such meetings to the trustees is necessary. A Board of Trustees meeting may be held at a different time and place with the consent of a majority of the trustees upon written notice to all trustees who did not consent.

- **Section 2. Special Meeting.** The Chairperson of the Board of Trustees, the President, or a majority of the Board of Trustees may call a special meeting of the Board of Trustees at any time.
- Section 3. Notice of a Special Meeting. Notice of a special meeting stating the time, place, and purposes of a special meeting must be given to each trustee by one of the following methods:
 - (a) by mailing a written notice of such meeting to such address as the trustee designates from time to time or, in the absence of designation, to the last known address of the trustee at least 5 days before the date set for such meeting;
 - (b) by personally delivering a written notice of such meeting to the trustee at least 2 days in advance of such meeting;
 - (c) by orally notifying the trustee of such meeting at least 2 days in advance, either personally or by telephone; or
 - (d) by transmitting notice of such meeting to the trustee at least 2 days in advance:
 - (i) by telecopier or telex to the trustee's last known office or home or to such other location as the trustee designates from time to time, or
 - (ii) by electronic mail message to the trustee's last known electronic mail address or to such other electronic mail address as the trustee designates from time to time,

except that, if the transmitted notice is returned as undeliverable, a different permitted method of notification must be used.

- **Section 4. Waiver of Notice.** A trustee's attendance at or participation in a meeting waives any required notice to the trustee of the meeting, unless, at the beginning of the meeting or upon the trustee's arrival, the trustee objects to the meeting or the transacting of business at the meeting and does not thereafter vote for or assent to any action taken at the meeting. A trustee may waive in writing any right to notice before or after a meeting.
- Section 5. Trustees' Quorum. A majority of the trustees shall constitute a quorum; provided, however, that if less than ten days notice is given for a special meeting, a quorum for such meeting shall consist of not less than two-thirds of the trustees then in office and trustees may waive notice of the special meeting as provided in Section 4 above.

- Section 6. Voting Rights. The vote of a majority vote of the trustees present at any meeting at which there is a quorum will constitute the act of the Board of Trustees, except as otherwise required by law, the Articles of Incorporation, or other sections of these bylaws.
- Section 7. Conduct of Meetings. Board of Trustees meetings shall generally follow accepted rules of parliamentary procedure. The presiding official has authority over matters of procedure and may adopt any other form of procedure suited to the business being conducted.
- Section 8. Action by Written Consent. Action required or permitted to be taken under authorization voted at a Board of Trustees meeting may be taken without a meeting if, before or after the action, all members of the Board of Trustees then in office unanimously consent to the action in writing, including by electronic transmission such as email. The written consents must be filed with the minutes of the Board of Trustees or committee. The consent has the same effect as a vote of the Board of Trustees for all purposes.
- Section 9. Participation by Conference Telephone or Remote Communication. A trustee or member of a committee may participate in a meeting by means of a conference telephone or similar communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting may communicate with each other. Such participation in a meeting constitutes presence in person at the meeting.

ARTICLE VI Officers

- **Section 1. Appointment**. The Board of Trustees, at its first meeting following the annual members' meeting, shall appoint a President, Secretary, and Treasurer and shall elect from their number a Chairperson. The Board of Trustees may also appoint one or more Vice Presidents and other officers or agents that it deems necessary. The Board of Trustees need not appoint or elect an officer to an office that is already filled and whose term has not expired. The same person may hold two or more offices, but an officer may not execute, acknowledge, or verify an instrument in more than one capacity if the instrument is required by law, the Articles of Incorporation, or these bylaws to be executed, acknowledged, or verified by two or more officers.
- Section 2. Term, Removal, and Vacancies. An officer shall hold office for one year and until a successor is elected or appointed and qualified, or until the officer's death, resignation, or removal. The Board of Trustees may remove an officer with or without cause. An officer may resign by written notice to the Corporation's Secretary. The resignation is effective upon its receipt by the Corporation or at a later date specified in the notice.
- **Section 3. Chairperson of the Board of Trustees**. The Chairperson of the Board of Trustees shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Corporation and shall:
 - (a) preside at all meetings of the membership or the Board of Trustees;

- (b) call meetings of the membership or the Board of Trustees whenever deemed advisable;
- (c) be the medium of communication to the Board of Trustees of all matters presented for their consideration by persons other than trustees themselves or the Chief Operating Officer;
- (d) subject to supervision by the Board of Trustees, perform all duties customary to the position of Chief Executive Officer, and supervise and control all of the affairs of the Corporation in accordance with policies and directives the Board of Trustees approves;
- (e) be the final arbiter of all differences between officers of the Corporation, subject only to review by the Board of Trustees;
- (f) during the unavailability or disability of the Chief Operating Officer, or while the office is vacant, exercise all the powers and discharge all of the duties of the Chief Operating Officer; and
 - (g) perform any other duties that the Board of Trustees prescribes.
- **Section 4. Vice Chairperson of the Board of Trustees.** During the unavailability or disability of the Chairperson, or while that office is vacant, the Vice Chairperson may exercise all of the powers and discharge all of the duties of the Chairperson. The Vice Chairperson shall perform any other duties that the Board of Trustees prescribes.
- **Section 5. President.** The President shall be the Chief Operating Officer of the Corporation. The Chief Operating Officer shall devote his full working time to the performance of his duties and shall be compensated in accordance with applicable contractual arrangements. A descendant of Edward J. and Frances T. Frey ("Family Member") may serve as the President only if he or she is not a trustee of the Corporation. The Chief Operating Officer shall:
 - (a) see that all orders and resolutions of the Board of Trustees are carried into effect:
 - (b) cause to have prepared, approved, and signed all necessary minutes of meetings or written consents to action of the members, the Board of Trustees, and committees of the Board of Trustees;
 - (c) advise and assist the Chief Executive Officer and the Board of Trustees on all matters concerning the operations and business of the Corporation, its policies, and its long-range planning;
 - (d) establish all administrative staff positions and be responsible for employing and supervising the staff to the end that the staff performs its duties efficiently, ably, and well;

- (e) develop, maintain, and administer appropriate budgetary, financial, and accounting procedures and controls;
- (f) report to the Board of Trustees regularly concerning the Corporation's operations, activities, and financial condition;
- (g) cause annual financial statements to be prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles by a certified public accountant;
- (h) make a full report concerning the Corporation's investments and financial condition to the Board of Trustees at its annual meeting;
- (i) cause the preparation of an annual budget and submission of same to the Board of Trustees;
- (j) assemble such information and data and prepare such special reports as are requested by the Chief Executive Officer or the Board of Trustees;
- (k) cause to have prepared and timely filed with state and federal regulatory agencies all reports and information or tax returns required by law;
- (I) maintain a program and procedures for the receipt and evaluation of grant applications and present grant applications to the Board of Trustees for consideration and approval or ratification;
- (m) maintain a program and procedures for the payment and supervision of approved grants;
- (n) oversee financial institutions that shall serve as custodians and depositories for Corporation funds and assets;
- (o) oversee and cause to be evaluated professional advisers who provide portfolio and investment management services to the Corporation;
- (p) when properly authorized and within any policies adopted by the Board of Trustees, execute all deeds, contracts, and other instruments related or incidental to the business and operation of the Corporation;
- (q) maintain personal liaison with business, educational, community, governmental, civic, and charitable organizations and leaders;
- (r) be a representative and spokesperson for the Corporation on appropriate occasions; and

- (s) perform any other duties that the Chief Executive Officer assigns or the Board of Trustees prescribes.
- **Section 6. Vice Presidents.** The Board of Trustees may designate one or more Vice Presidents to perform the duties and exercise the authority of the President during the President's absence or disability. Each Vice President shall perform other duties that the President assigns or the Board of Trustees prescribes.
- **Section 7. Secretary.** The Secretary shall cause to be recorded and maintained minutes of all meetings of the Board of Trustees, committees, and members. The Secretary shall cause to be given all notices required by law, these bylaws, or resolution of the Board of Trustees and shall perform other duties that the President assigns or the Board of Trustees prescribes.
- Section 8. Treasurer. Except as otherwise prescribed by the Board of Trustees, the Treasurer shall oversee the custody of the corporate funds and securities, cause to be kept in books belonging to the Corporation a full and accurate account of all receipts, disbursements, and other financial transactions of the Corporation, and deposit all funds to the credit of the Corporation in such depositories as the Board of Trustees designates. The Treasurer shall perform other duties that the President assigns or the Board of Trustees prescribes.
- **Section 9. Other Officers**. The Board of Trustees may appoint other officers to perform duties and exercise authority that the President assigns or the Board of Trustees prescribes.
- Section 10. Restrictions on Family Members. Except for the position of President, no Family Member, defined above, shall serve in a compensated position with the Corporation and may only serve in volunteer staff positions such as an intern or other temporary role.

ARTICLE VII Grantmaking

Section 1. Program Grants. The Corporation is committed to making a difference in the lives of individuals, organizations and communities in Western Michigan, especially the Grand Rapids area plus Emmet and Charlevoix counties ("Target Geographic Area"). Consistent with the Corporation's vision and the Grantmaking Guidelines adopted by the Board, each year at least 75% of the aggregate dollar amount of the Corporation's grant budget, including discretionary and matching grants shall be made within the Target Geographic Area. As a general rule, no grant should exceed (i) 5% of the capital portion of any project, or (ii) 15% of the non-capital portion of any project.

Grants must be made to promote innovation and change in one or more of the following six program areas:

- Nuturing Community Arts
- Community Capital Projects
- Enhancing the Lives of Children and Their Families
- Encouraging Civic Progress

- Protecting the Environment
- Strengthening Philanthropy

Any amendments to this Section I of Article VII will require the affirmative vote of eighty percent of the trustees then in office or the unanimous vote of the membership classes. In the event of any disagreement or discrepancy between the Board and the Members, the Members' action will control. The remaining 25% of the aggregate dollar amount of the Corporation's grant budget will be allocated to Discretionary and Matching Gifts and Out-State and Out-of-State Grants, as provided in Sections 2 and 3 of this Article VII.

- **Section 2. Discretionary and Matching Grants.** Each year up to 15% of the aggregate dollar amount of the Corporation's grant budget may be made within either of the following limits:
- A. **Discretionary Grants.** In accordance with the Discretionary Grant Authority Policy, the Corporation permits each membership class to recommend grants in limited amount and number.
- **B.** Matching Grants. The Corporation encourages personal philanthropy by making matching grants with respect to charitable gifts made by its trustees, officers, employees and others in accordance with the Corporation's Matching Gifts Program in effect from time to time.

Any amendment to the 15% limitation set forth in this Section 2 of Article VII will require the unanimous vote of the votes cast by the membership classes.

Section 3. Out-State and Out-of-State Grants. Each year up to 10% of the aggregate dollar amount of the Corporation's grant budget may be distributed to organizations or for purposes outside of the Target Geographic Area; provided, however, that the foregoing provision shall not prohibit a multi-year pledge to organizations or for purposes outside of the Target Geographic Area from being approved where the total of the multi-year pledge amount exceeds 10% of the aggregate dollar amount of the Corporation's grant budget for the year provided the limitation on distributions is observed.

ARTICLE VIII Indemnification

Section 1. Scope of Indemnity. The Corporation shall indemnify its trustees and officers against expenses (including attorneys' fees), judgments, fines, and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by them in connection with any actions or suits brought or threatened against them, including actions by or in the right of the Corporation, by reason of the fact that such person was serving as a trustee or officer of the Corporation, to the fullest extent permitted by both the Michigan Nonprofit Corporation Act and Chapter 42 of the Internal Revenue Code. The Corporation may indemnify persons who are not trustees or officers to the extent authorized by resolution of the Board of Trustees or by contractual agreement authorized by the Board of Trustees. A change in the Michigan Nonprofit Corporation Act, the Articles of

Incorporation, or these bylaws that reduces the scope of indemnification shall not apply to any action or omission that occurs before the change.

Section 2. Authorization of Indemnification. Unless ordered by a court or otherwise provided by law, the Corporation shall indemnify a person only upon determination that the person acted in good faith and in a manner the person reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the Corporation's or members' best interests. Such determination shall be made (1) by majority vote of a quorum of the Board of Trustees consisting of trustees who were not parties to the action or suit, (2) if a quorum of disinterested trustees is not obtainable, by a majority vote of a committee of trustees who were not parties to the action and consisting of not less than two disinterested trustees, (3) by independent legal counsel in a written opinion, or (4) by the members.

Section 3. Insurance. The Corporation may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a trustee, officer, employee, volunteer, or agent of this Corporation or is or was serving at the Corporation's request in any other enterprise against any liability incurred in such capacity.

ARTICLE IX General Provisions

- **Section 1. Checks.** All Corporation checks or demands for money and notes shall be signed by such persons as the Board of Trustees designates.
 - Section 2. Fiscal Year. The Corporation's fiscal year ends December 31.
- Section 3. Loans and Guarantees. The Corporation will not provide loans to or guarantee obligations of an officer or Trustee of the Corporation, unless expressly permitted under State law.

ARTICLE X Situs and Principal Office

Edward J. and Frances T. Frey were lifelong residents of Grand Rapids, Michigan and felt strongly about their ties and commitment to the community. They believed that the best way to ensure that the Corporation primarily benefits the Grand Rapids community was to have the Corporation's principal office domiciled in Grand Rapids. Therefore, the situs of the Corporation and the location of its principal office shall at all times be in Grand Rapids, Michigan. Any amendment to this provision will require probate court approval consistent with cy pres principles and taking into account donor intent as expressed in this Article X.

ARTICLE XI Amendments

These bylaws may be amended upon the affirmative vote of a majority of the votes cast by the membership classes, unless a higher or different vote is otherwise required by law, the Articles of Incorporation or specific sections of these bylaws, such as in Articles III and VII of these bylaws. Article X may be amended only with probate court approval as specified therein.
