To the best of RMHC's knowledge, both RMHC and TSG comply with all individual state filing requirements that pertain to engagement of TSG's services in those states on an annual basis. Per TSG's contract, RMHC has agreed to reimburse TSG for all out-of-pocket travel expenditures and other selected expenses. In 2010, the additional out-of-pocket expenses totaled \$16,318, which is in accordance with IRS instructions for completing the Form 990, Part IX, Line 11e and included on line 24a.
