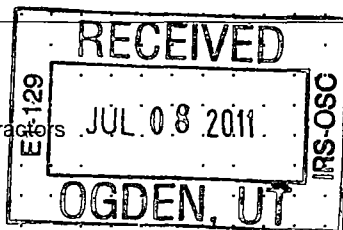




Unusual Grants

In 2010, the Chenrezig Fund Inc received two unusual grants: 1) a \$59,225 grant and 2) a \$20,000 grant.

These grants were cash grants paid in the form of personal checks.

These grants were unusual and unexpected and substantial contributions for our small not-for-profit corporation.

Most of our many donors contribute less than \$1,000, many less than \$100.

We understand that both grants were attracted by our publicity supported activities over 11 years of operation.

These contributions, individually or together, are large enough to endanger our status as normally meeting the 33 1/3% public support test. We therefore excluded these unusual grants from the 33 1/3% public support test for 2010.

The two grantors are separate individuals and are not related in any way. Both grantors are disinterested persons.

The donors had no role in founding or operating the Chenrezig Fund Inc and have no position of authority or control in the organization.

Both donors had previously made large, unusual grants to the Chenrezig Fund Inc. However, we have no understanding with the donors that they will continue making such large, unusual grants in the future.

Before receiving these contributions, the Chenrezig Fund Inc had carried on its actual program of public solicitation and exempt activities since it was given 501(c)(3) status in 2000. From the beginning, it has attracted a significant amount of public support, though in smaller amounts than these two large and unusual grants. With or without these unusual grants, the Chenrezig Fund Inc would have continued to attract a significant amount of public support and to continue to carry on its exempt activities.

In the years prior to receiving these unusual grants, the organization met the 33 1/3% public support test each year and in the future will be able to meet the public support test by excluding these two unusual grants.
