1. Nature of the Organization and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Nature of the Organization

The Majesty Foundation (Foundation) has been organized exclusively for the purpose of receiving and administering funds as set forth in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (Code) of 1986, including the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code. The purpose of the Foundation shall include, but not be limited to, benefiting individuals and institutions involved in evangelical activities and to provide assistance for low income students to attend camps and conferences, and other charitable activities within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Code.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Financial Statement Presentation

The Foundation reports information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets. All of the Foundation's net assets are unrestricted. There were no net asset restrictions at the end of the previous year and all current year gifts were unrestricted.

Revenue Recognition

The Foundation reports contributions of cash in the period in which the gift is received.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Foundation considers all highly liquid investments with a maturity of three months or less to be cash and cash equivalents. At year-end cash equivalents consist mainly of money market accounts.

Notes to the Financial Statements (continued)

1. Nature of the Organization and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Property and Improvements

Property and improvements are stated at cost. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful life of the asset. The components of property and improvements and depreciable lives at December 31, 2010 are summarized as follows:

Depreciation expense during the year ended December 31, 2010 was \$13,522.

Income Taxes and Accounting for Uncertainty in Income Taxes

The Foundation is exempt from federal income taxes under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. However, income from certain activities not directly related to the Foundation's tax-exempt purpose is subject to taxation as unrelated business income. The Foundation accounts for tax positions in accordance with the provisions of Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Codification Section 740-10. Any interest or penalties related to tax positions are recorded as interest expense or other expenses, respectively, in the statement of activities.

All tax years from 2007 through 2010 remain open to examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Foundation does not believe that the results from any examination of these open years would have a material adverse effect on the Foundation.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes to the Financial Statements (continued)

1. Nature of the Organization and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through June 14, 2011, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

2. Concentrations

The Foundation maintains cash and cash equivalents in cash and money market accounts at one institution. The bank balance in these accounts was \$72,803 at December 31, 2010, which was covered by FDIC insurance.

The foundation received \$305,000 of its contributions from a single public foundation.
