#### Direct Charitable Activities of the Seay Foundation

#### 1. The Circle A Ranch Experience

The Circle A Ranch Experience is a 2 day, 1 night weekend stay for students ages 11-16 at Circle A Ranch, 55 miles (1 hour) south of Dallas in Navarro County. The 1000 acre ranch provides an ideal setting for younger students to learn and grow in an away-from-the-city environment. The educational activities are numerous, and include astronomy lessons, nature lessons, photography, learning animal tracks, bird watching and bird identification, learning the major trees of Texas, insect identification, learning the native plants and flowers, swimming, canoeing, hiking, fire-building, branding, campfire cooking, using small fireworks, fishing and learning fish anatomy, exploring, and camping. The Life Sciences and Earth Sciences are especially prominent in this program for students in grades 5-10. The setting is also one that gives students a unique glimpse into off-grid living---there is no electricity, heat, or telephone. All meals are done on a campfire and upon nightfall flashlights, lanterns and candles provide illumination.

Mr. Seay has had a 28-year career as a classroom science teacher at St. Mark's School of Texas in the fields of Geology, Astronomy, Earth Science, Life Science, and Physical Science, as well as serving as the Chairman of the Science Department at St. Mark's School 1982-89. Student participants are selected from Dallas area schools by their interest in learning-by-doing in an outdoor environment, their good initiative, and their proven ability to successfully work with their peers and the adults overseeing the activities. Students who want to continue their experiential-based learning may apply for the Cochetopa Creek Ranch Experience.

### 2. The Cochetopa Creek Ranch Experience

The Cochetopa Creek Ranch Experience is an 8-10 day stay for students ages 11-17 during the summer months at Cochetopa Creek Ranch, a beautiful 1100 acre Colorado mountain ranch 38 miles southeast of Gunnison, Colorado. During the Cochetopa Creek Ranch Experience, students further enhance their campfire cooking skills, knowledge of the outdoors, astronomy, photography, hiking capabilities, and camping skills, along with having the opportunity for new experiential-based learning in ranch work and ranch life. Students assist in simple ranch chores like splitting and stacking firewood, irrigating hay meadows, painting sheds, tearing out beaver dams, small animal husbandry, washing clothes by hand and line-drying them, making small repairs to facilities, and the like. With parental approval, students of appropriate age have the opportunity to learn to drive a Jeep in a safe, traffic-free environment, and can learn safe riflery skills, and responsible ATV operation. Like the Circle A Ranch Experience, students get another glimpse into daily life with off-grid living---there is no telephone or electricity; all meals are done on a campfire, and at night lanterns and candles provide light under very dark, very clear, unpolluted skies.

#### 3. The Southeast Alaska Experience

The Southeast Alaska Experience is the ultimate applied sciences field trip; it is the highest level of experiential-based education\* and place-based learning\*\*.

A 10-12-day voyage of discovery and learning onboard a chartered boat, this program is designed for students ages 15-19 in the protected waters of Alaska's Inside Passage near

Juneau. This unique trip and its venue provide a dazzling array of experiences in a stunning setting of fjords, glaciers, iceberg-riddled waters, salmon-filled creeks, and whale and wildlife-populated marine and terrestrial landscapes. The boat is a mobile platform of experiential-based learning in the fields of geology, astronomy, the life sciences, marine biology, ecology, and geography. It usually accommodates 4-6 students and is staffed by a captain, cook, and naturalist/geologist from the Foundation. Activities include whale-watching, bird-watching, exploring tidewater glaciers, fishing for salmon, trout and halibut, berry-foraging, bearwatching, tide-pooling, kayaking, exploring by boat and on foot, shrimping, and crab-poding. Each day brings new adventure and an astonishing number of unforgettable experiences in an environment unlike any most students have ever been in---anywhere. This is the finest, and most comprehensive, experiential-based scientific field school that can be organized.

- \*Experiential-based education is "learning by doing"---learning by experience---instead of passive learning like reading about a topic, or hearing a lecture on it, or seeing a video or television show about it, and the like. In experiential-based education the students actually <u>do</u> <u>it</u>. For more information on this innovative form of education and schooling, see the Association for Experiential Education's website, <u>www.aee.org</u>.
- \*\*Place-based learning is a powerful educational methodology in which the *place*---the local environment, its phenomena, culture, wildlife, climate, habitat, etc.---is used as a major teaching tool and becomes an essential component---or *the* essential component---of the curriculum, lessons, and learning process. Southeast Alaska, for example, is a living laboratory of coastal rain forests, tidewater glaciers, wildlife ecosystems, and pristine ocean and terrestrial environments. The students are <u>in the environment</u> that they are learning about, instead of being in a lecture hall in a city, or in a library reading or studying about them.

#### Statement of Purpose Seay Foundation Scholarships

The Seay Foundation for Community Betterment seeks to recognize and reward, with scholarships, students ages 15-19 who demonstrate exemplary *student citizenship* in their school environment: in the classroom, on the school grounds, or in any role they have in conjunction with their school. These scholarships *do not* pertain to academic achievement, or athletic ability, or financial status. The scholarships' focus is on classroom and school-ground citizenship.

#### Our Perspectives On Classroom and School Ground Citizenship

The Seay Foundation's view of classroom and school ground citizenship holds that student citizenship expresses itself through student honesty, cooperation, sensitivity, and compassion.

The concept of *honesty* is self-explanatory: the student is truthful to others, and to themselves, in all their activities. The student does not lie, cheat, steal, or deceive.

Good classroom and school ground citizens are *cooperative* with the adults at the school, as well as with the others in the school community. They respect, and comply with, the rules, regulations, and procedures in effect at their school, whether it is in the classroom, or on the playing fields, or in the lunchroom, or the halls, and the like. Good classroom and school ground citizens are not disruptive of the school processes, or the school day---instead, they embrace the school processes and the daily rhythms and procedures of their school by cooperation with, and assimilation into, them.

Good classroom and school ground citizens are *sensitive* and *compassionate* towards others. Sensitivity is an awareness of, and understanding of, the feelings, needs, and emotions of others. Compassion is similar; it is a consciousness of another's' plight, misfortune, distress, or suffering, coupled with a desire to alleviate it. Good classroom and school ground citizens never tease, taunt, haze, belittle, humiliate, make fun of, bully, or inflict any kind of emotional, or physical, pain on others. Good classroom and school ground citizens are understanding of mistakes, bad luck, lesser abilities, circumstances beyond another's control, and the like that can sometimes be awkward and painful in the school environment.

All experienced and professional classroom teachers know good classroom citizenship in their students, and they have their own perspectives on it. An applicant for our scholarships is required to submit the Statement on Citizenship from at least one current classroom teacher, one administrator (Department Head, Head of School, Director of Operations, etc.), and one additional Statement from any of the previous categories (classroom teacher or administrator) or from any other employee of the school (clerical staff, cafeteria personnel, groundskeeper, librarian, etc.), for a total of three.

These scholarships will pay all tuition not covered by other scholarship or financial aid for one year for secondary school awardees, and for two years of college to any school in America for graduating senior awardees. The scholarships are paid directly to the student's secondary school or university.
