- C) ANY FUNDS NOT EXPENDED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PURPOSE OF THE GRANT MUST BE RETURNED TO THE FOUNDATION. GRANTEES ACKNOWLEDGE THAT THE FULL AMOUNT OF THE GRANT WILL BE RETURNED IF FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE AWARD CONTRACT CONDITIONS OCCURS. ANY UNUSED FUNDS MUST BE RETURNED TO THE FOUNDATION.
- D) GRANTEES AGREE TO FURNISH WRITTEN PROGRESS REPORTS TO THE FOUNDATION AT LEAST ONCE A YEAR. PROGRESS REPORTS FOR INDIVIDUAL GRANTEES ARE DUE ON APRIL 30 OF EVERY YEAR, AND PROGRESS REPORTS FOR ORGANIZATIONAL GRANTEES ARE DUE ON OCTOBER 31 OF EVERY YEAR.
