

10. Due to the efforts of the ALC, changes were made to specific language in the State statutes governing buying back prior service for time spent working for an agency in AZ making it more equitable.
11. Other legislative changes were brought about due to ALC efforts. Some include improvement to law enforcement due process rights and changes to the deferred retirement option plan.
