The agency also complies with all requests for audits and reviews by funding bodies and has had no significant compliance findings in 2010, ensuring appropriate

use of these funds. Each program also provides training to direct service, management, and administrative staff on proper service delivery and budget compliance

issues, reviewing requirements and specific grant/contractual obligations frequently. Staff are required to attend trainings and technical assistance sessions

sponsored by grantors to ensure they are aware of the latest contractual information and best practices of implementation whenever offered.
