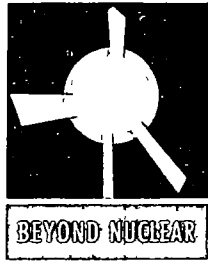

This is a busy time for us but rich with opportunity. The Obama White House request for \$54 billion in federal loan guarantees for new reactors has prompted a new debate about nuclear power. The tritium leaks at Braidwood, IL, Vermont Yankee, Oyster Creek, NJ and elsewhere, have built skepticism. We are working hard to prevent a Senate climate bill packed with subsidies for new reactors.

We have recently released a new report on the widespread problem of leaking reactors and the potential this has for serious health effects in the impacted communities. I have enclosed a copy of this report with our informational packet sent to Ms. Sabina Sullivan.

We continue to strive to bring greater attention to the human costs of nuclear power – whether among indigenous communities in the southwest affected by uranium mining, or the Illinois communities near the Braidwood and Dresden reactors whose water was contaminated with tritium after a decade of leaks.


