AS DISCLOSED ON STATEMENT 13, DONALD DE LASKI BECAME A SUBSTANTIAL CONTRIBUTOR TO THE VIBRANT VILLAGE FOUNDATION AS A RESULT OF THIS TRANSFER. KENNETH E. DE LASKI BECAME A SUBSTANTIAL CONTRIBUTOR TO THE VIBRANT VILLAGE FOUNDATION IN 2009. THE DE LASKI FAMILY FOUNDATION BECAME A SUBSTANTIAL CONTRIBUTOR TO THE VIBRANT VILLAGE FOUNDATION AS DEFINED IN SEC. 507(d)(2). FOR PURPOSES OF SEC. 4941 (RELATED TO TAXES ON SELF-DEALING), THE TERM SUBSTANTIAL CONTRIBUTOR DOES NOT INCLUDE ANY ORGANIZATION WHICH IS DEFINED IN SEC. 501(c)(3). (REGULATION SEC. 1.507-6(a)(2).)
