	Health and Education for Haiti's first major program area is medical missions. During 2010, we conducted eight one-week
	medical missions to the Grande-Anse Department of Haiti and treated approximately 8,000 patients. Even though the Grande-Anse
	was not directly affected by the devestating earthquake that hit Port-au-Prince and other cities, we saw many earthquake-related
	patients in our first four medical missions after the earthquake as an estimated 250,000 people fled Port-au-Prince for the Grande-
	Anse. Our volunteer doctors and nurses donated over 4,000 hours seeing patients. The volunteers paid all of their travel costs
	to and from the city of Jeremie Our volunteers diagnosed each patient and provided them with medications to treat their conditions
	We also made 551 referrals for people with serious or chronic conditions to other providers and paid all of the expenses for their
	care, including a small travel stipend based on their distance from the provider. Of those 551 referrals, 42 people were referred to
	Port-au-Prince for serious conditions that could not be treated in the Jeremie area We provided funds to these individuals so they
	could travel and pay for their medical care

	Health and Education for Haiti's second major program area is education. During 2010, we provided several grants that enabled
	us to assist over 1,400 students to attend primary or secondary school. Grants totaled \$9,400 to assist over 225 individual
	students with tuition payments These students were identified by the Regional Education and Development Programme (PRED), a division of Caritas International All funds were paid either to PRED or directly to the schools for the student's tuition. In addition,
	Health and Education for Haiti has begun to subsidize teacher salaries to reduce the overall cost of schooling to make it less
	expensive for all. Grants of \$20,990 00 were paid directly to 3 schools to cover significant portions of teacher salaries. Over 1,200
	students at these three schools. St. Paul's Parish School (Grades 1-12, over 500 students), Heart of Jesus School (Grades 1-6, over
	550 students), and College Notre Dame (Grades 7-12, Over 120 students) benefited from these grants with significantly reduced
	education costs. College Notre Dame is the only secondary school within a 15 mile radius, so it is an enabler for these students who
	otherwise wouldn't attend secondary school We also provided grants of \$4,000 to finish the secondary school building at St. Paul's
	Parish School, and \$150 to furnish a classroom for rising 12th graders at College Notre Dame. Health and Education for Haiti also
	provided \$2,928 in school supplies, including 2 computers, for St. Pauls Parish School and College Notre Dame

	could be prevented with clean water supplies. We provided a grant to PRED to supply water filters to families in the Leon area,
	enabling dozens of families to have clean water. We also provided a grant to Pure Water for the World, another US-based 501(c)(3)
	to provide bio-sand filters to deliver clean water to 2 schools in the Leon area, St. Paul's Parish School and Heart of Jesus School
	These filters provide clean water to over 1,000 students and their families daily. We also provided a grant to St. Paul's Parish to
	provide enhanced satellite communications for the Parish and PRED. This enables email access to St. Paul's and PRED without
	requiring them to travel 45 minutes, each way, to Jeremie to have connectivity. We have continued our club foot treatment program
	at the main hospital in Jeremie. We continue to pay for the nurses and materials for the bi-weekly castings to treat nearly 20
	children The program is beginning to be known throughout the Grande-Anse as we are starting to treat patients who were not

times per year and meets with each organization we grant funds to She makes an evaluation of how these organizations have used the
funds For example, if we grant funds to repair a roof, she examines the roof to validate that repairs were in fact completed. We also request
an accounting from the organization of how they used the funds. We ask that they provide us with receipts, when possible. We retain the
receipts when we can, and leave them with the organization when the organization needs them for future purposes
Individual grants are also monitored by Health and Education for Haiti. All our individual grants are medical referrals or tuition assistance.
Tuition assistance is paid directly to the school attended by the student. Medical referrals are granted a small travel stipend depending
on their distance to Jeremie to enable them to travel to receive their medical care. This travel stipend is set by our Executive Director who
bases it on actual costs All our referrals are tracked on a referral form. We digitize these forms and perform analysis to identify potential
