## AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS OF STEVENS SQUARE FOUNDATION

#### **DIRECTORS**

SECTION 1.1 <u>Number and method of election</u>. The Board of Directors of this corporation shall consist of no fewer than twelve and no more than thirty persons, and, subject to such limitation, the number of members of the Board of Directors shall be such as may be designated from time to time by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors. The directors of this corporation shall be elected by the Board of Directors at the regular meeting of the Board of Directors that immediately precedes the annual meeting of this corporation and shall take office at the end of such annual meeting or at such other time as the Board of Directors shall specify at the time of election.

SECTION 1.2 Terms. Each director of this corporation shall be elected to serve for a term of three years. The members of the Board of Directors shall be divided into three classes as nearly equal in number as possible, so that the terms of office of approximately one third of the members of the Board of Directors shall expire each year. A director shall hold office for the term for which he or she was elected, and, unless the Board of Directors has determined that a successor will not be elected, until his or her successor has been elected and has qualified, or until the director's prior death, resignation or removal. No director may serve more than two consecutive terms; provided, however, that the term of a director who has been elected as an officer during his or her second term as a director shall be extended automatically and without further action by the Board of Directors as necessary to be co-extensive with his or her term as an officer. Partial terms shall not be considered in determining whether a director is eligible to serve another term. There shall be no limit on the total number of non-consecutive terms an individual may serve as a director.

SECTION 1.3 Removal; resignation; vacancies. Any director may at any time be removed with or without cause by the Board of Directors by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the directors then in office; provided that the notice for the meeting at which such vote is held states the purpose of the meeting. Any director may resign at any time by giving written notice to the President, with copies to the Vice President of Nominations, and the Secretary. The resignation shall be effective without acceptance when the notice is received by the President, unless a later effective date is specified in the notice. Any vacancy occurring because of the death, resignation or removal of a director may be filled by a person elected by the Board of Directors for the unexpired term of such director. Any vacancy resulting from an increase in the number of members of the Board of Directors may be tilled by a person elected by the Board of Directors for a full term of office unless the Board of Directors designates a shorter term of office.

SECTION 1.4 Emeritus directors. Upon completion of his or her term of office, a director may request to serve as an emeritus director, which status shall be granted at the discretion of the Board of Directors. Emeritus directors shall not have the right to vote and shall have such other rights and obligations as the Board of Directors may specify from time to time.

#### MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

SECTION 2.1 <u>Annual meeting</u>. The annual meeting of the Board of Directors for the purpose of introducing new officers and directors and transacting such business as may properly come before the meeting shall be held each year in May at the time and place, within or without the State of Minnesota, designated from time to time by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 2.2 <u>Regular meetings</u>. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors may be held at such time and place as are announced at a previous meeting of the Board of Directors. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors may also be called at any time (a) by the President, (b) the Executive Committee, or (c) by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 2.3 Special meetings. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may also be called at any time (a) by the President, (b) by the Board of Directors, or (c) by written request of three or more members of the Board of Directors. Anyone entitled to call a regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors may make a written request to the President or Secretary to call the meeting, and the Secretary shall give notice of the meeting, setting forth the time and place thereof, to be held between three and thirty days after receiving the request. If the Secretary fails to give notice of the meeting within seven days from the day on which the request was made, the person or persons who requested the meeting may fix the time and place of the meeting and give notice in the manner hereinafter provided.

SECTION 2.4 Notice of meetings. Notice of each meeting of the Board of Directors for which notice is required, stating the time and place thereof, shall be given to all directors by United States mail, electronic communication or in person. Notice of the annual meeting, any regular meeting for which notice is required, and any special meeting at which removal of a director or officer or proposed amendments to the Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws will be considered shall be given at least ten days before the meeting, Notice of other special meetings shall be given at least three days prior to the meeting. Notices may, but need not, specify the business to be transacted except that notice of any meeting at which removal of any director or officer, or any proposed amendment of the Bylaws or Articles of Incorporation will be considered must state such purposes. All such notices not given in person shall be sent to the director using the contact information held in the latest available records of this corporation. Any director may waive notice of a meeting before, at or after the meeting, orally, in writing, by electronic communication or by attendance. Attendance at a meeting is deemed a waiver unless the director objects at the beginning of the meeting to

the transaction of business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened and the director does not participate in the meeting.

SECTION 2.5 Quorum and voting. The presence of a majority of the members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum at any meeting thereof, but the directors present at any meeting, although less than a quorum, may adjourn the meeting from time to time. If a quorum is present when a duly called meeting is convened, the directors present may continue to transact business until adjournment, even though the withdrawal of one or more directors leaves less than the number otherwise required for a quorum. At all meetings of the Board of Directors, each director shall be entitled to cast one vote on any question coming before the meeting. A majority vote of the directors present at any meeting, if there be a quorum, shall be sufficient to transact any business, unless a greater number of votes is required by law or these Bylaws. A director shall not appoint a proxy for himself or herself or vote by proxy at a meeting of the Board of Directors. For purposes of determining whether a director has met his or her fiduciary duties as a director, but for no other purpose, a director who is present at a meeting of the Board of Directors when an action is approved by the Board of Directors is presumed to have assented to the action unless the director votes against the action or is prohibited from voting on the action.

SECTION 2.6 Action without a meeting. Any action that could be taken at a meeting of the Board of Directors may be taken by written action signed by all of the directors. Any such action may also be taken by written action signed by fewer than all of the directors in accordance with the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation.

SECTION 2.7 <u>Meetings held using remote communication</u>. A director may participate in a meeting of the Board of Directors by means of conference telephone or, if authorized by the Board of Directors, by such other means of remote communication, in each case through which that director, other directors so participating, and all directors physically present at the meeting may communicate with each other on a substantially simultaneous basis. Participation in a meeting by remote communication constitutes presence at the meeting.

SECTION 2.8 <u>Director conflicts of interest</u>. This corporation shall not enter into any contract or transaction with (a) its director or a member of the family of a director; (b) a director of a related organization (within the meaning of Minnesota Statutes, section 317A.011, subd. 18) or a member of the family of a director of a related organization; or (c) an organization in or of which this corporation's director, or a member of the family of its director, is a director, officer or legal representative or has a material financial interest; unless the material facts as to the contract or transaction and as to the director's interest are fully disclosed or known to the Board of Directors, and the Board of Directors authorizes, approves, or ratifies the contract or transaction in good faith by the affirmative vote (without counting the interested director) of a majority of the entire Board of Directors, at a meeting at which there is a quorum without counting the interested director. For purposes of these Bylaws, "member of the family of a director" shall mean a spouse, parent, child, spouse of a child, brother, sister, or spouse of a brother or sister, of the director. Failure to comply with

the provisions of this Section shall not invalidate any contract or transaction to which this corporation is a party. This Section does not authorize any act of "self-dealing" as defined in Section 4941(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

#### **OFFICERS**

SECTION 3.1 <u>Designation and term</u>. The officers of this corporation shall be a President, Vice President of Grant Making, Vice President of Finance and Investment, Vice President of Nominations, Vice President of Education, Secretary and such other officers or assistant officers as the Board of Directors may from time to time designate. Officers shall be elected by the Board of Directors to serve for terms of one year and until their respective successors are elected and have qualified. Any officer shall be eligible for re-election to a second term, however no person shall hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms. Any officer may at any time be removed by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors. Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the President, with copies to the Secretary and the Vice President of Nominations. The resignation shall be effective without acceptance when the notice is received by the President, unless a later effective date is specified in the notice. No person may hold more than one office at the same time. Only directors may be officers of this corporation. If a vacancy occurs in any office during the year, it shall be filled by a person nominated by the Nominating Committee and approved by the Executive Committee, subject to ratification by the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting.

SECTION 3.2 <u>President</u>. The President shall be the chief executive officer of this corporation. He or she shall: (a) have general active management of the business of this corporation; (b) when present, preside at meetings of the Board of Directors; (c) see that orders and resolutions of the Board of Directors are carried into effect; (d) sign and deliver in the name of this corporation deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts, or other instruments pertaining to the business of this corporation, except in cases in which the authority to sign and deliver is required by law to be exercised by another person or is expressly delegated by the Articles of Incorporation, the Bylaws or the Board of Directors to another person; (e) serve as an ex-officion member of all committees and chair of the Executive Committee; (f) appoint the Chairs of the ad hoc and other committees and the members of all committees other than the Executive Committee; and (g) perform such other duties as are prescribed by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 3.3 <u>Vice President of Education</u>. The Vice President of Education shall: (a) serve as Chair of the Education Committee; (b) act as liaison to the Minnesota Council on Foundations or similar organizations of which the corporation is a member; and (c) during the absence or disability of the President, perform the duties of the President.

SECTION 3.4 <u>Vice President of Nominations</u>. The Vice President of Nominations shall serve as the Chair of the Nominating Committee and shall perform such other duties as are prescribed by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 3.5 <u>Vice President of Grant Making</u>. The Vice President of Grant Making shall serve as Chair of the Grant Making Committee and shall perform such other duties as are prescribed by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 3.6 <u>Vice President of Finance and Investment</u>. The Vice President of Finance and Investment shall perform or ensure the performance of the following duties: (a) keep accurate financial records of this corporation; (b) deposit money, drafts, and checks in the name of and to the credit of this corporation in the banks and depositories designated by the Board of Directors; (c) endorse for deposit notes, checks, and drafts received by this corporation as ordered by the Board of Directors, making proper vouchers for the deposit; (d) disburse corporate funds and issue checks and drafts in the name of the corporation, as ordered by the Board of Directors; (e) upon request, provide the President and the Board of Directors an account of transactions of this corporation and of the financial condition of this corporation; (f) serve as Chair of the Finance and Investment Committee; and (g) perform such other duties as are prescribed by the President or the Board of Directors.

SECTION 3.7 <u>Secretary</u>. The Secretary shall provide for the keeping of accurate minutes of all meetings of the Board of Directors and shall be responsible for the custody of the records, documents and papers of this corporation. He or she shall provide for the keeping of proper records of all transactions of this corporation. He or she shall have and may exercise any and all other powers and duties pertaining by law, regulation or practice to the office of Secretary, or imposed by these Bylaws. He or she shall also perform such other duties as may be assigned to him or her from time to time by the President or the Board of Directors. He or she shall be responsible for (directly or through a designee) giving notice of meetings of the Board of Directors.

SECTION 3.8 <u>Additional powers</u>. Any officer of this corporation, in addition to the powers conferred upon him or her by these Bylaws, shall have such powers and perform such additional duties as may be prescribed from time to time by the Board of Directors.

#### COMMITTEES

SECTION 4.1 <u>Authority</u>. The Board of Directors may, in resolutions adopted by a majority of the members of the Board of Directors, establish committees having the authority of the Board of Directors to the extent provided in such resolutions. Each such committee shall at all times be subject to the control and direction of the Board of Directors. Committee members, other than members of the Executive Committee, need not be directors.

SECTION 4.2 <u>Executive Committee</u>. The Board of Directors may designate an Executive Committee composed of the officers of the corporation, the immediate past President (at the invitation of the President) and other directors designated by the Board of Directors. The Executive Committee shall have the authority of the Board of Directors in the management of the business of this corporation in the interval between meetings of the Board

of Directors, and the Executive Committee shall at all times be subject to the control and direction of the Board of Directors.

SECTION 4.3 <u>Meetings and voting</u>. Meetings of each committee shall be called and held in accordance with the provisions of Sections 2.2 to 2.7 of these Bylaws as they apply to meetings of the Board of Directors.

#### INDEMNIFICATION

SECTION 5.1 <u>Indemnification</u>. This corporation shall indemnify its directors and officers against such expenses and liabilities, in such manner, under such circumstances, and to such extent, as required or permitted by Minnesota Statutes, Section 317A.521, subd. 2, as amended from time to time, or as required by other provisions of law; provided, however, that no indemnification shall be made with respect to any claim, issue or matter as to which the person shall be adjudged to be liable to this corporation.

SECTION 5.2 Advances. This corporation shall advance expenses in such manner, under such circumstances, and to such extent, as required or permitted by Minnesota Statutes, Section 317A.521, subd. 3, as amended from time to time; provided, however, that this corporation shall not advance expenses incurred in defense of a claim brought by or in the right of this corporation. The provisions of this Section are not intended to limit the ability of a person to receive advances as an insured under an insurance policy maintained by this corporation.

SECTION 5.3 <u>Insurance</u>. This corporation may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a director, officer, committee member, or employee against any liability asserted against and incurred by such person in or arising from such capacity, whether or not this corporation would otherwise be required to indemnify the person against the liability.

#### **MISCELLANEOUS**

SECTION 6.1 <u>Fiscal year</u>. Unless otherwise fixed by the Board of Directors, the fiscal year of this corporation shall begin on January 1 and end on the succeeding December 31.

SECTION 6.2 Corporate seal. This corporation shall have no seal.

SECTION 6.3 <u>Amendments</u>. The Board of Directors may amend these Bylaws by adopting a resolution setting forth the amendment provided that the proposed amendment has been included with the notice of the meeting at which the amendment will be considered.

SECTION 6.4 <u>Authority to borrow, encumber assets</u>. No director, officer, agent or employee of this corporation shall have any power or authority to borrow money on

its behalf, to pledge its credit or to mortgage or pledge its real or personal property except within the scope and to the extent of the authority delegated by resolutions adopted from time to time by the Board of Directors. Authority may be given by the Board of Directors for any of the above purposes and may be general or limited to specific instances.

SECTION 6.5 <u>Execution of instruments</u>. All deeds, mortgages, bonds, checks, contracts and other instruments pertaining to the business and affairs of this corporation shall be signed on behalf of this corporation by the President, or any Vice President, or by such other person or persons as may be designated from time to time by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 6.6 <u>Deposit of funds</u>. All funds of this corporation shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of this corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as the Board of Directors may approve or designate, and all such funds shall be withdrawn only in the manner or manners authorized by the Board of Directors from time to time.

# AMENDMENT TO BYLAWS OF STEVENS SQUARE FOUNDATION

This Amendment to Bylaws of Stevens Square Foundation dated as of October 15, 2010 ("Amendment") is adopted by a resolution of the Board of Directors

#### RECITALS

WHEREAS, Section 6.3 of the Bylaws of Stevens Square Foundation ("Bylaws") provides that the Board of Directors may amend these Bylaws by adopting a resolution setting forth the amendment provided that the proposed amendment has been included with the notice of the ineeting at which the amendment will be considered,

WHEREAS, Section 2.5 of the Bylaws provides that a majority of the members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum and further provides that a majority of the directors present at any meeting, if there is a quorum, shall be sufficient to transact any business,

WHEREAS, the proposed amendment was included with the notice of the meeting at which the amendment was considered,

WHEREAS, a majority of the members of the Board of Directors were present at the meeting on October 15, 2010, constituting a quorum, and

WHEREAS, a majority of the Board of Directors piesent at the meeting on October 15, 2010 have approved the Amendment by adopting a resolution setting forth the amendment

#### **AMENDMENT**

NOW THEREFORE, the Bylaws of Stevens Square Foundation are hereby amended by deleting Section 3.1 in its entirety and replacing it with the following

SECTION 3.1 <u>Designation and term</u> The officers of this corporation shall be a President, Vice President of Grant Making, Vice President of Finance and Investment, Vice President of Nominations, Vice President of Education, Secretary and such other officers or assistant officers as the Board of Directors may from time to time designate Officers shall be elected by the Board of Directors to serve for terms of one year and until their respective successors are elected and have qualified. Any officer shall be eligible for re-election to a second term. If there are unusual and extenuating circumstances that create the need for an officer to serve a third term, any officer may serve a third term, provided, however, the Executive Committee shall approve such third term by a two-third

majority prior to election by the Board. Otherwise, no person shall hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms. An officer may at any time be removed by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors. Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the President, with copies to the Secretary and the Vice President of Nominations. The resignation shall be effective without acceptance when the notice is received by the President, unless a later effective date is specified in the notice. No person may hold more than one office at the same time. Only directors may be officers of this corporation. If a vacancy occurs in any office during the year, it shall be filled by a person nominated by the Nominating Committee and approved by the Executive Committee, subject to ratification by the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting.
